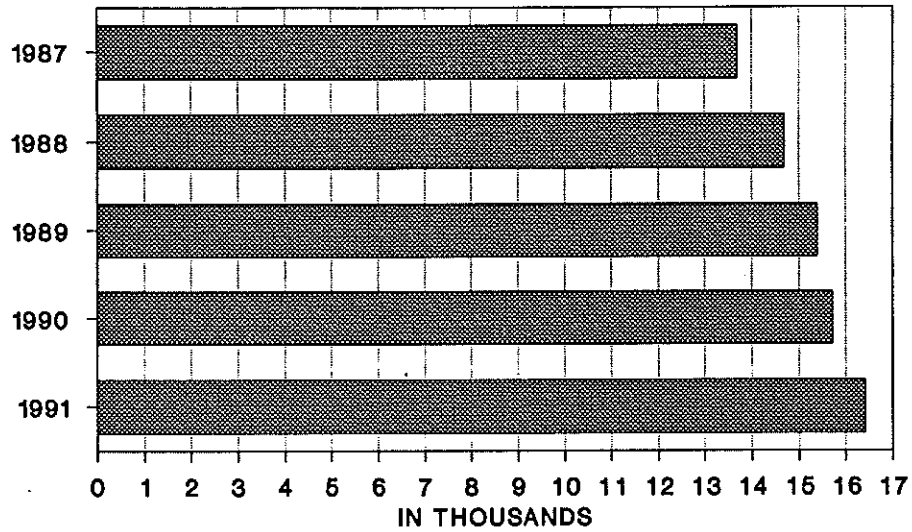

YEAR

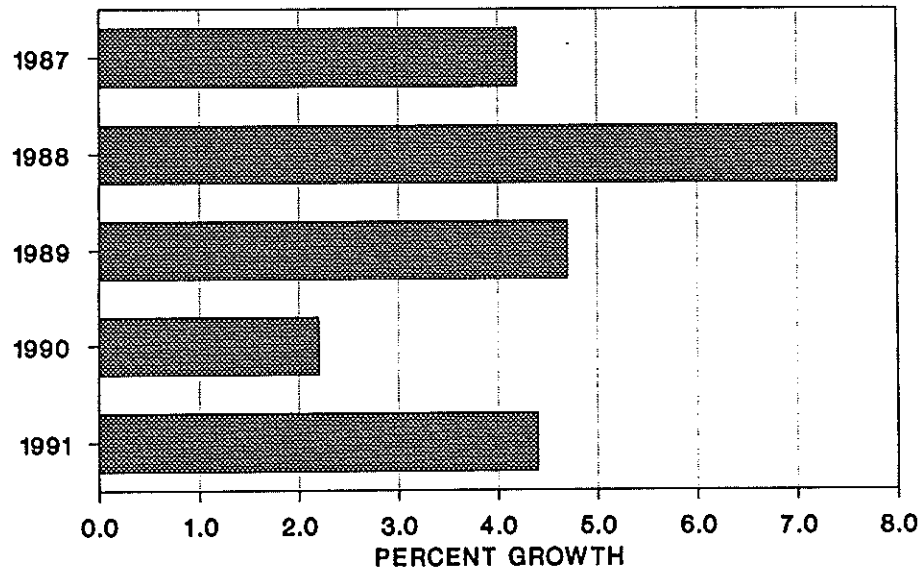

 AUTUMN 1987 AND AUTUMN 1991

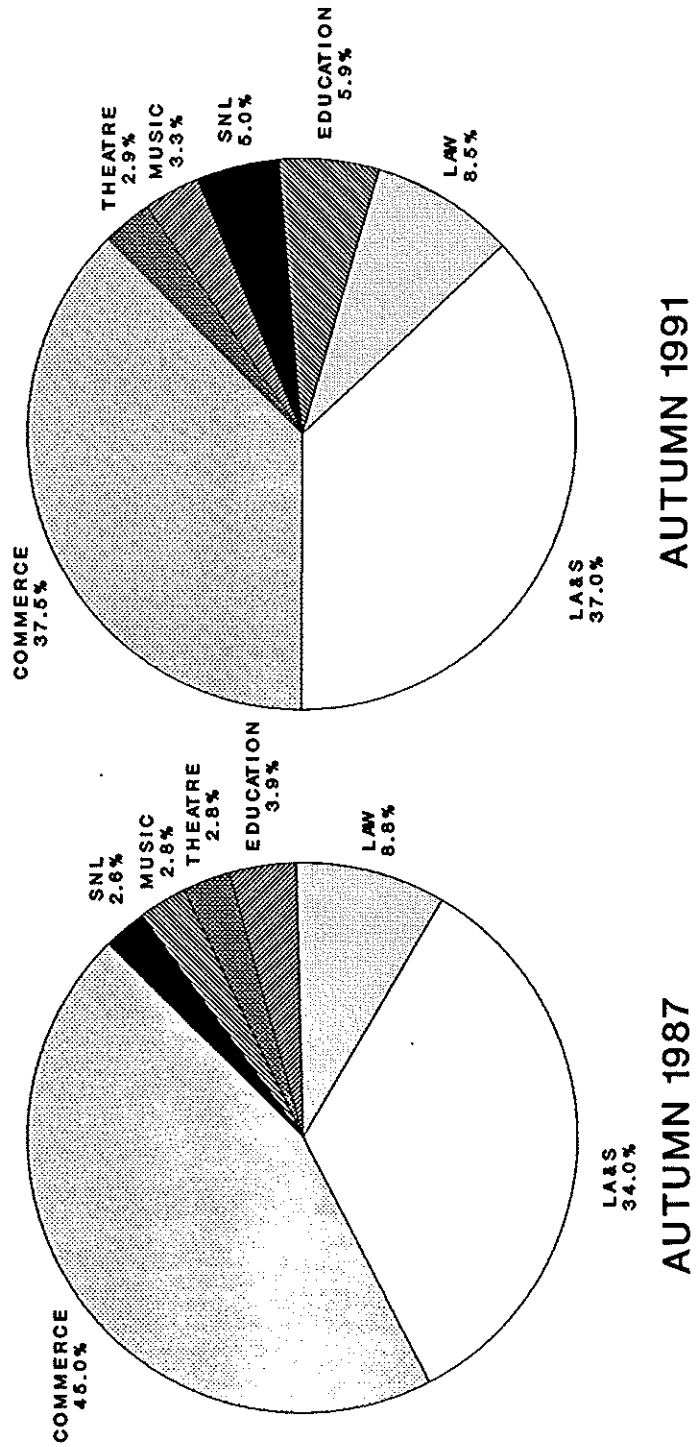

AUTUMN 1987 AND AUTUMN 1991**

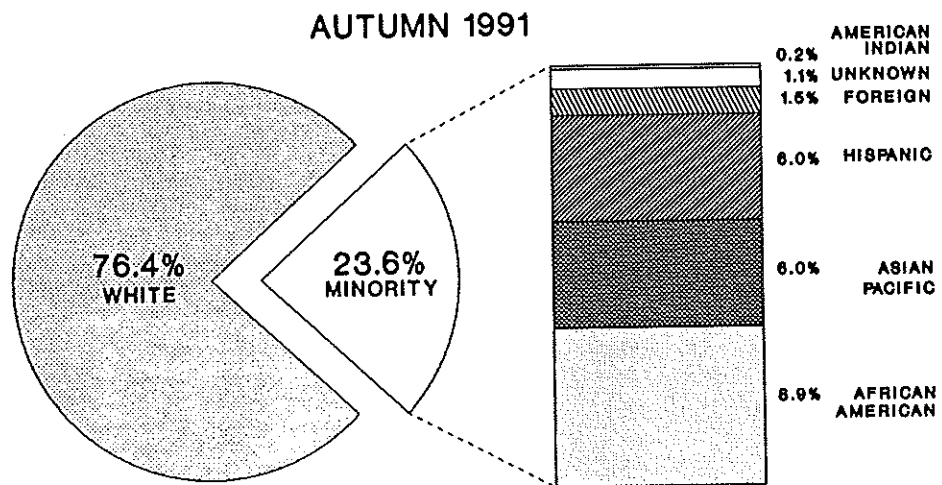
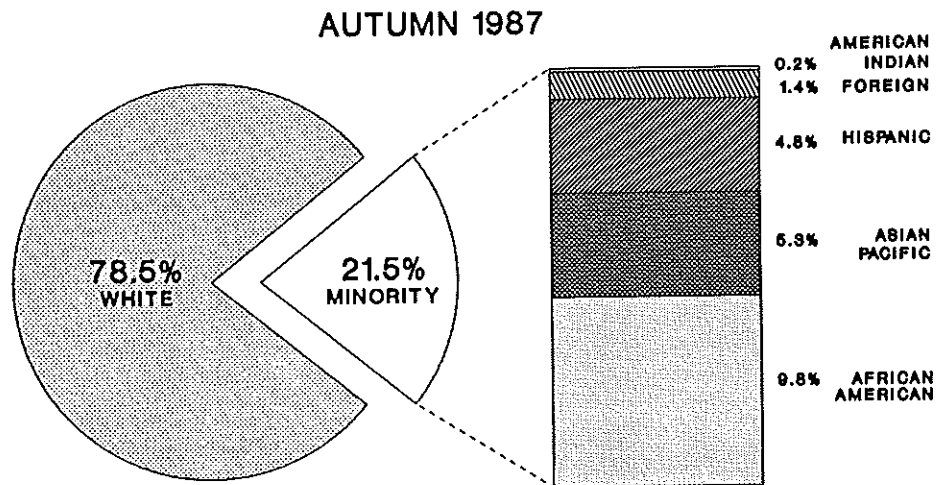

AUTUMN 1991**

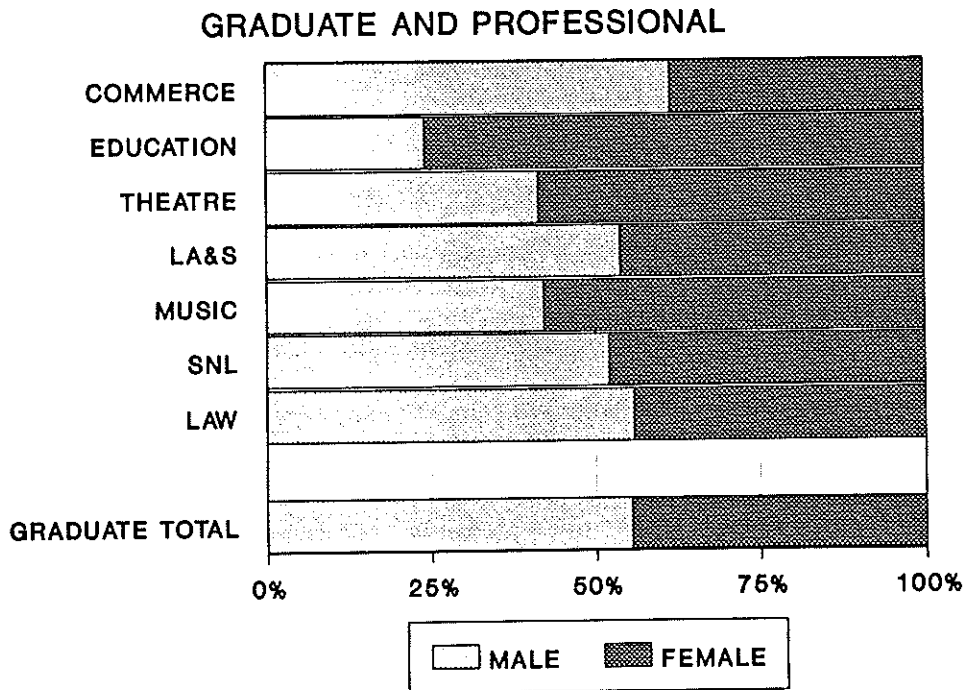
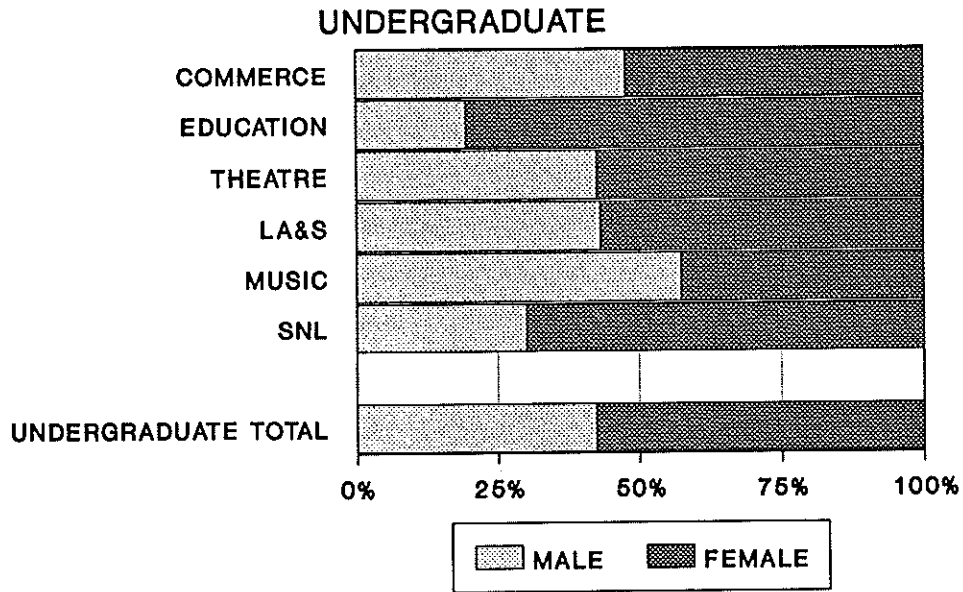

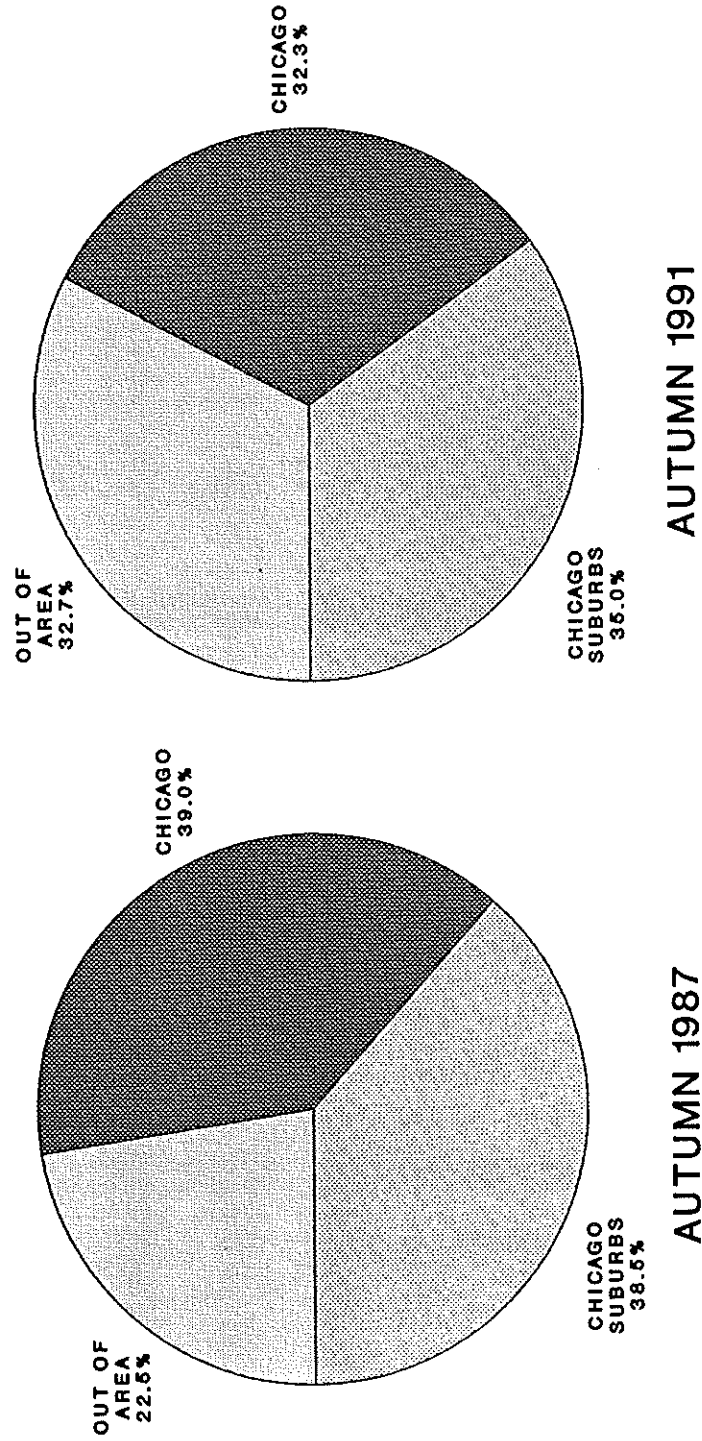

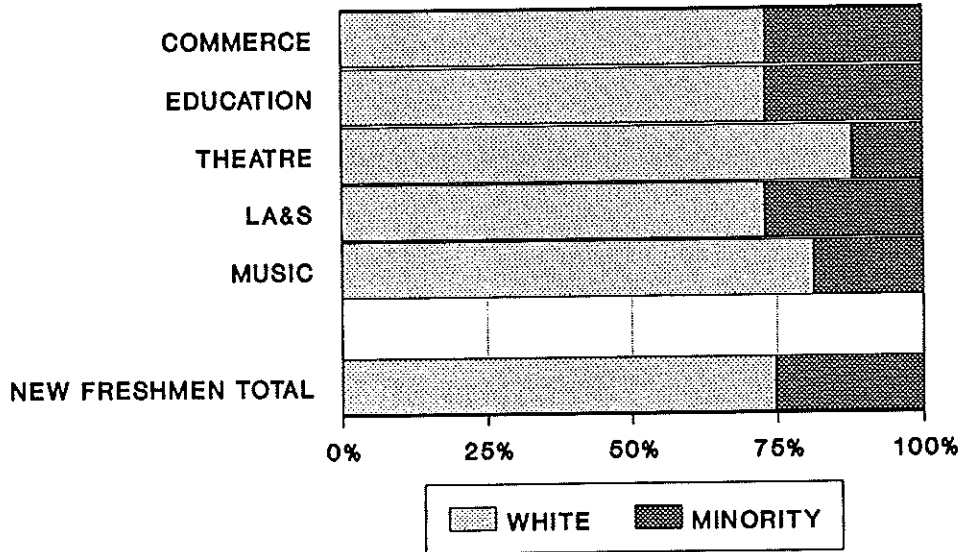

**AUTUMN 1991**

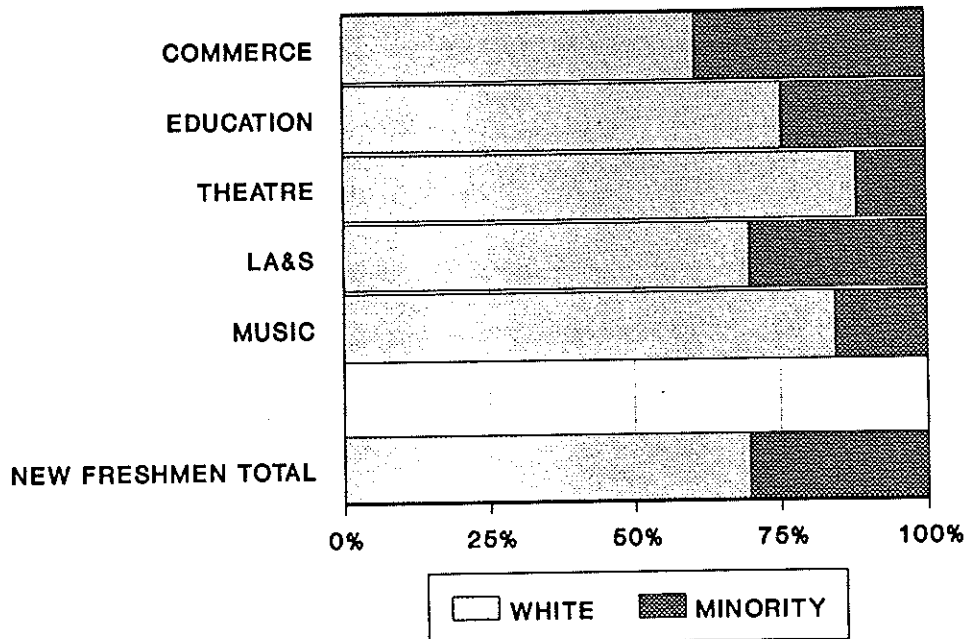

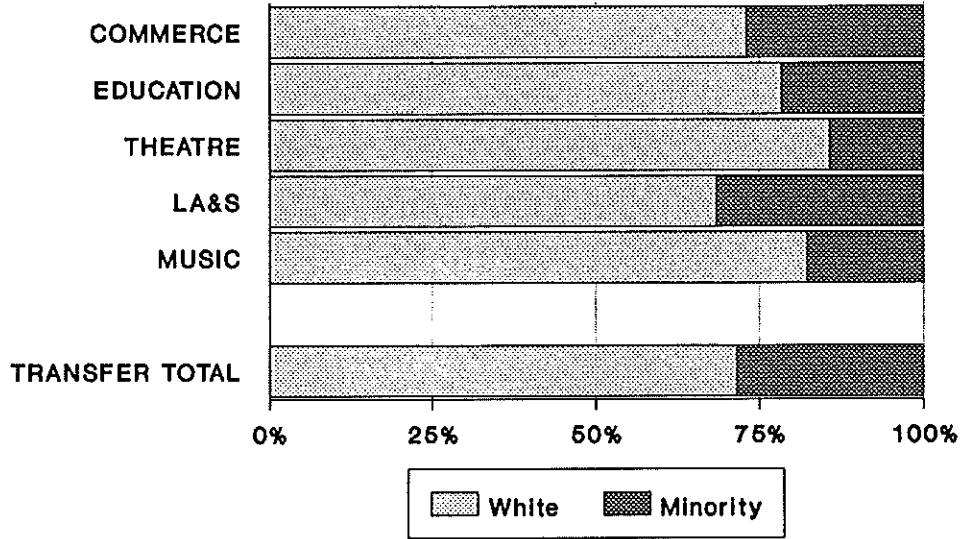

**AUTUMN 1991**

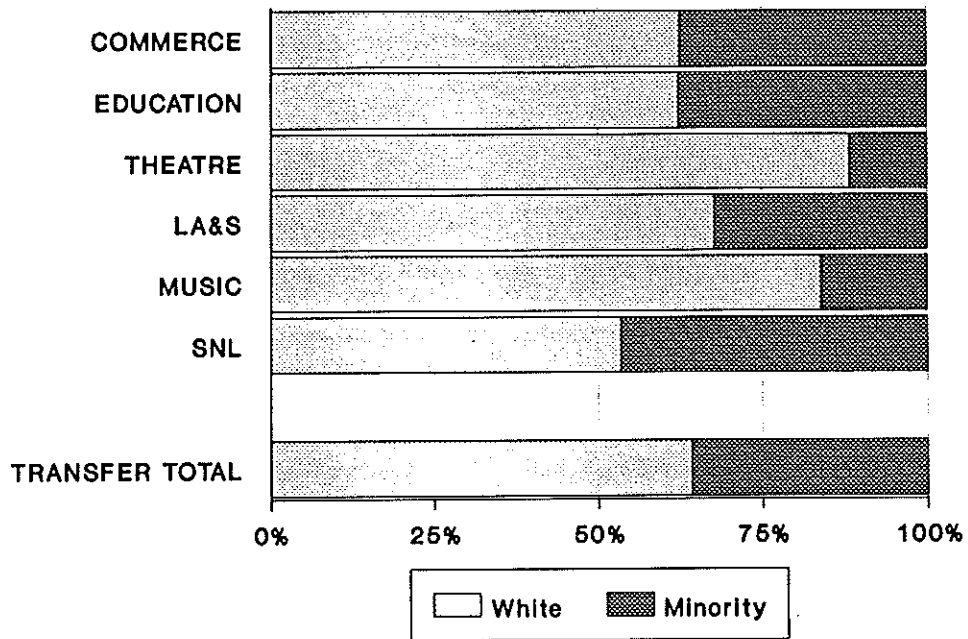

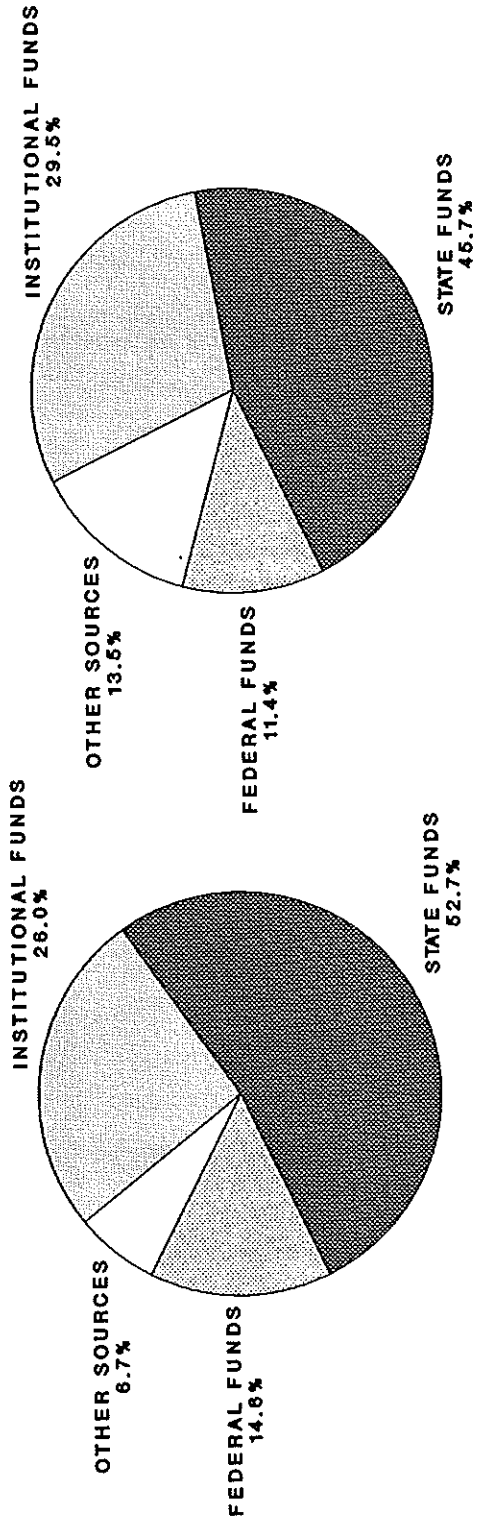

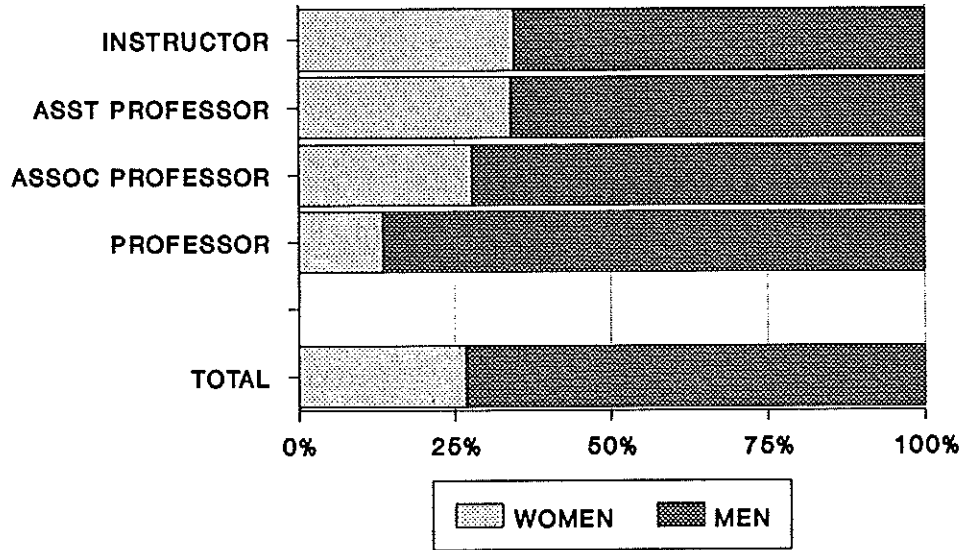

**AUTUMN 1991**

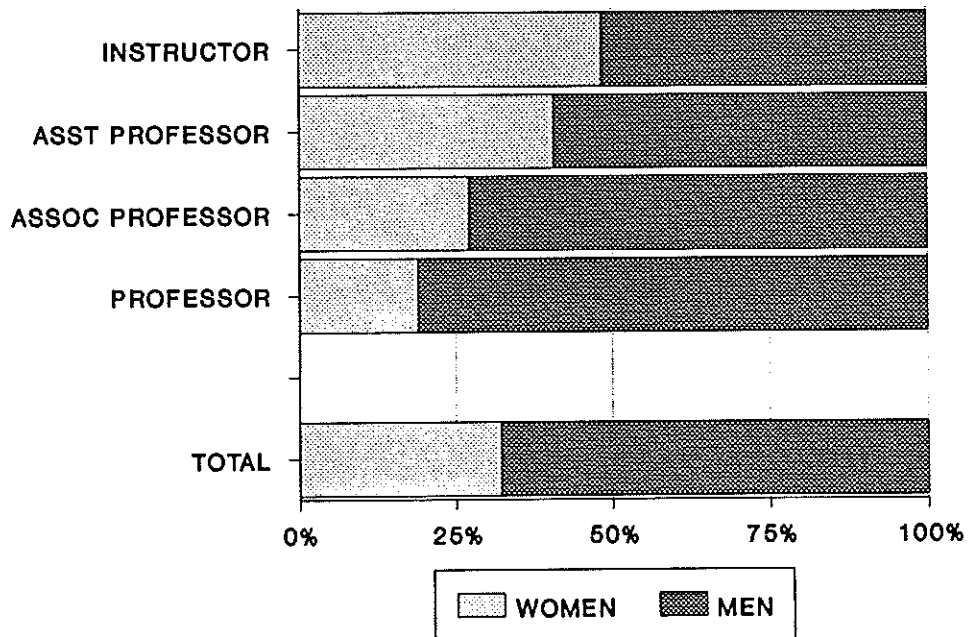

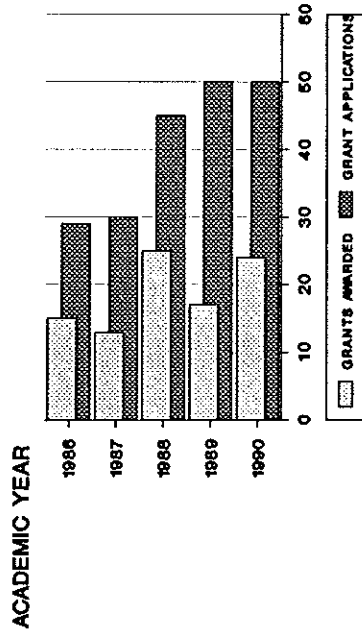

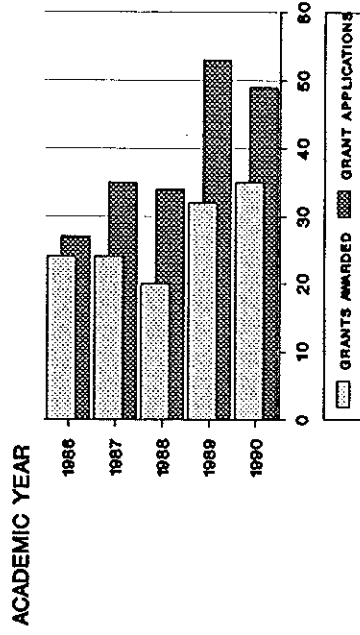

# GRAPH 10 EXTERNAL GRANT ACTIVITY 1986-87 THROUGH 1990-91

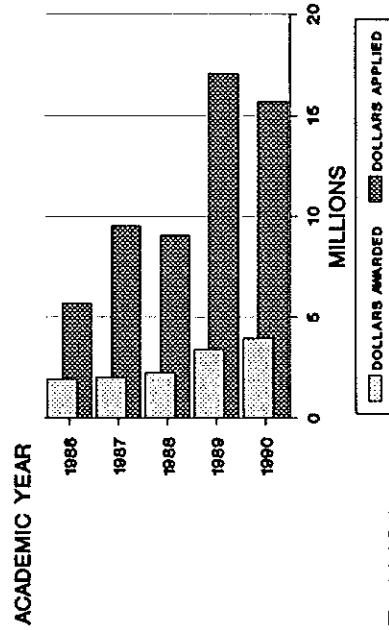
**RESEARCH GRANTS**

AY 1986-87 THROUGH AY 1990-91

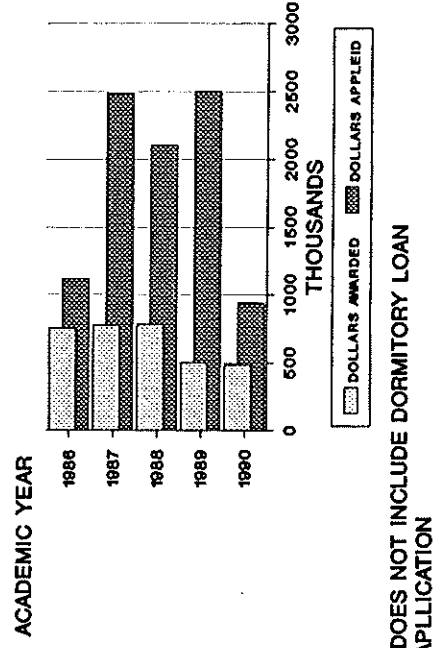
