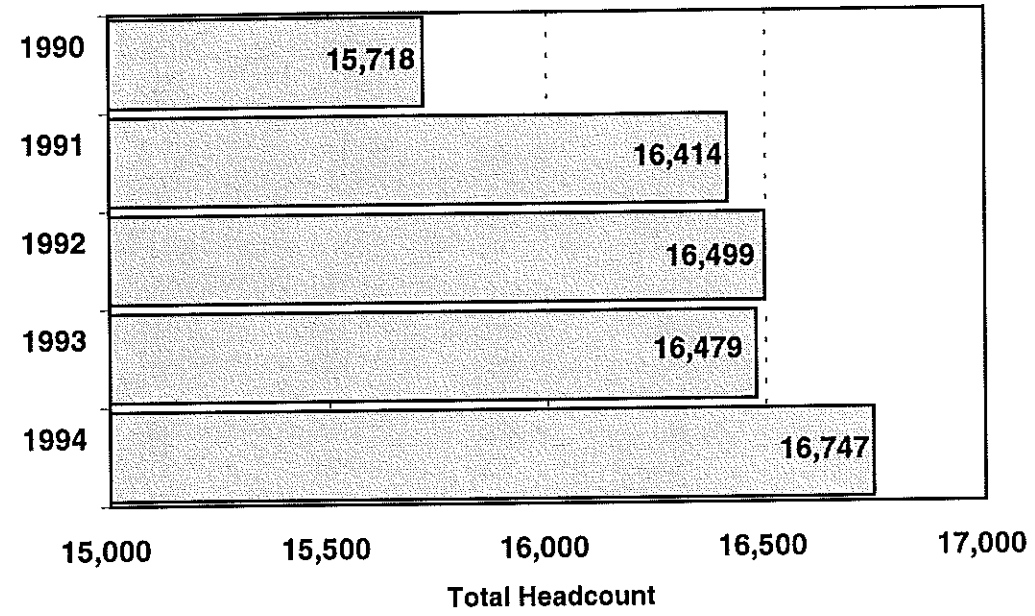

Percent Growth in Headcount

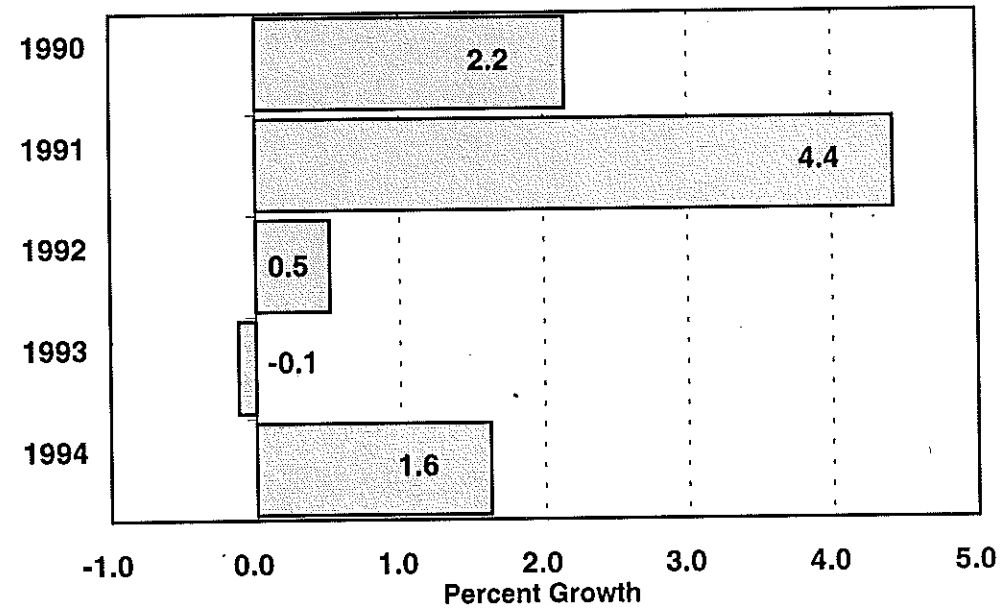

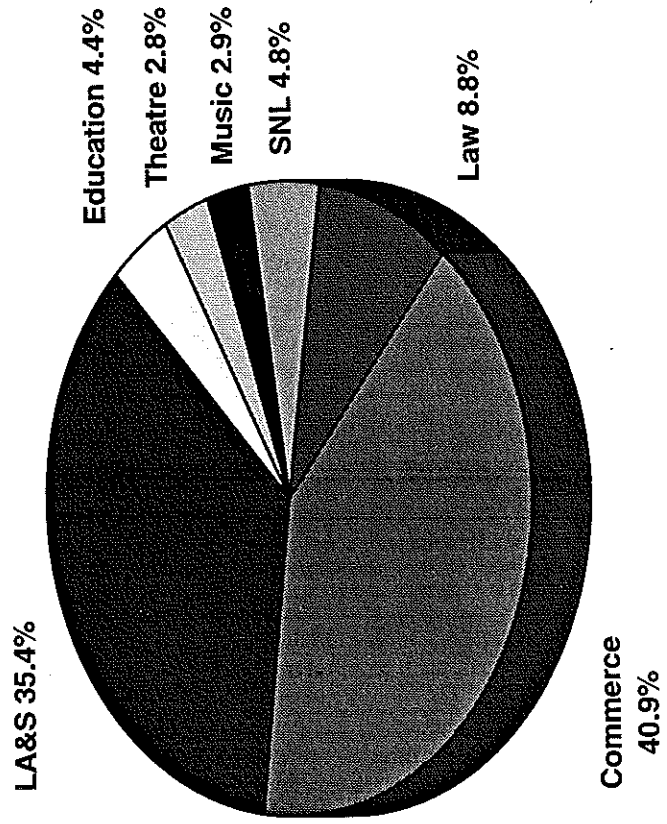

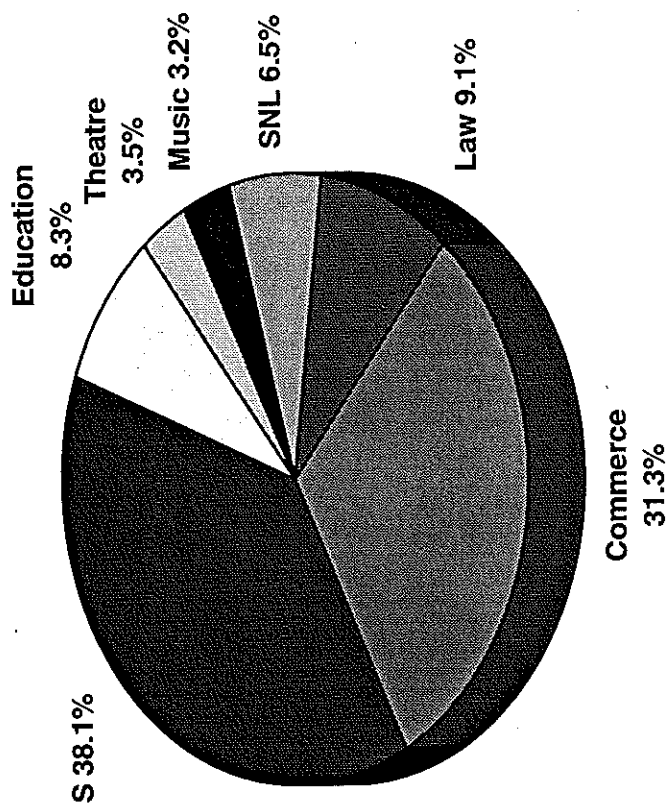

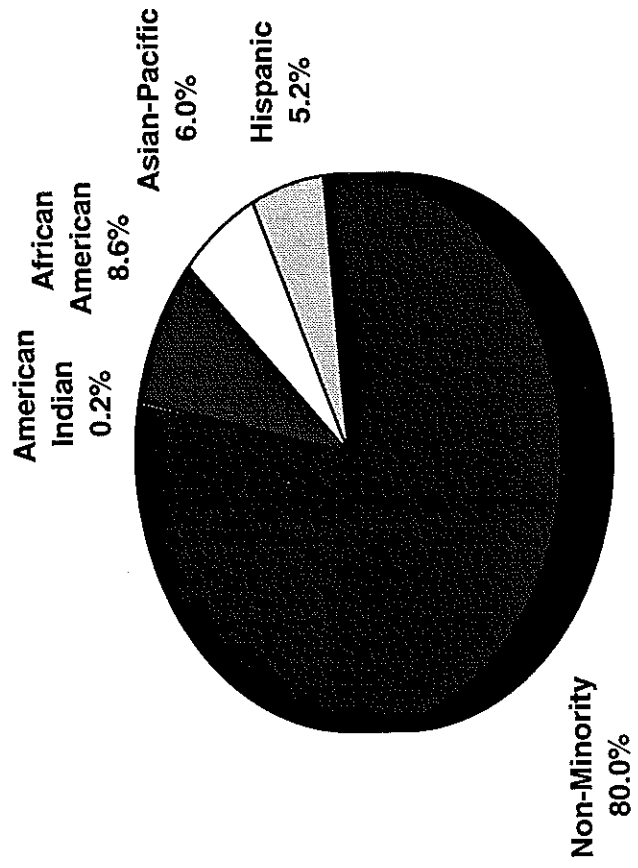

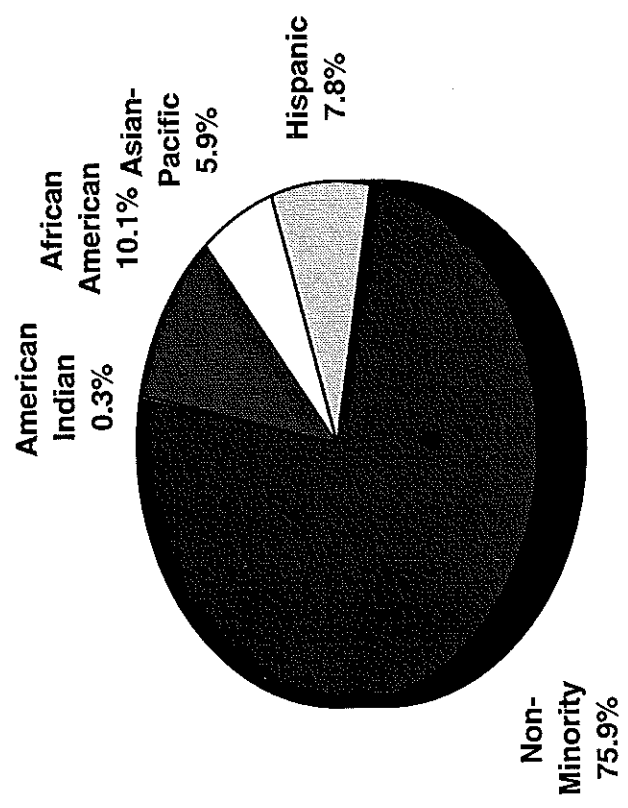

 Autumn 1994

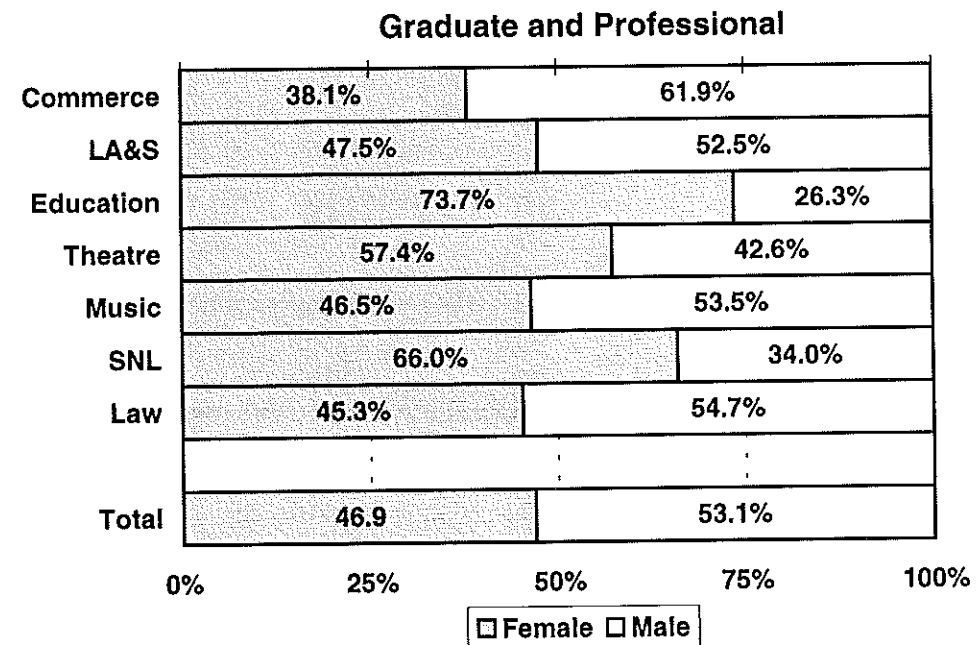
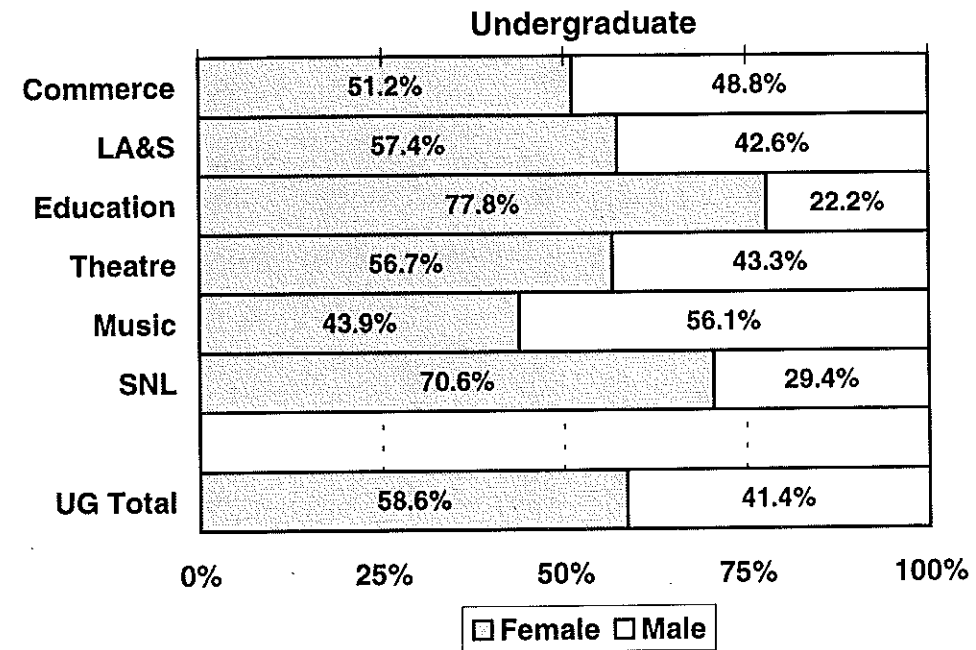

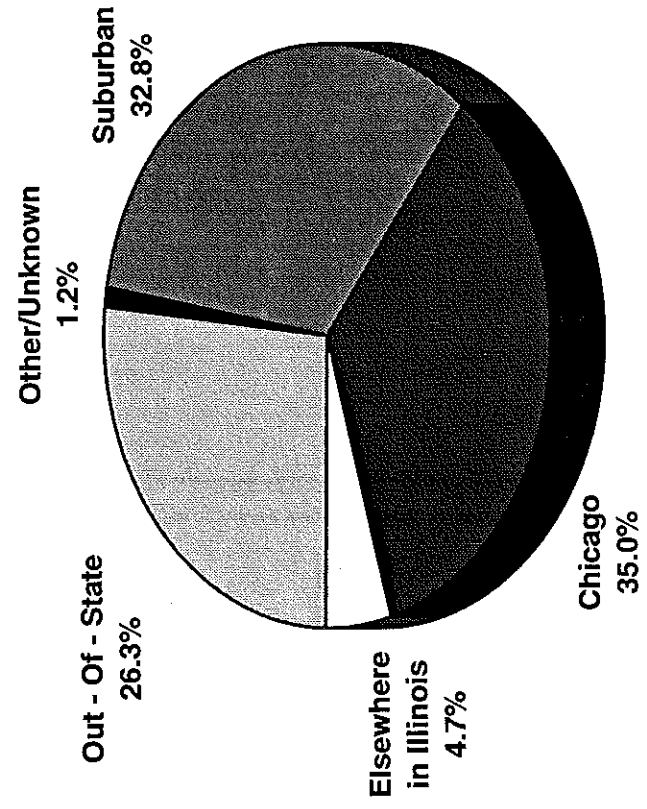

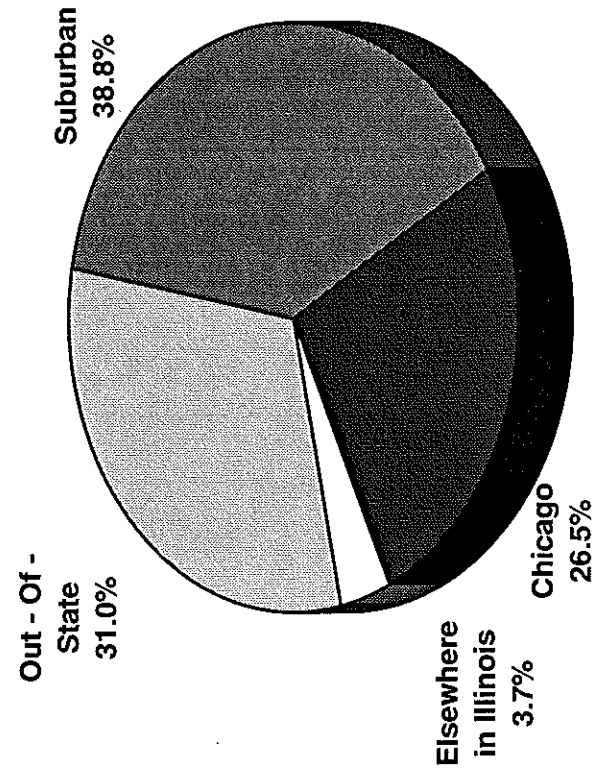

 Autumn 1990 and Autumn 1994

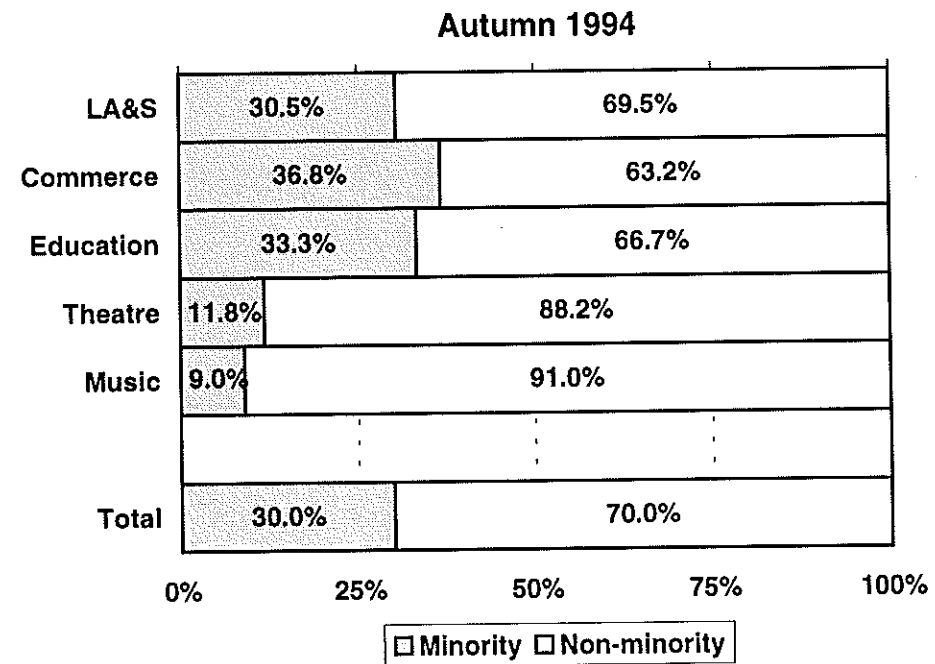
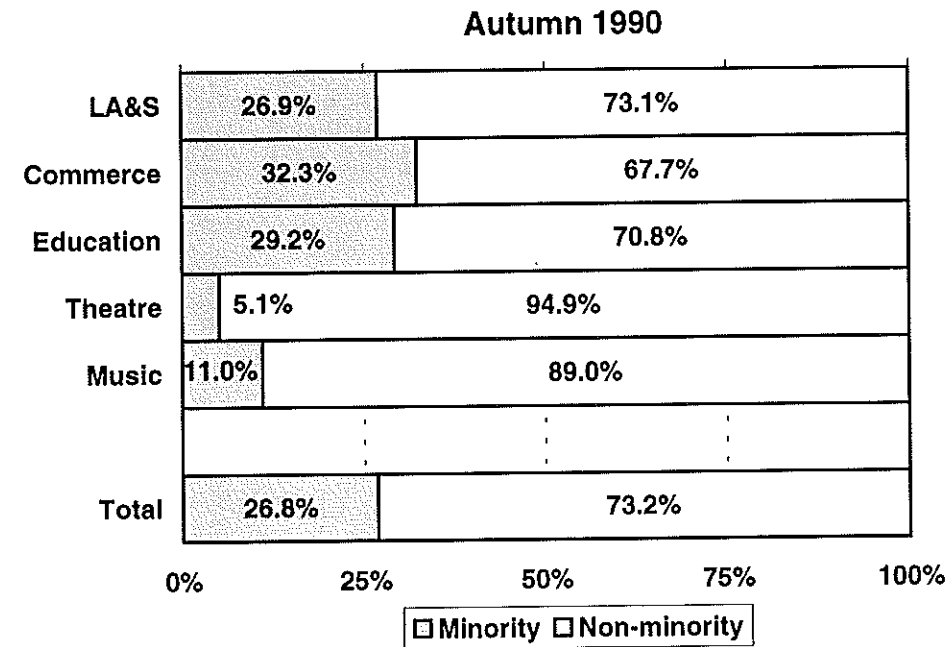

 Autumn 1990 and Autumn 1994

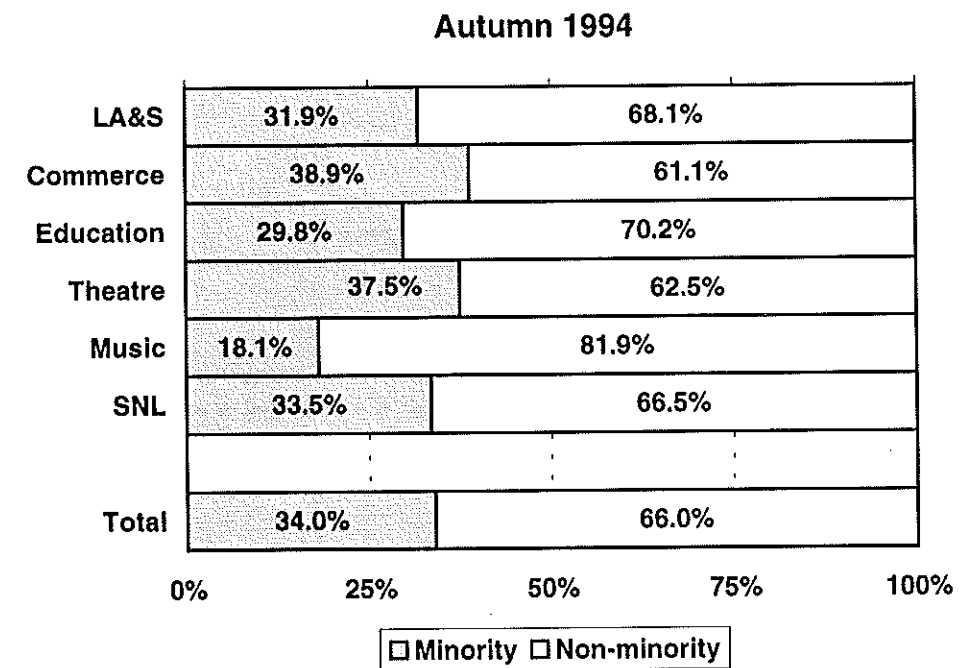
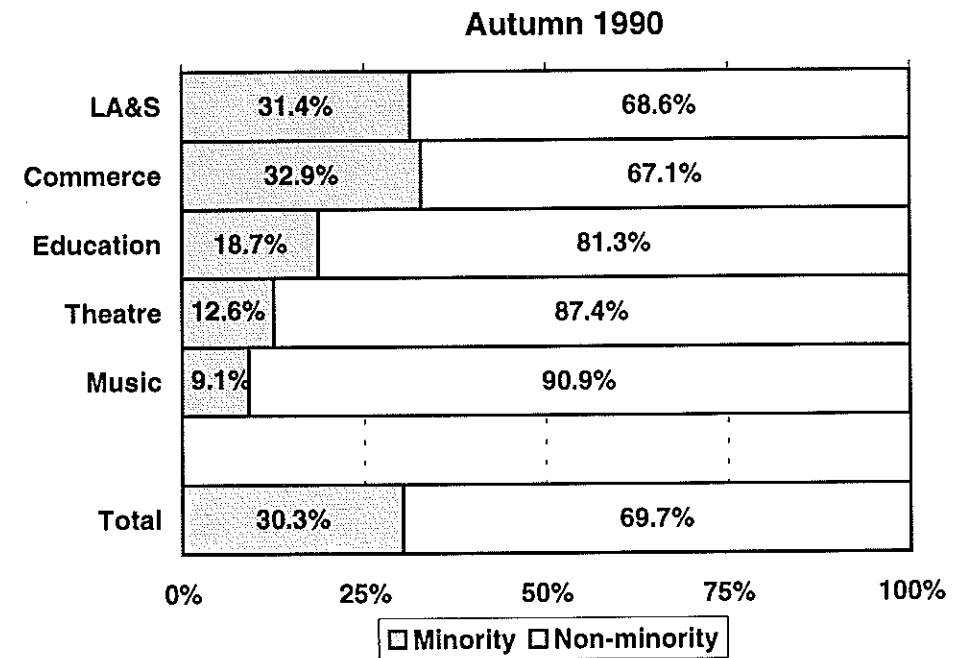

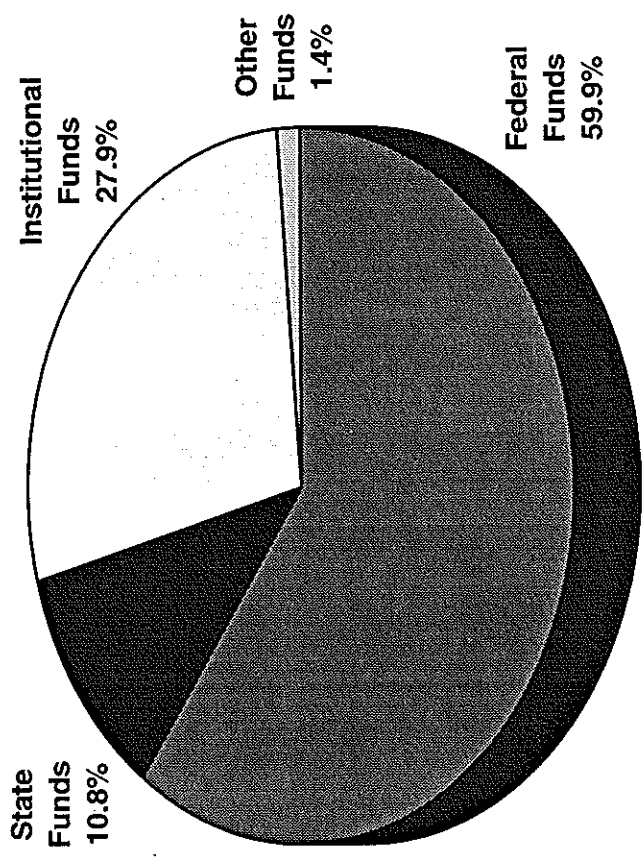

 Autumn 1990 and Autumn 1994

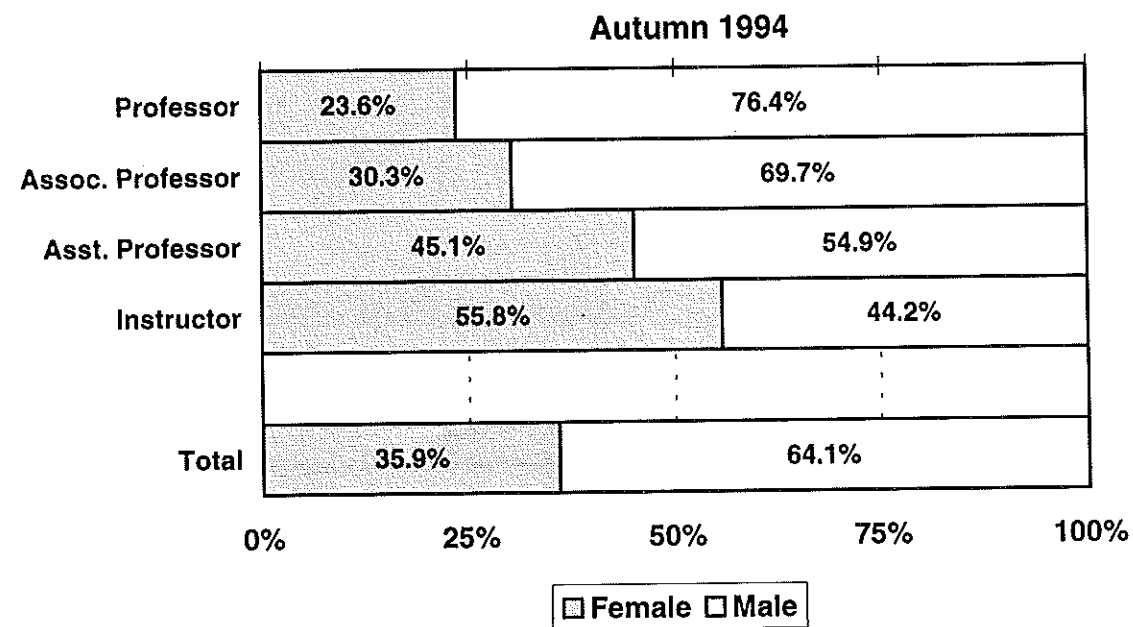
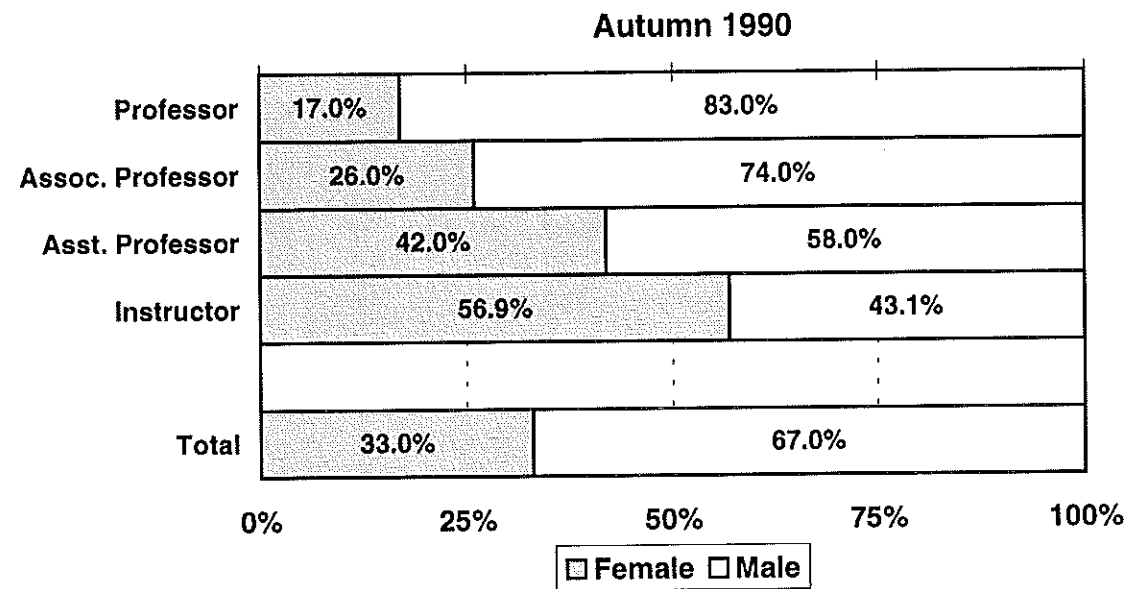

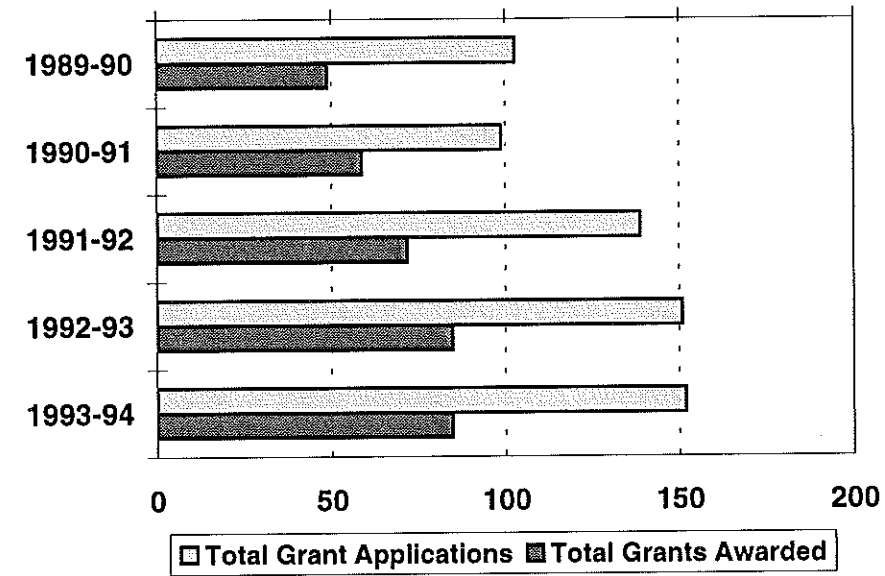

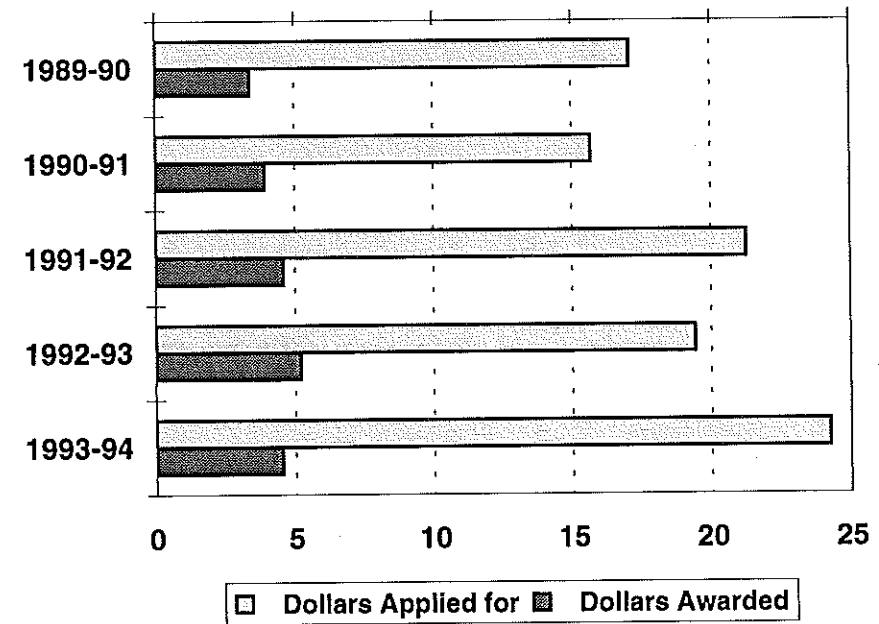
