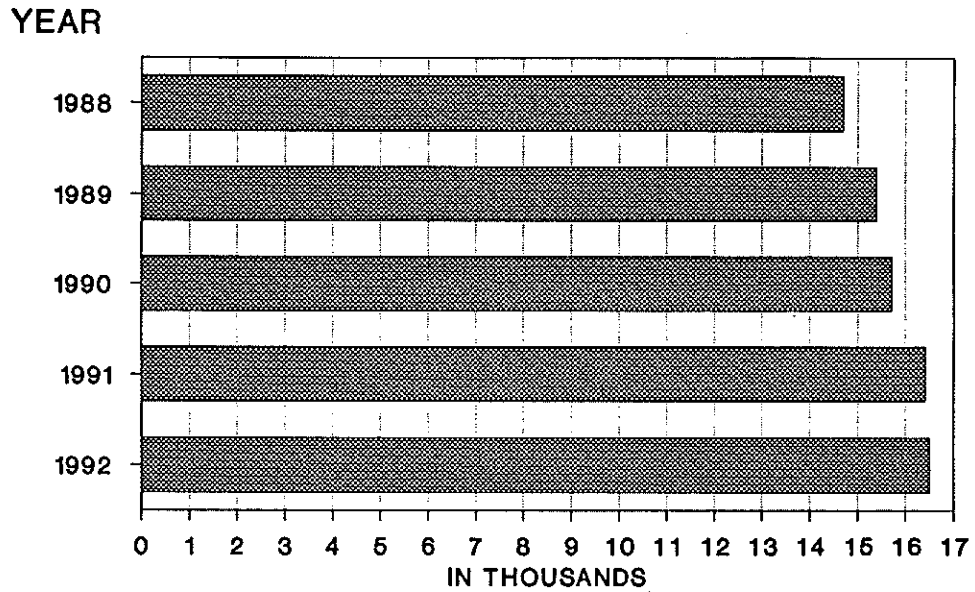

PERCENT GROWTH IN HEADCOUNT

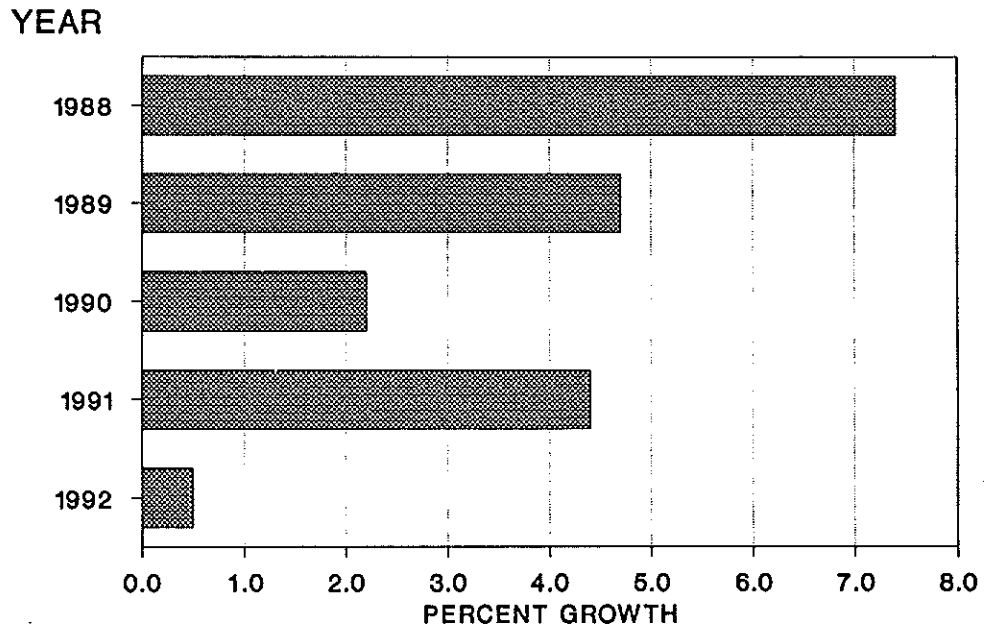

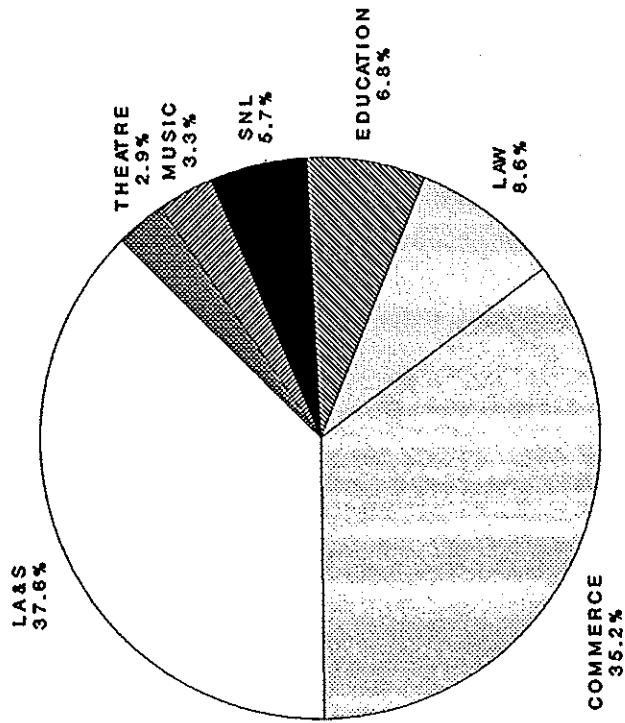

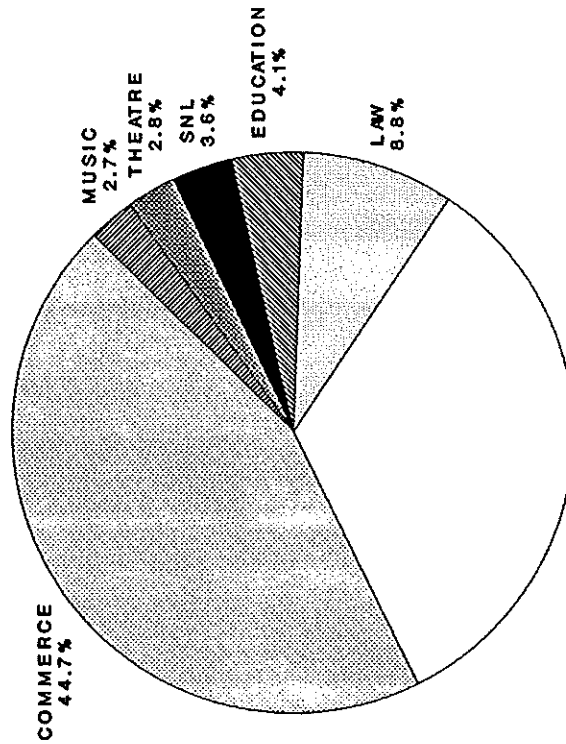

AUTUMN 1992**

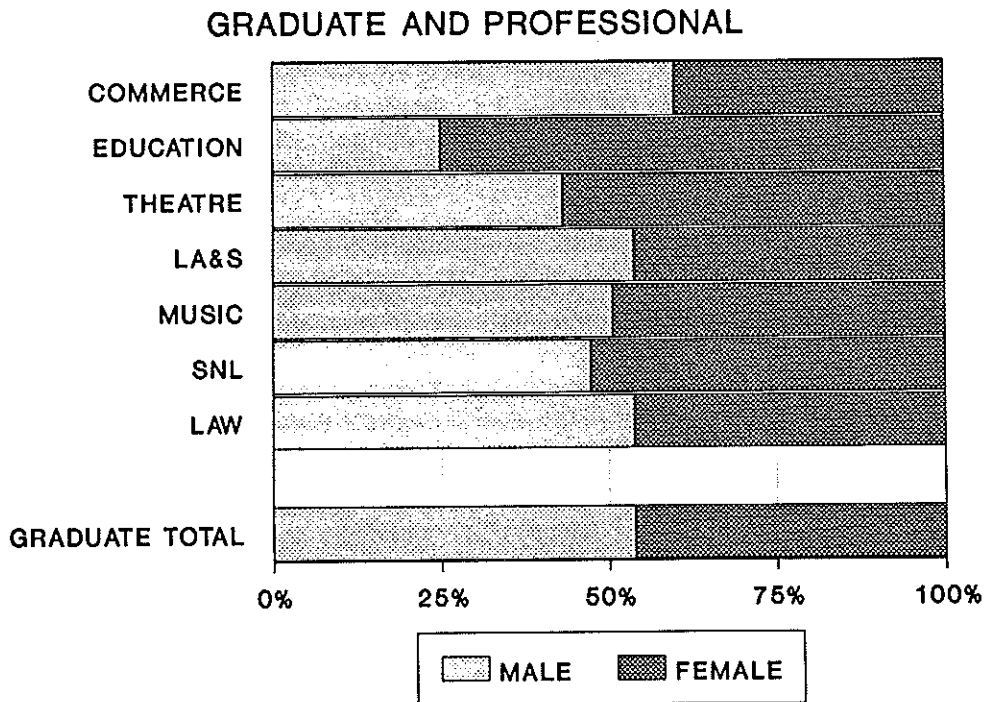
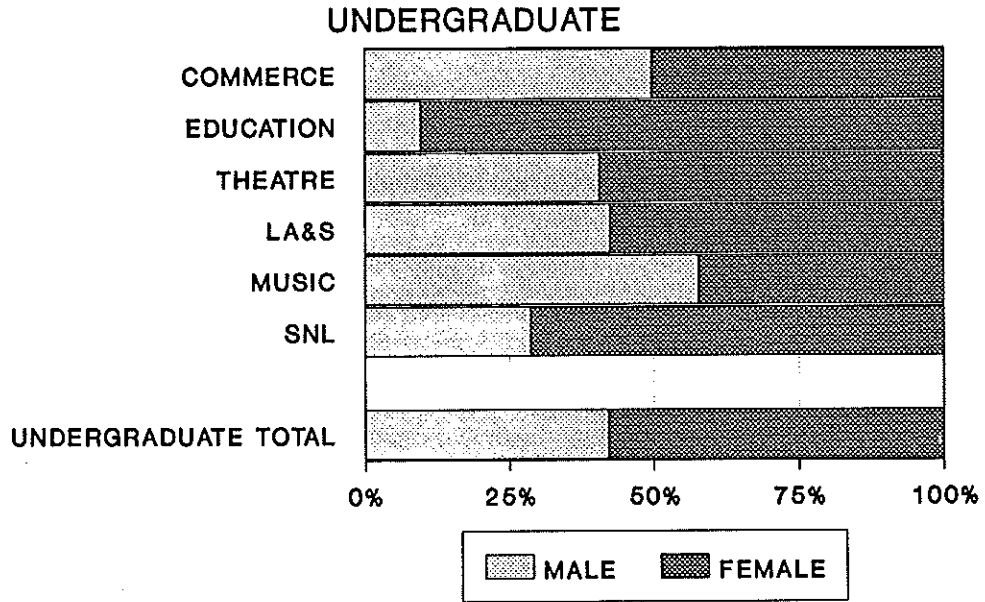

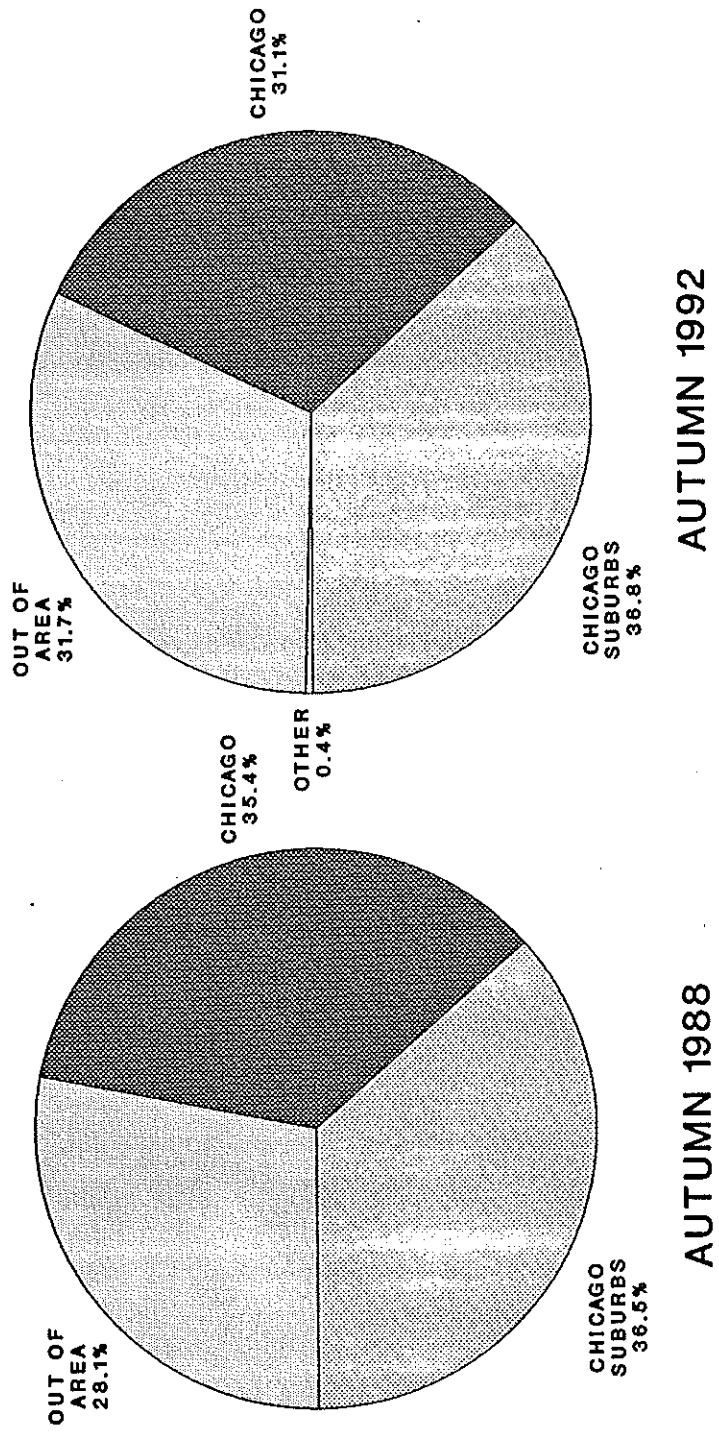

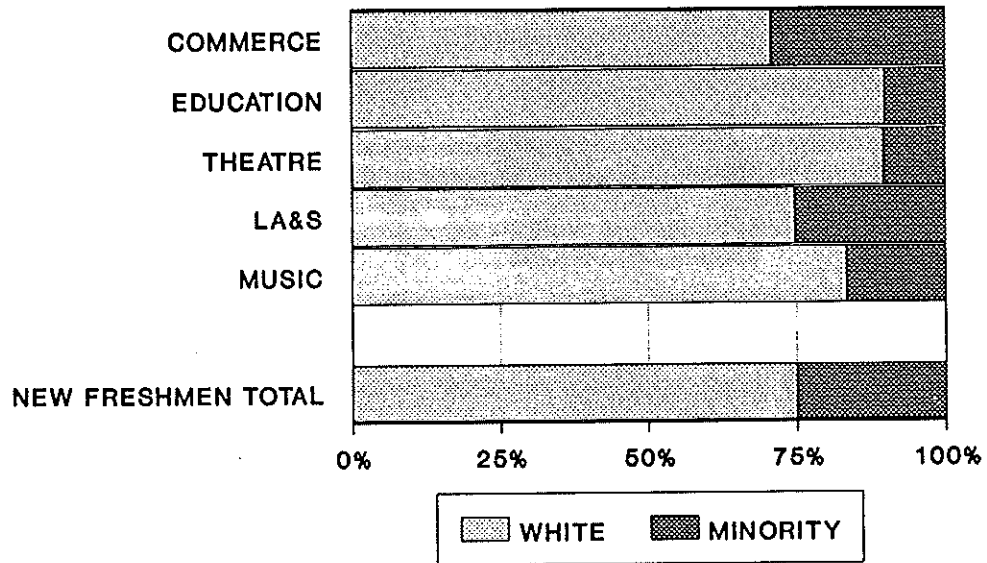

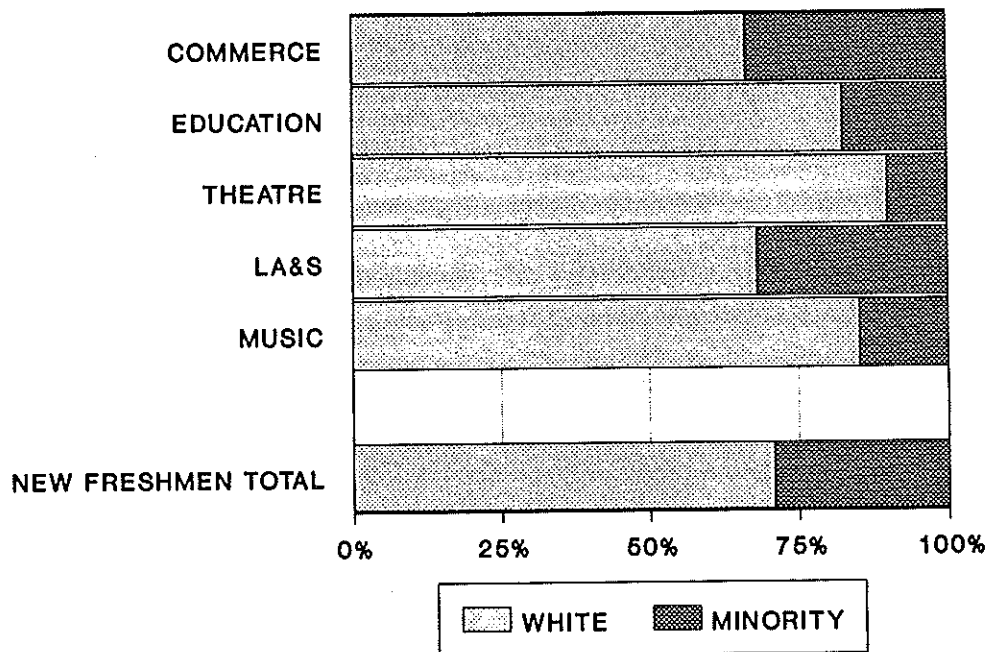

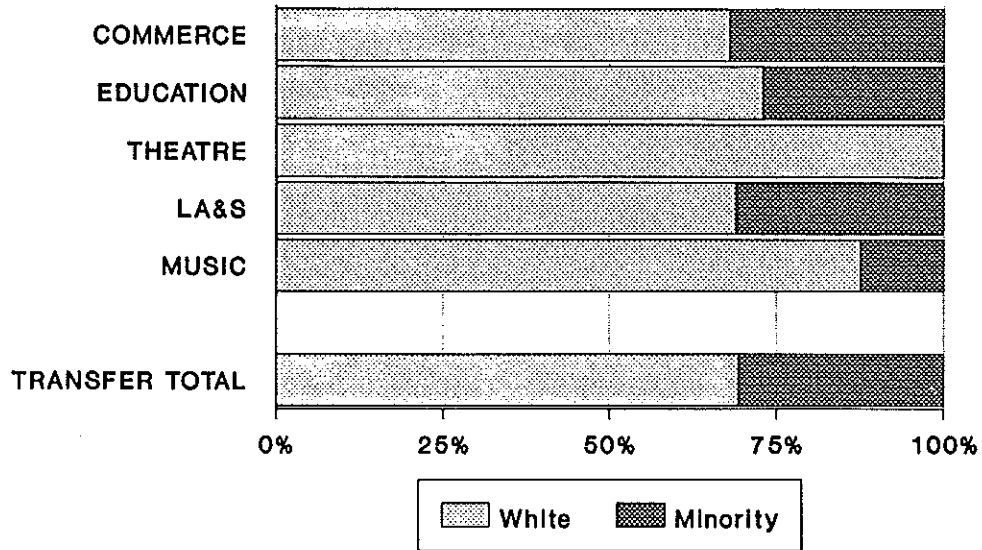

**AUTUMN 1992**

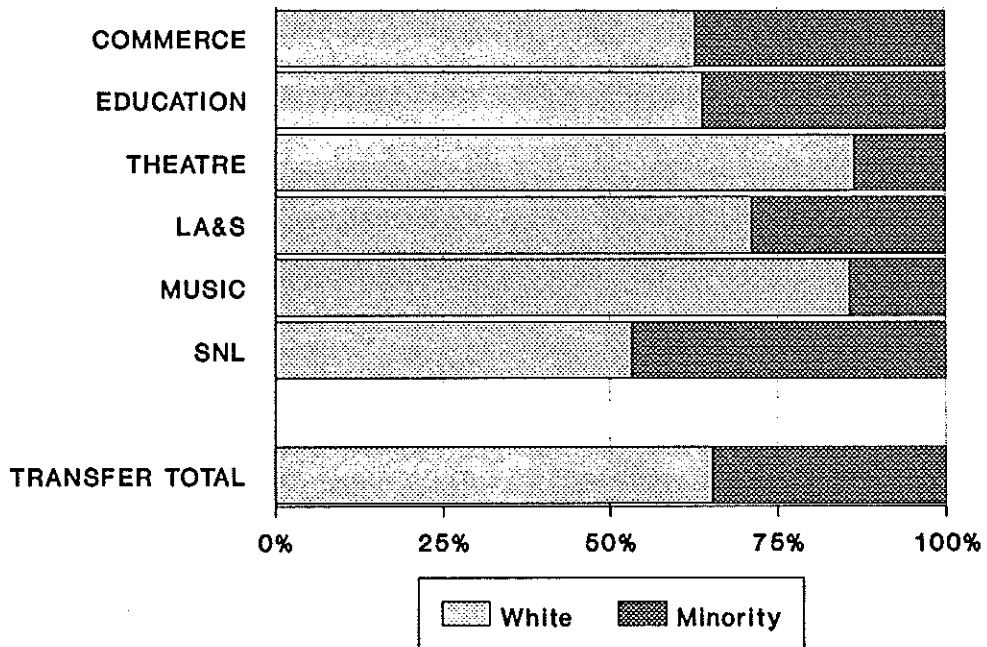

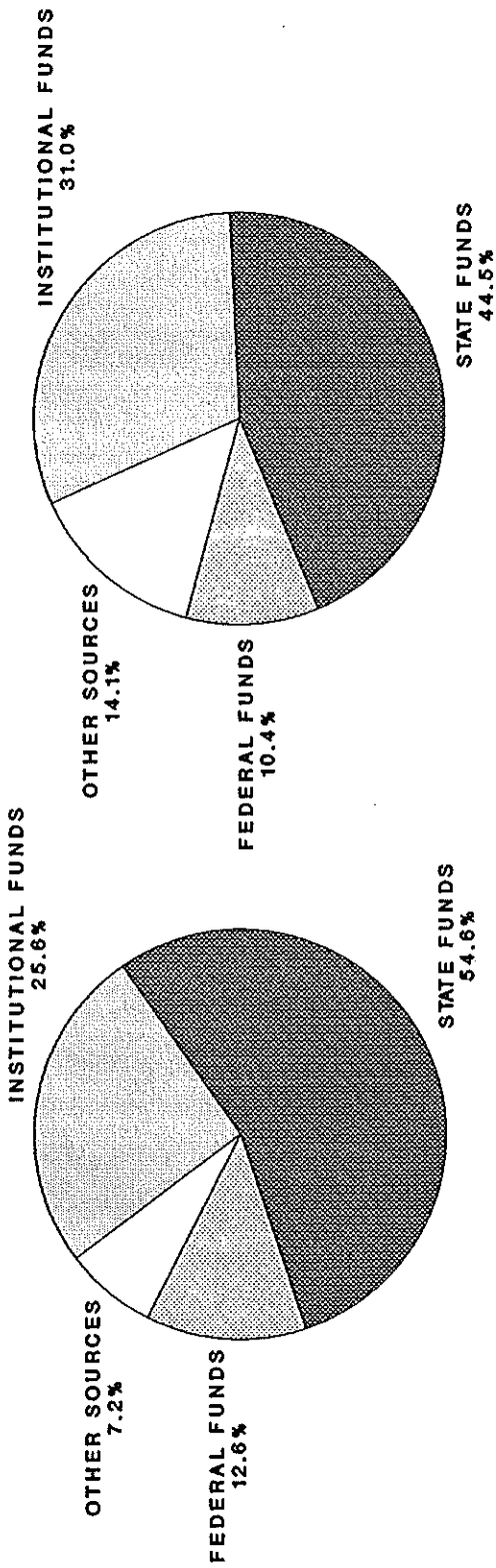

**AUTUMN 1988 & AUTUMN 1992**

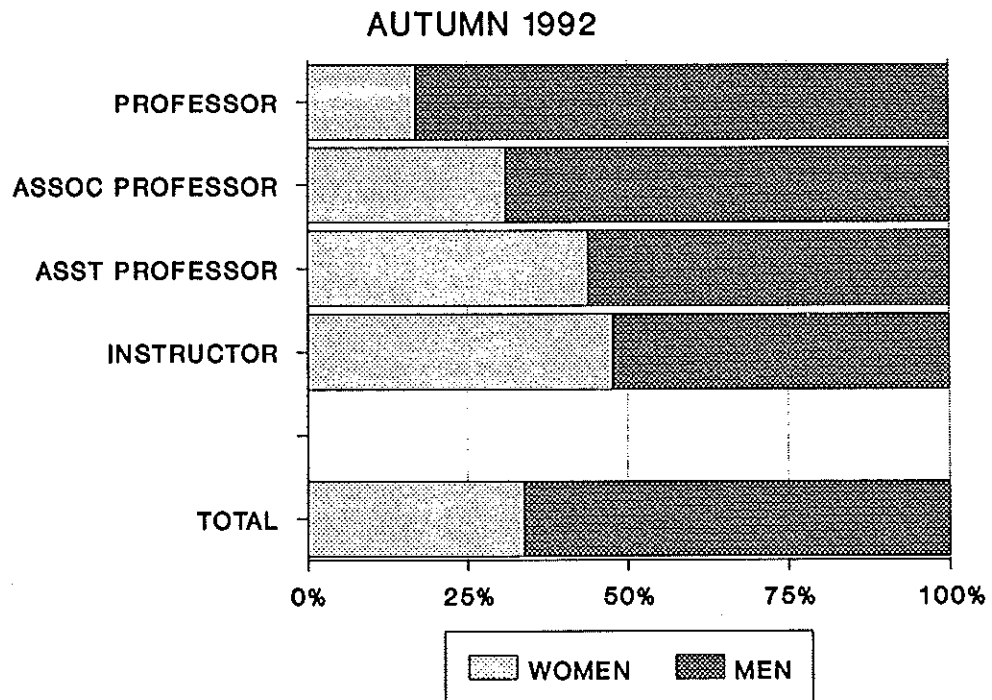
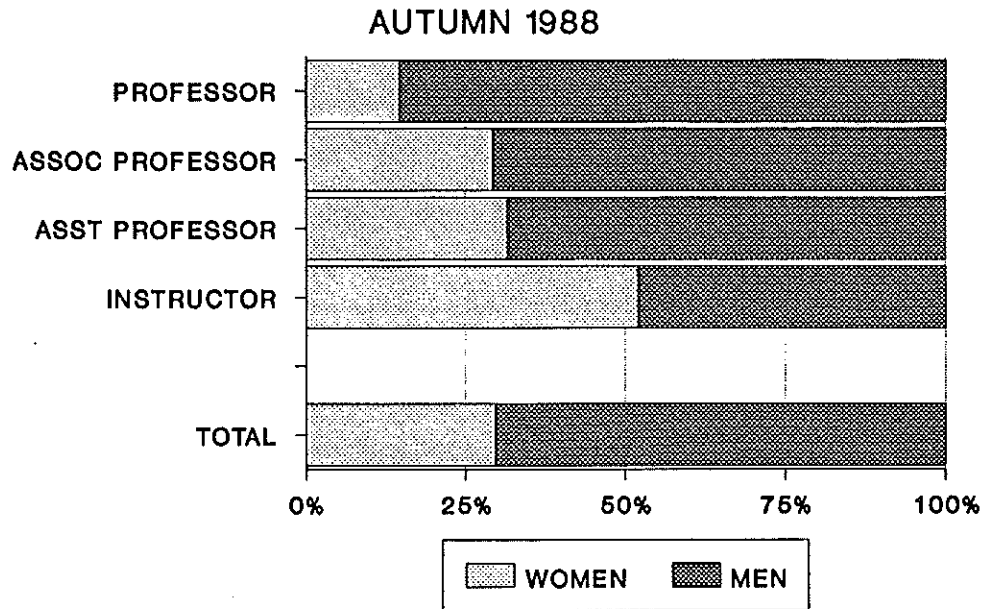

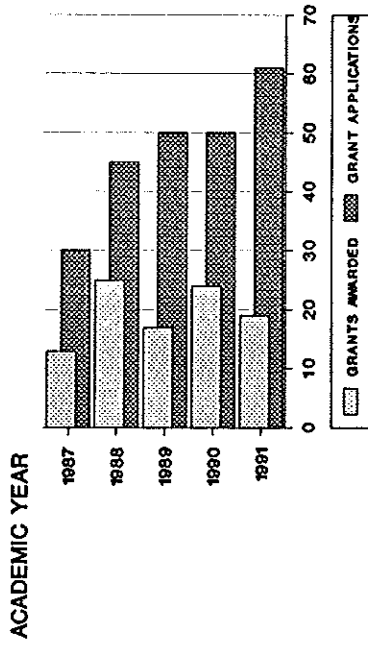

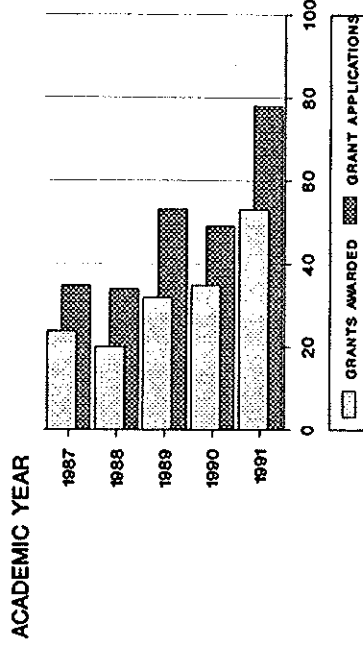

# GRAPH 9 EXTERNAL GRANT ACTIVITY 1987-88 THROUGH 1991-92

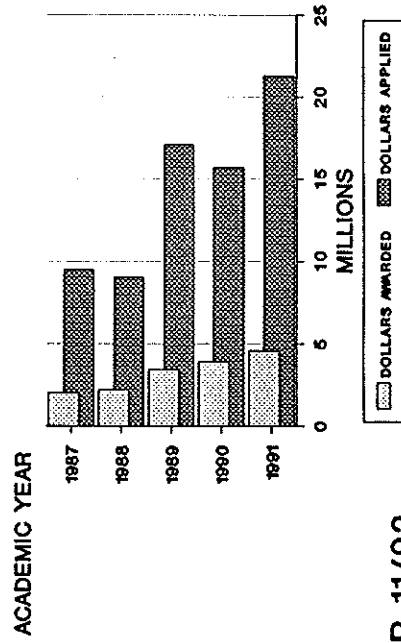
**RESEARCH GRANTS**  
AY 1987-88 THROUGH AY 1991-92



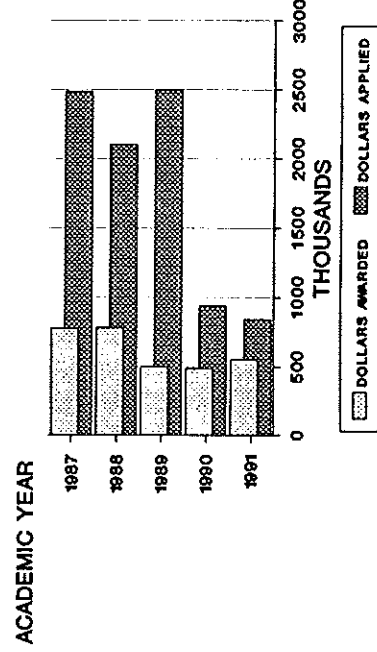
**OTHER GRANTS**
