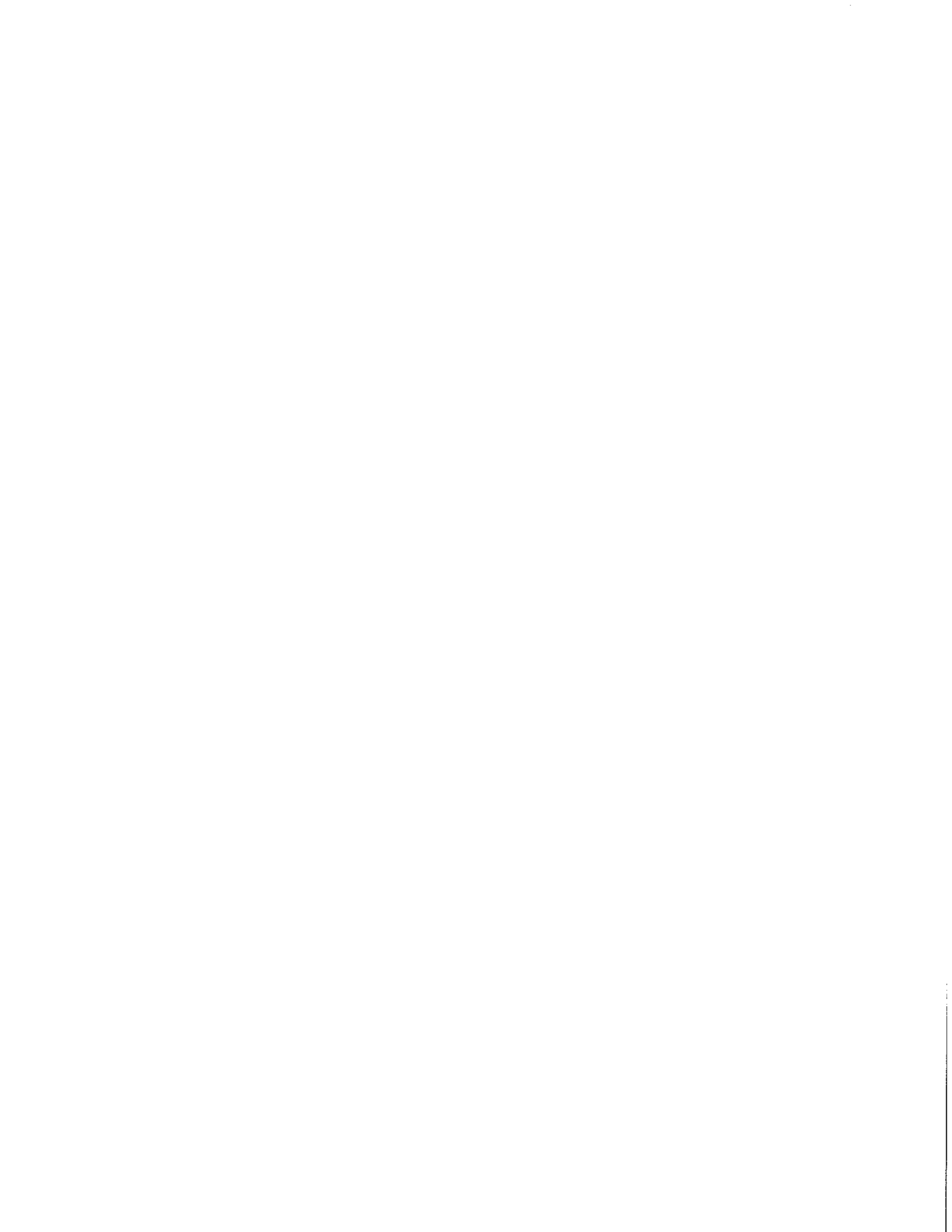

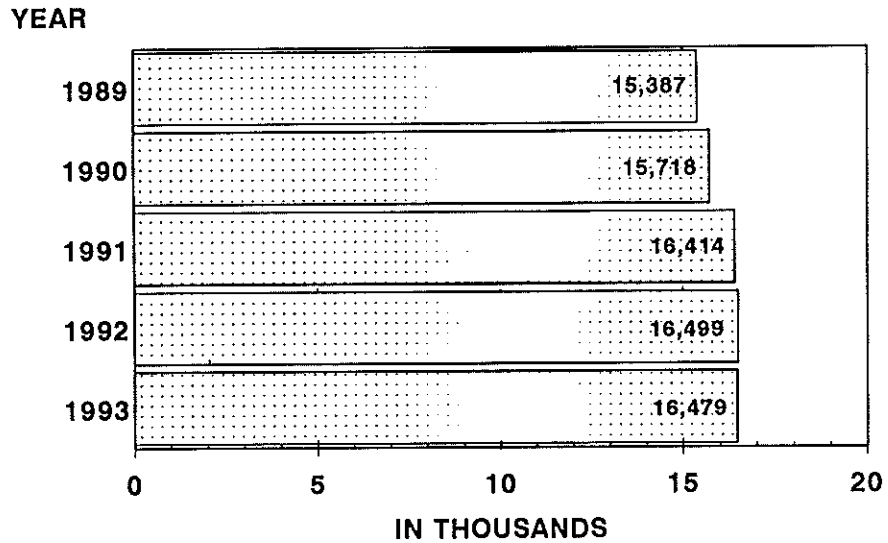

PERCENT GROWTH IN HEADCOUNT

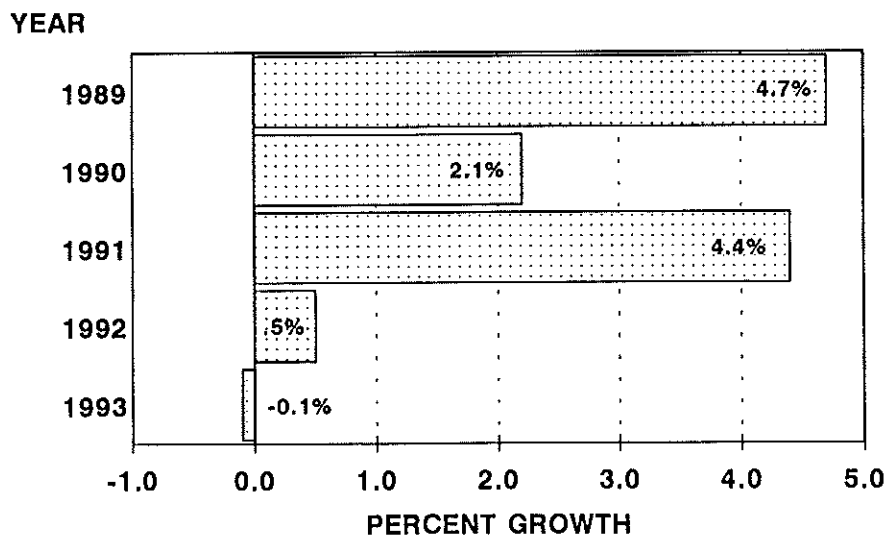

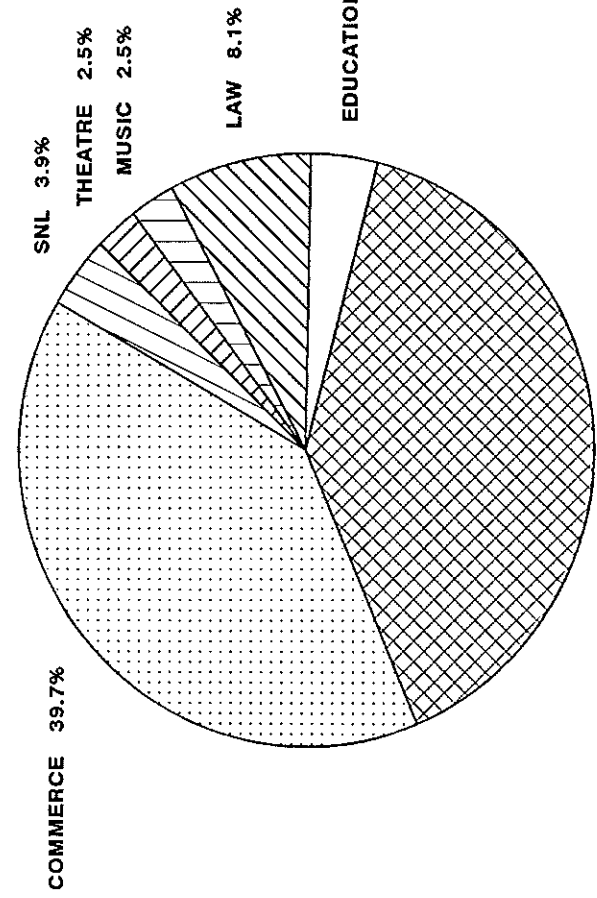

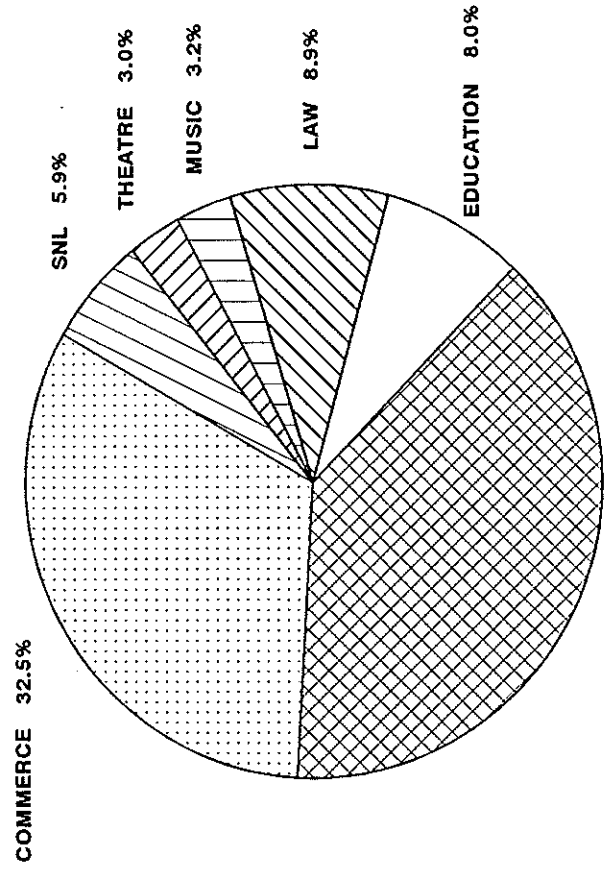

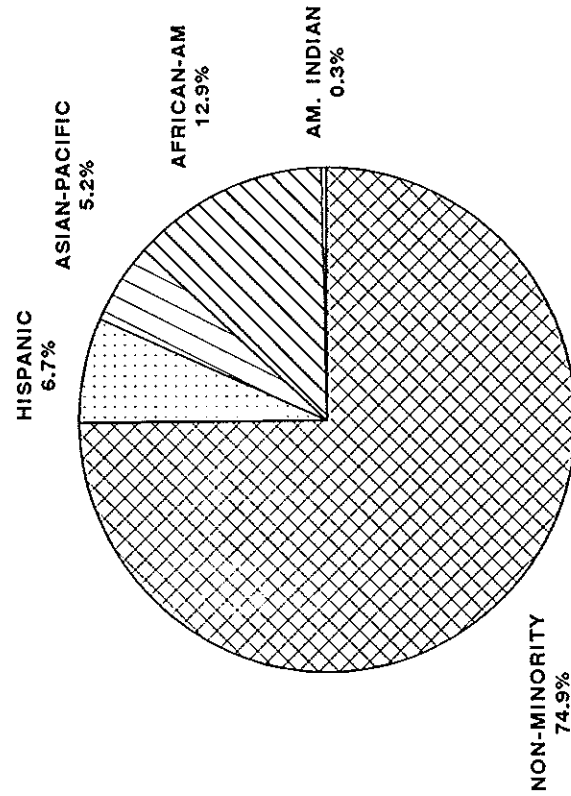

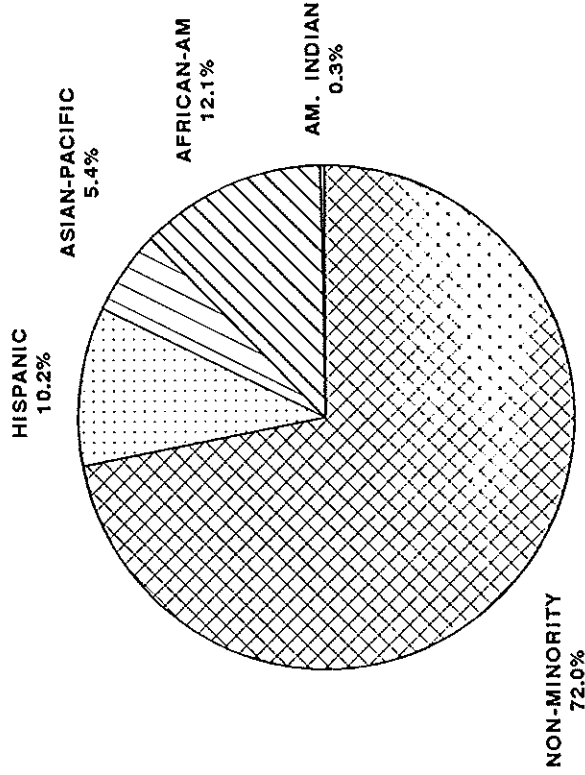

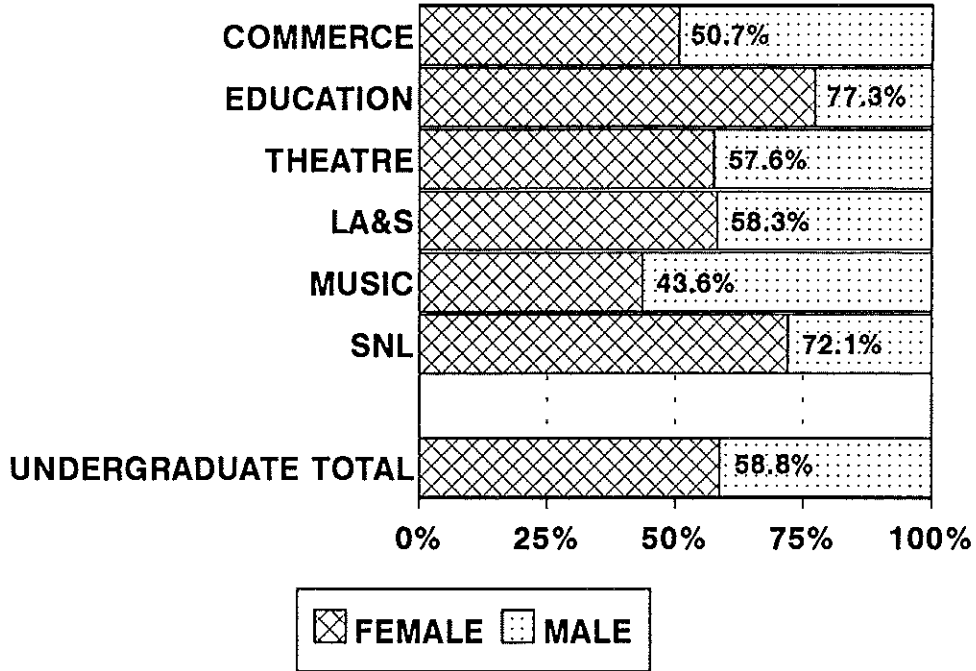

GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL

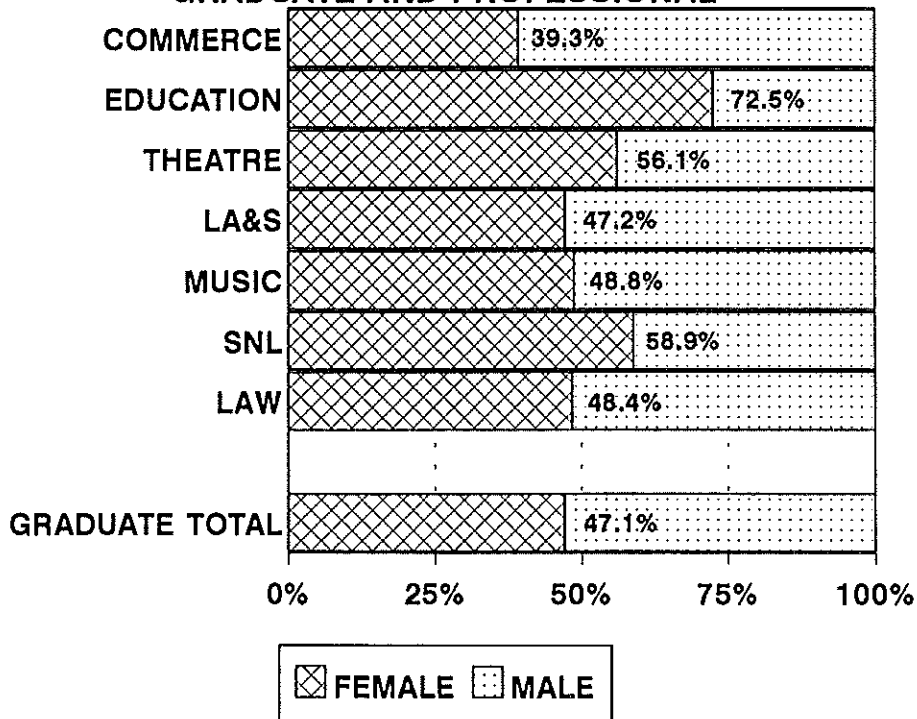

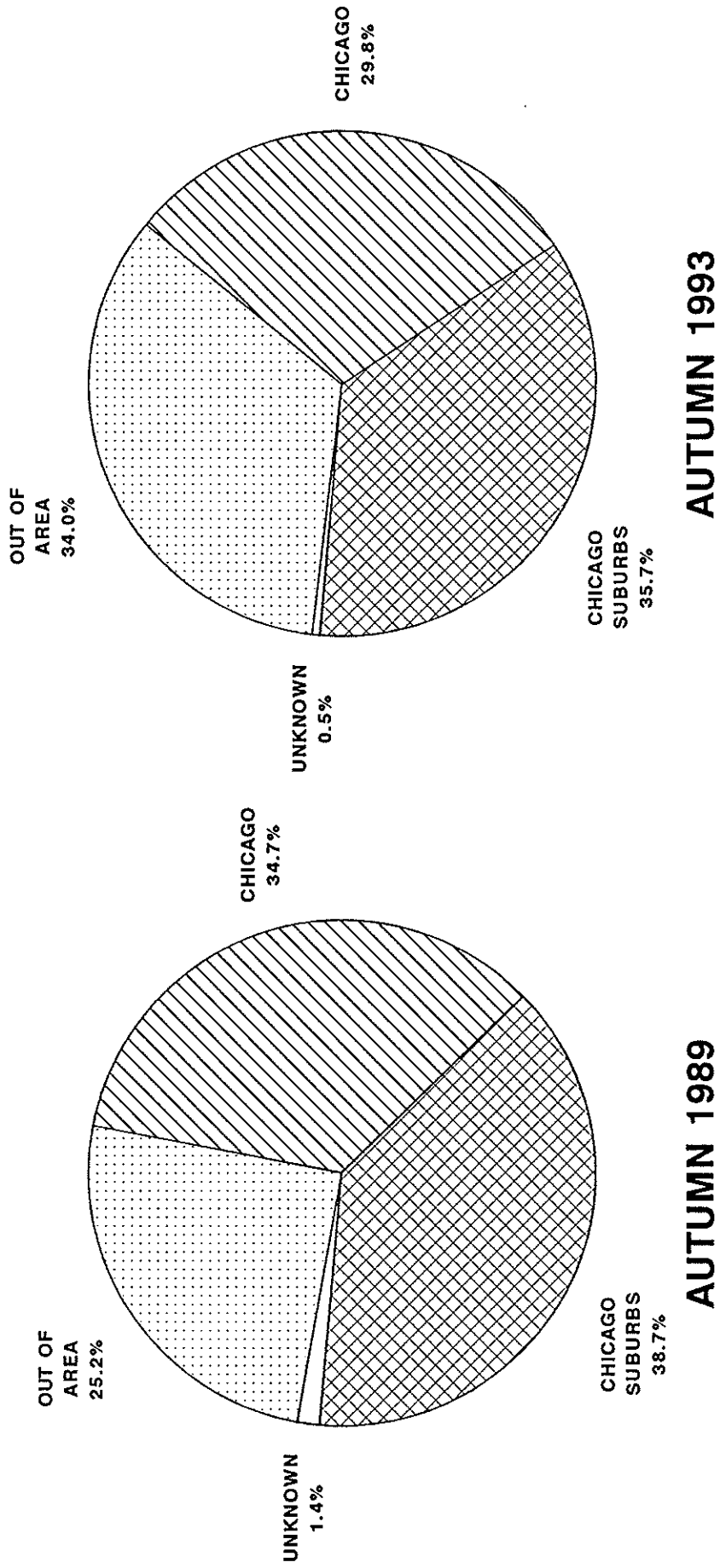

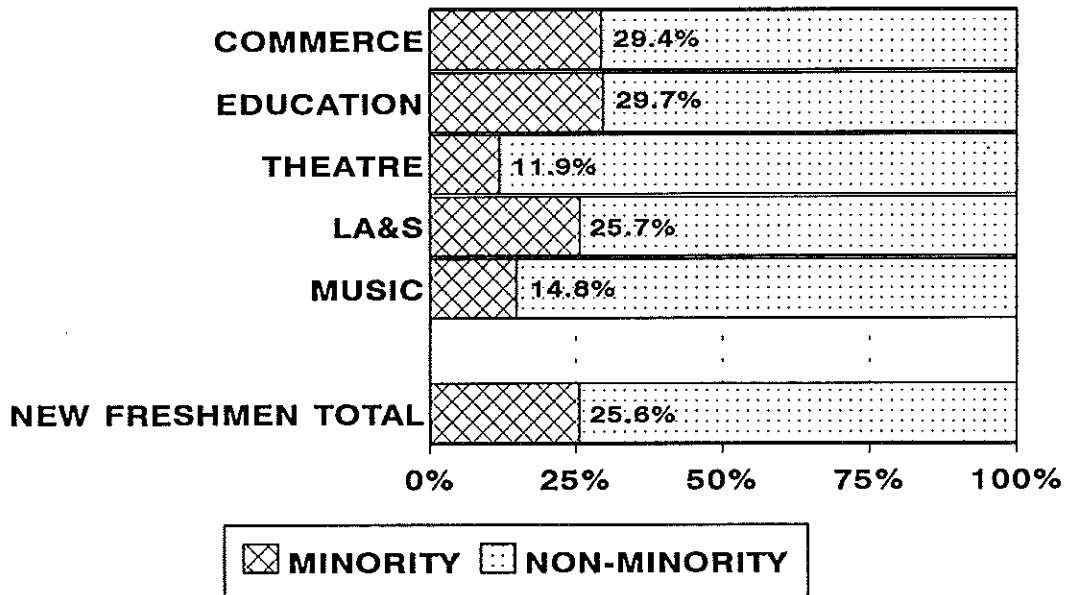

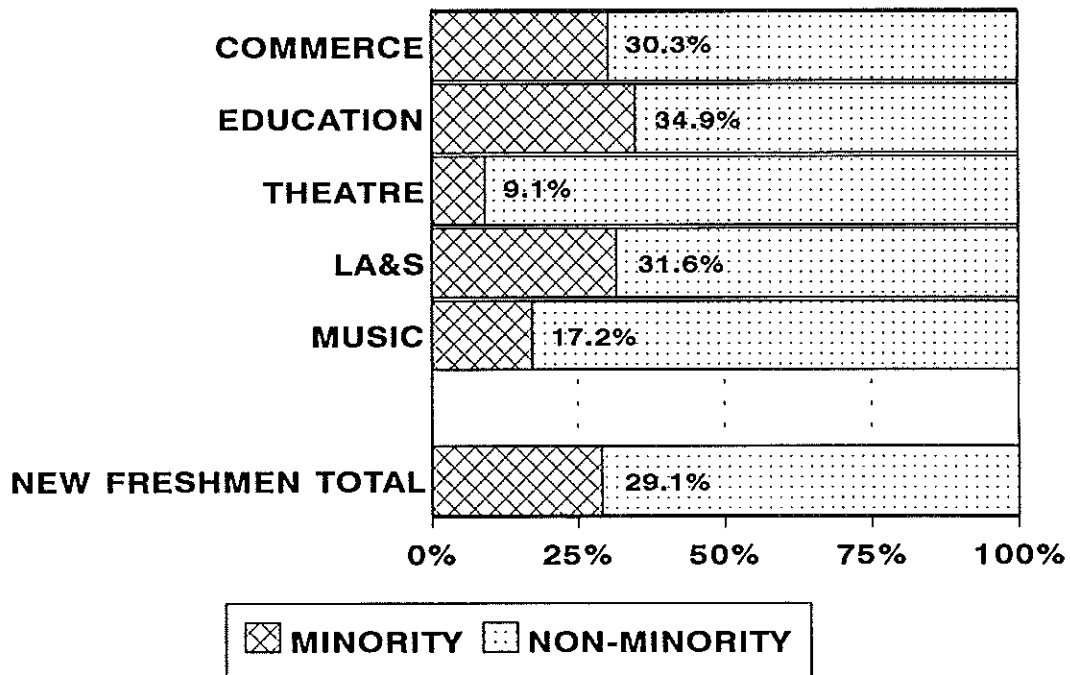

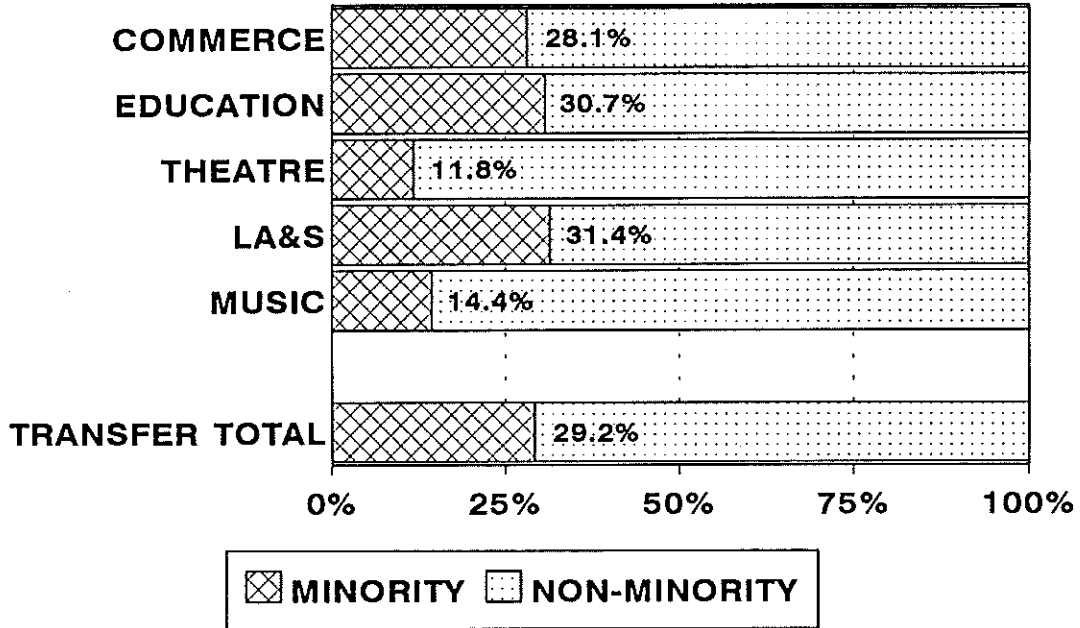

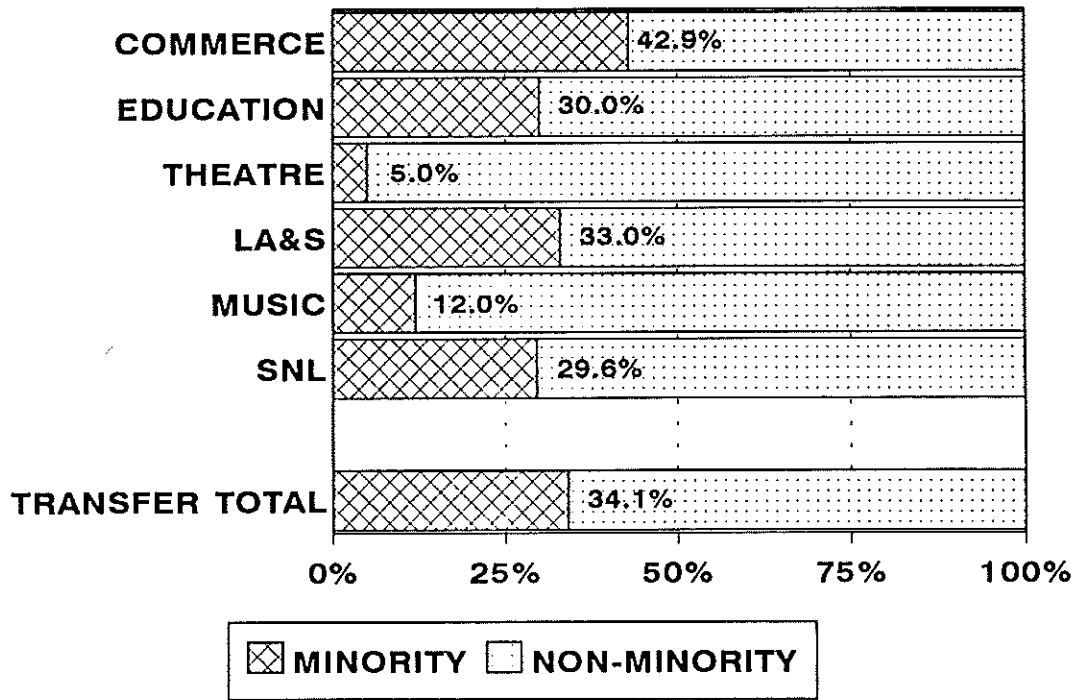

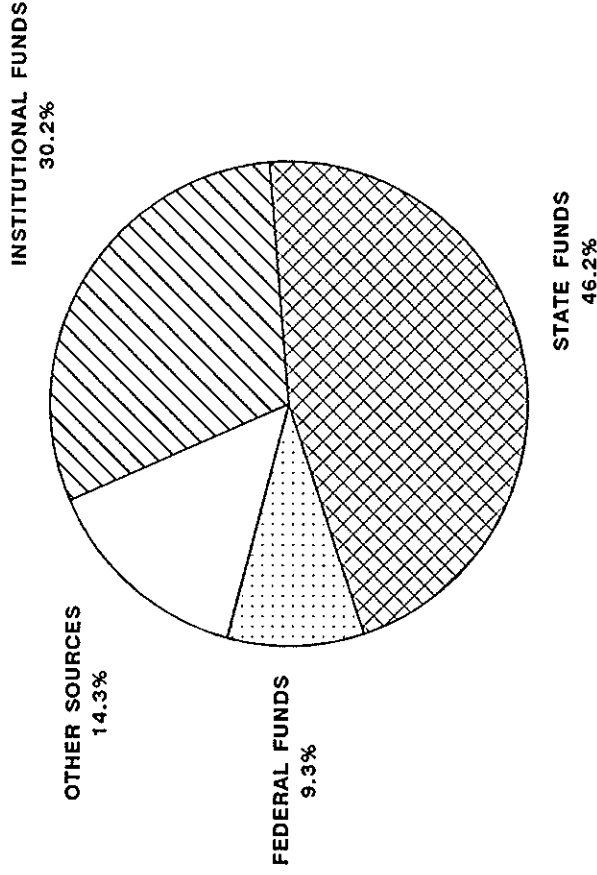

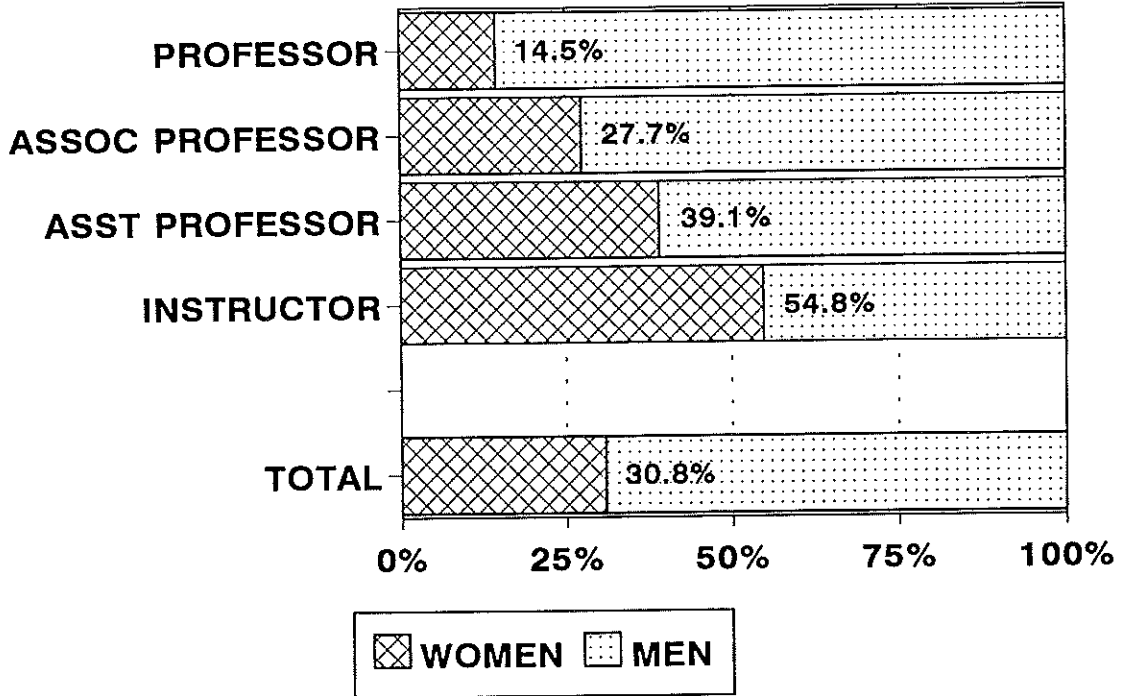

AUTUMN 1993

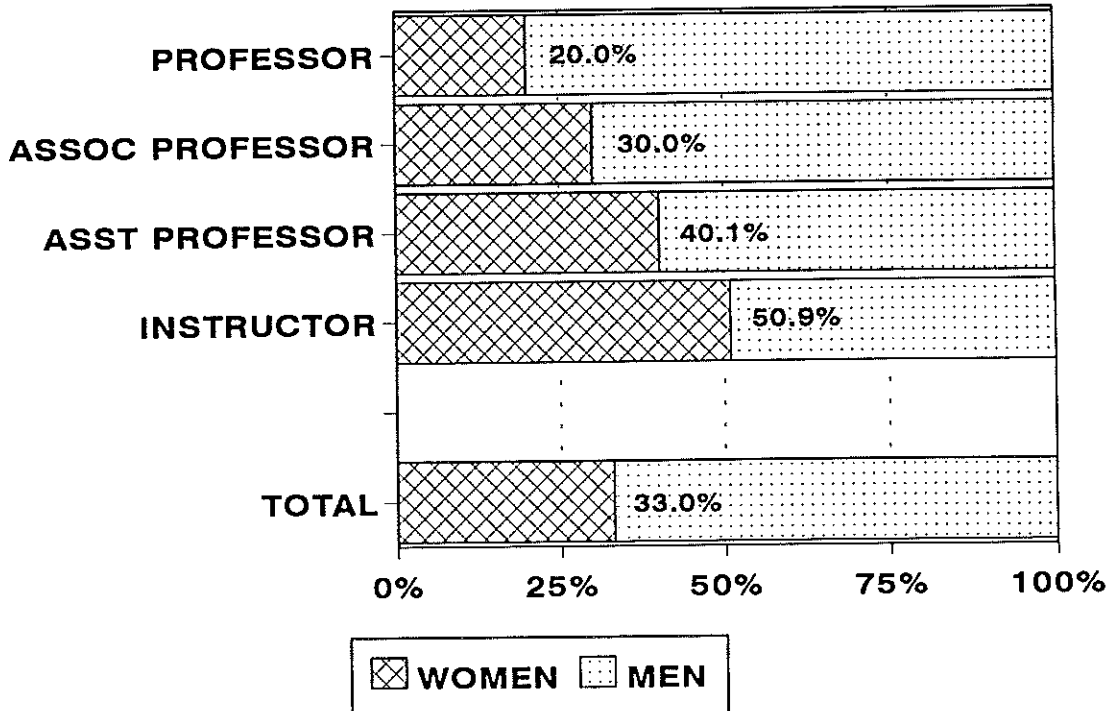

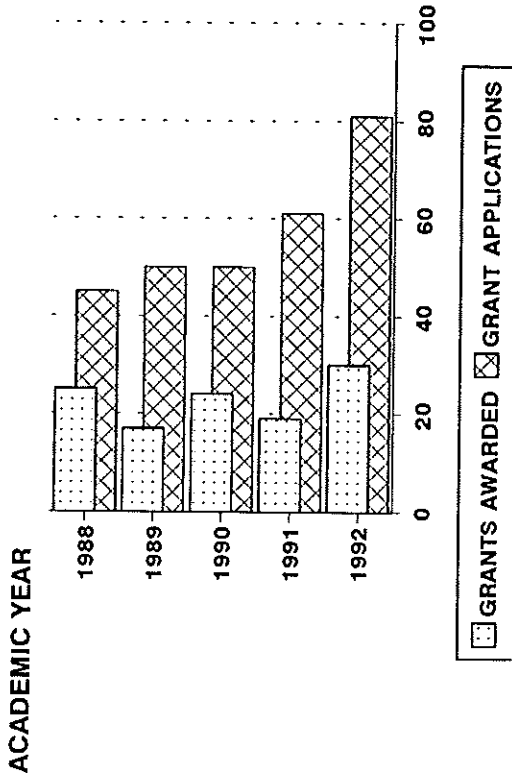

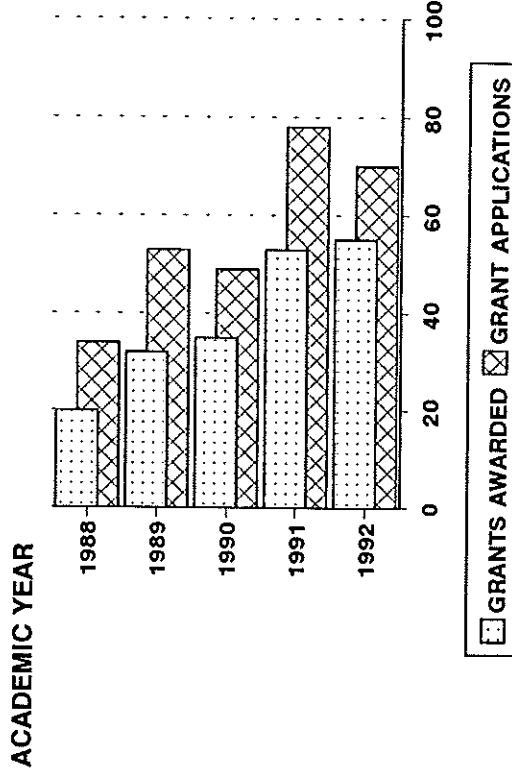

GRAPH 10 EXTERNAL GRANT ACTIVITY 1988-89 THROUGH 1992-93

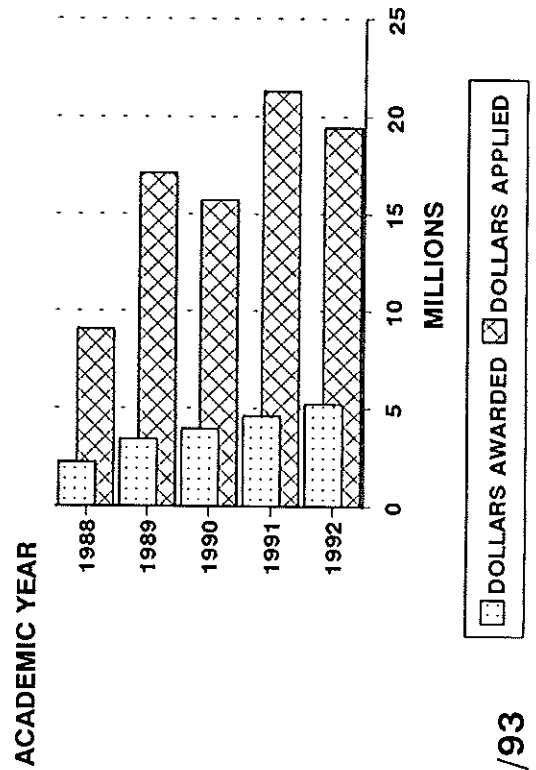
RESEARCH GRANTS
AY 1988-89 THROUGH AY 1992-93



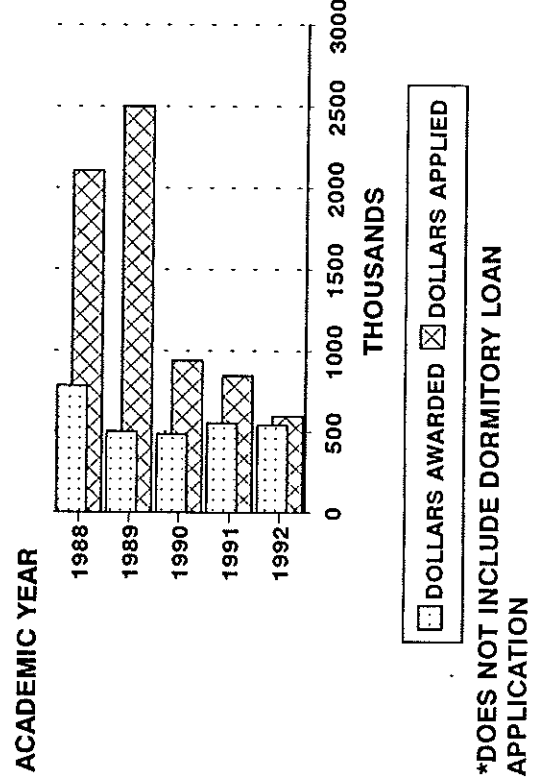
OTHER GRANTS
