

Preface

1. **Historical data concerning the School of Computer Science, Telecommunications and Information Systems (CTI) is reported in the appendices of Sections 1, 2, 3 and 5.** Prior to 1995, CTI programs were reported under the Computer Science Department of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. This year, the *Fact File* provides a five-year enrollment and demographic profile of CTI majors from Fall 1993 through Fall 1997.
 - ◆ Undergraduate CTI programs include Computer Science and Human Computer Interaction degree program and the following certificate programs through the Institute for Professional Development: C++ Programming, Computer Career Program, Java Development Program, Local Area Networks, Telecommunications Program, Web Developer and Windows Software Development.
 - ◆ Graduate CTI programs include degrees in Computer Science, Human Computer Interaction, Information Systems, Management Information Systems, Software Engineering and Telecommunications.
 2. **Mandated changes in accounting standards resulted in permanent changes in the format and content of the university audited financial statements and several tables in Section 6.** Please see the preface of Section 6 for more details.
 3. **Faculty headcounts reported in the *Fact File* may not match headcounts reported in the Academic Information System report.** Full-time faculty headcounts reported in the *Fact File* are obtained at the beginning of the academic year. The Academic Information System summarizes headcounts at the close of the academic year. This time differential in data collection accounts for any headcount discrepancies between sources.
 4. **New, Discontinued and Modified Degree Programs.** Below is a list of changes, stratified by college, in the degree and certificate programs offered at DePaul.
 - ◆ Commerce. *Management & Financial Strategy* graduate program was added.
 - ◆ CTI. The *Java Development* certificate program was added. The *Executive Computer Program* and *Client Server Certificate* were discontinued.
 - ◆ Education. Undergraduate *Secondary Education Geography* was added.
 - ◆ Law. *Juris Doctor PT Day* program was added.
 - ◆ LA&S. *Public Policy (BA)*, *Catholic Studies (BA)*, *General Psychology (MS)*, a *Certificate in Graduate Psychology of Organizations & Leadership* were added.

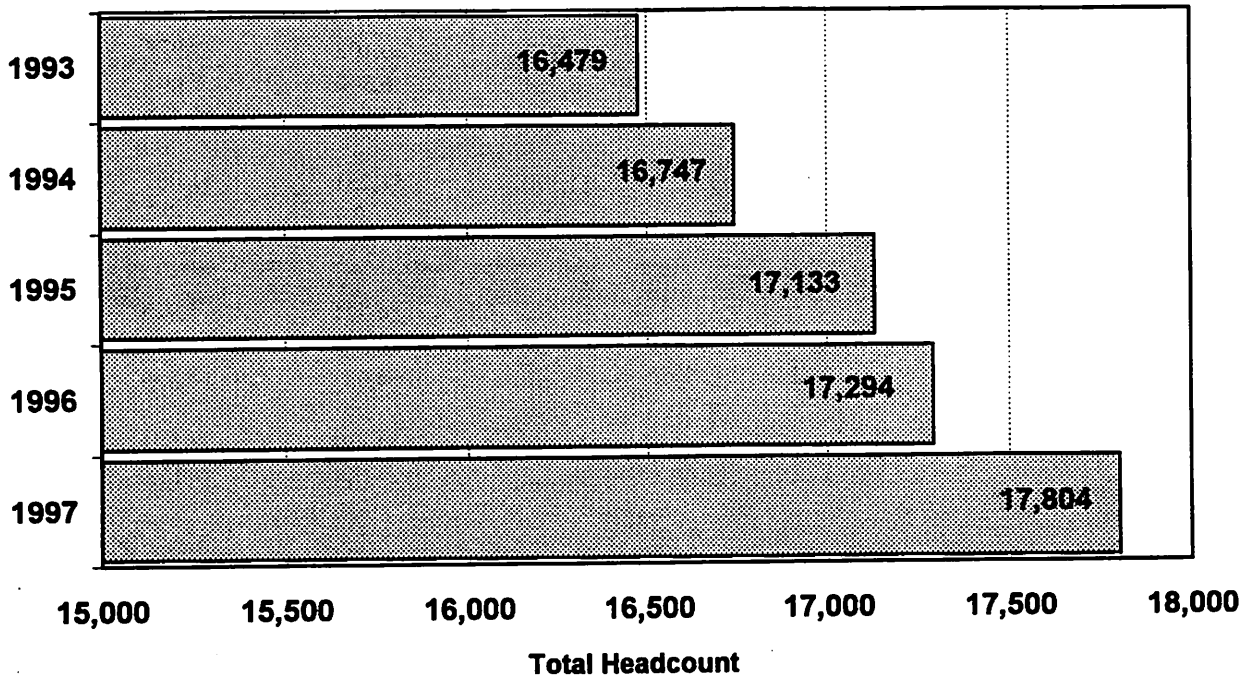

Percent Growth in Headcount

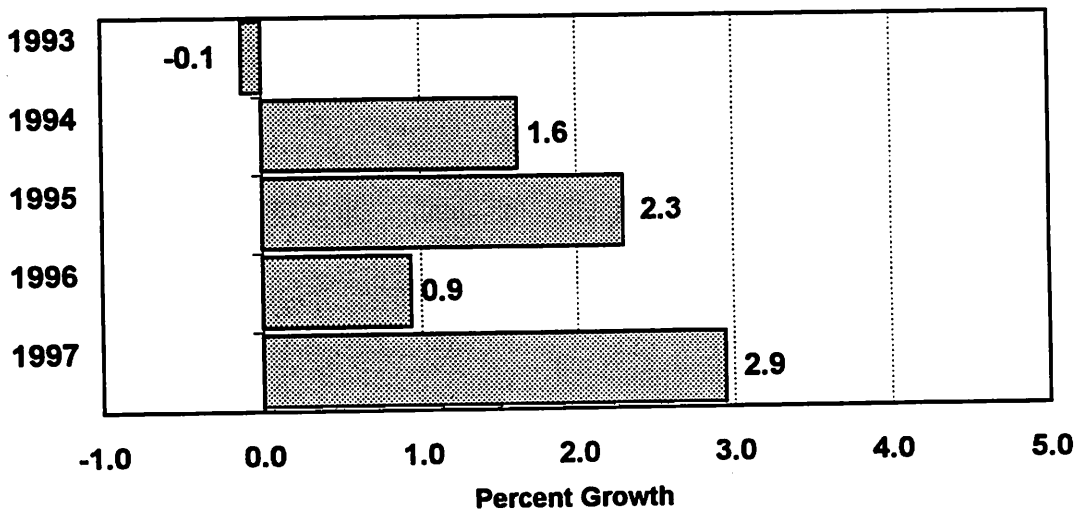

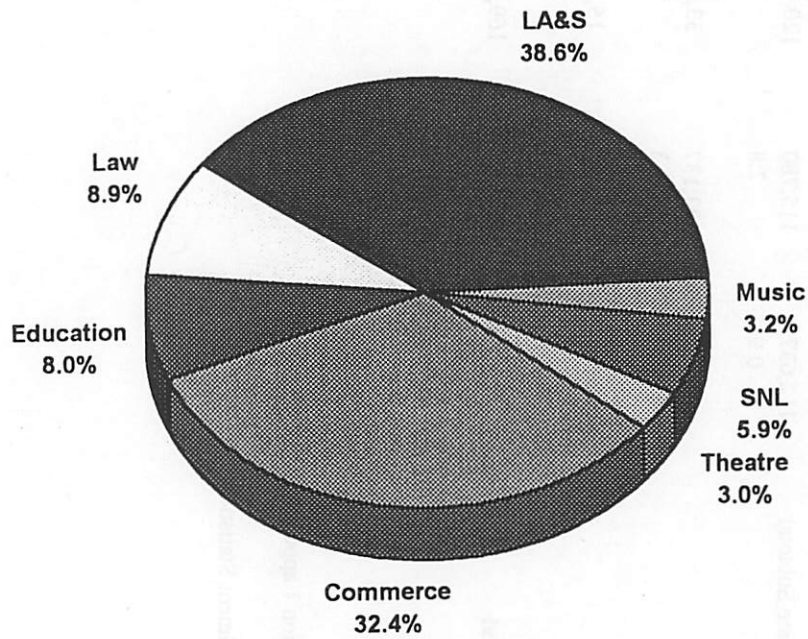

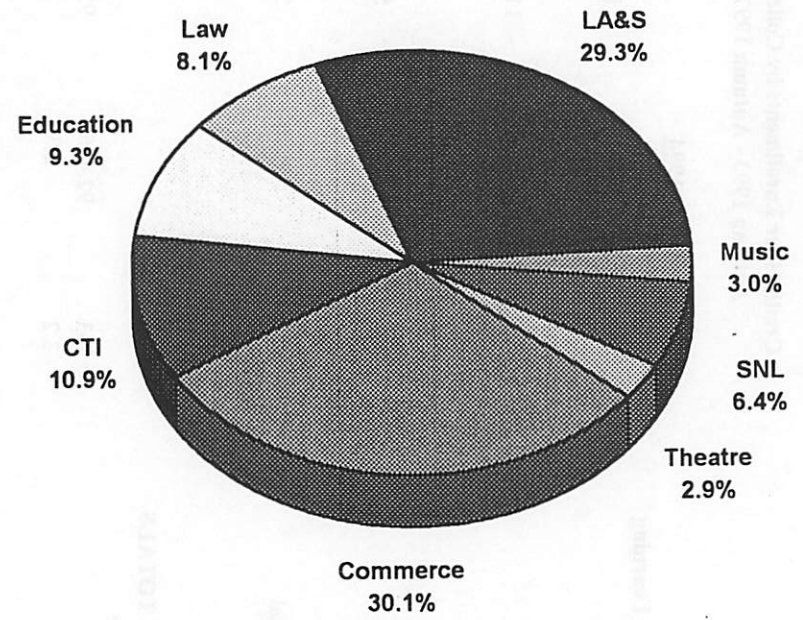

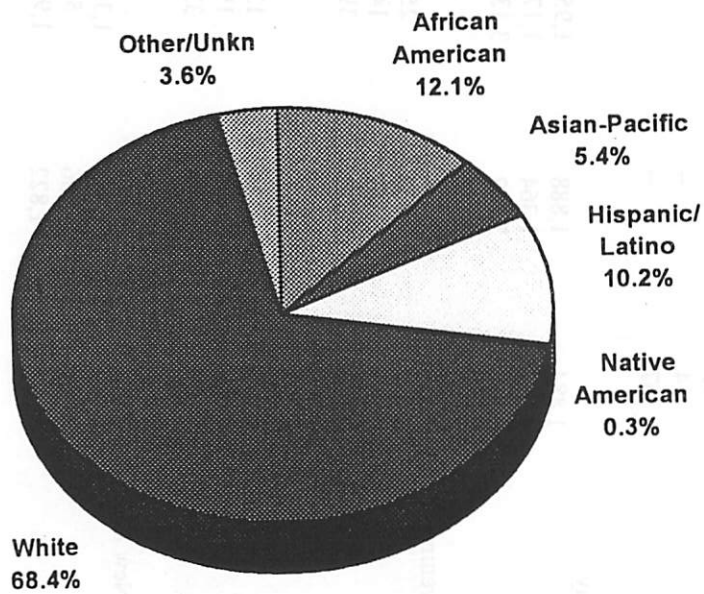

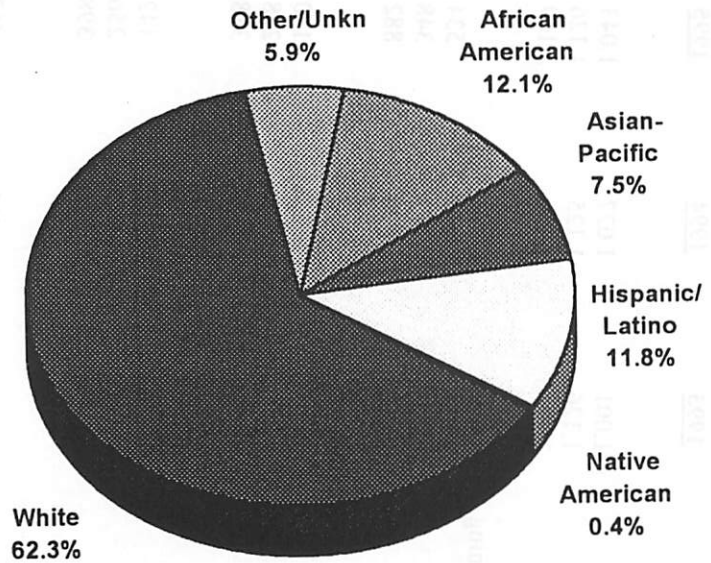

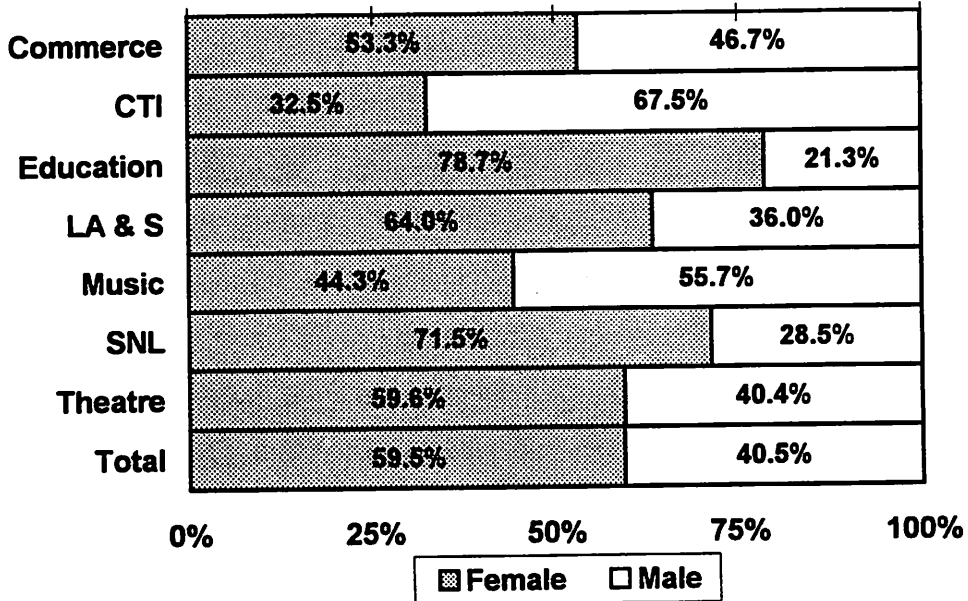

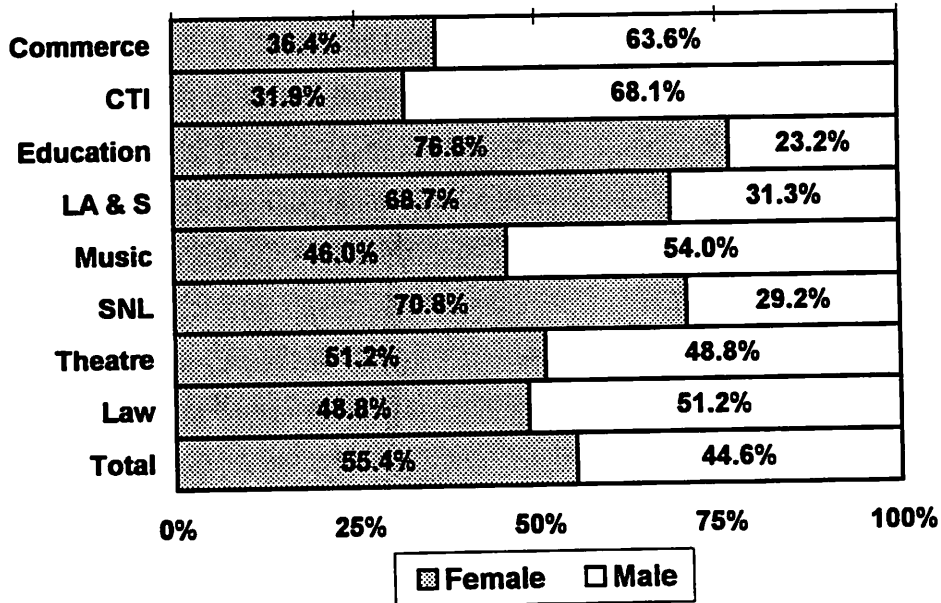

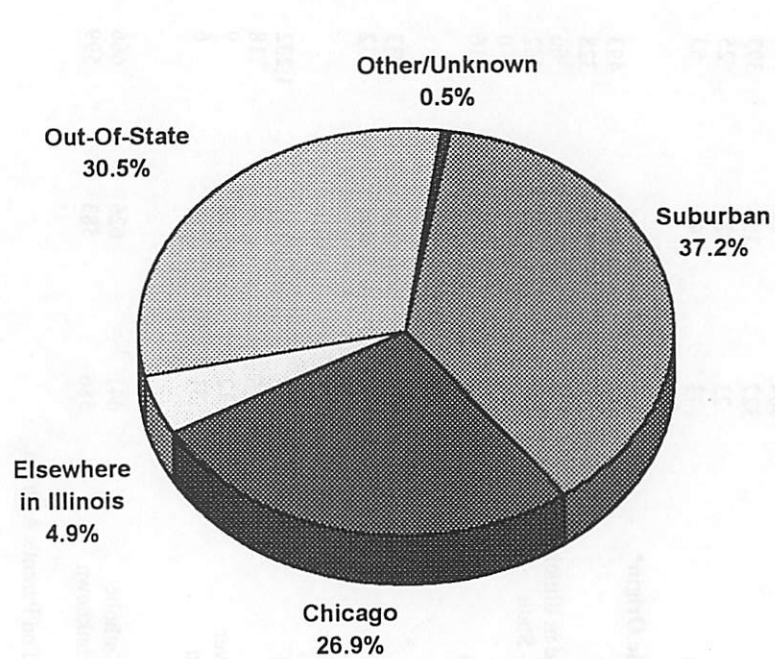

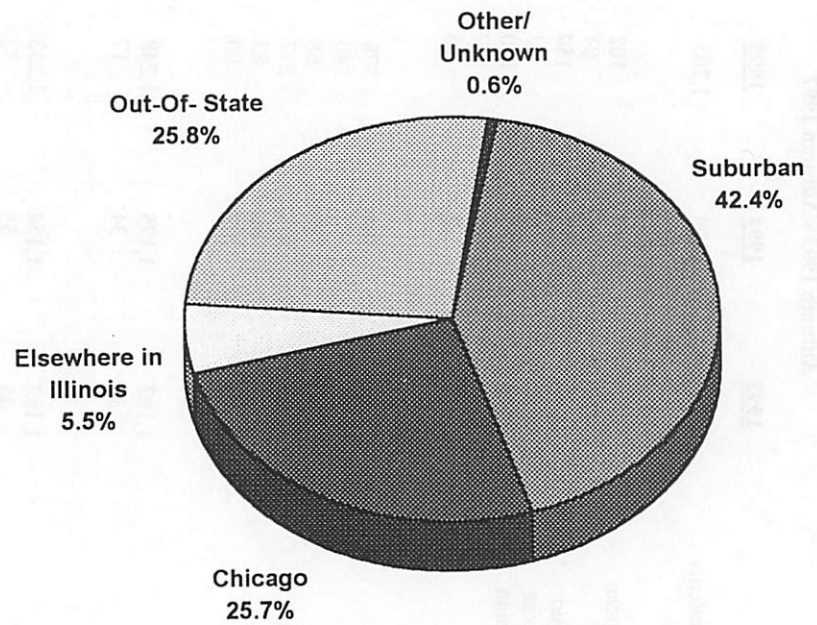

Autumn 1993 and Autumn 1997

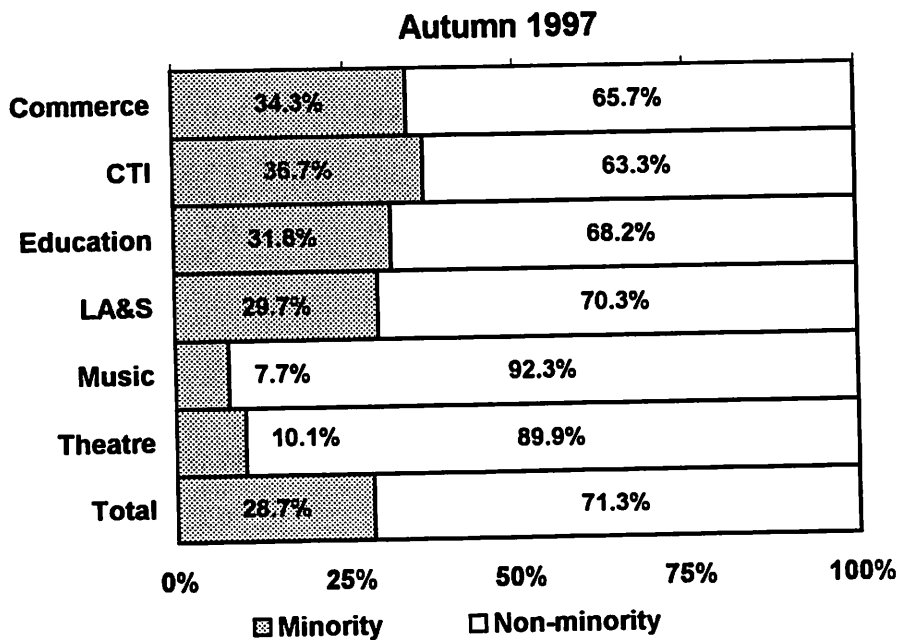
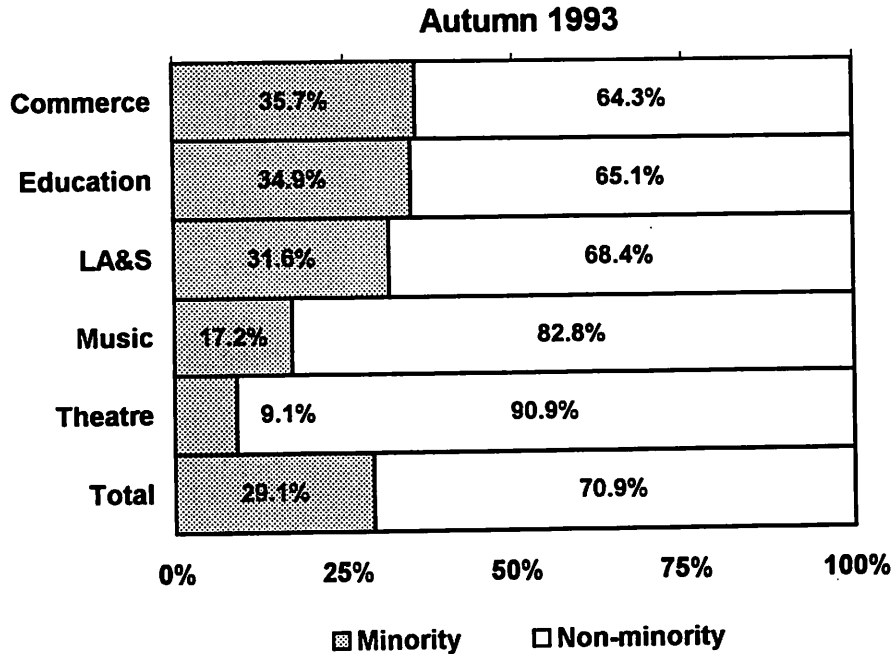

Autumn 1993 and Autumn 1997

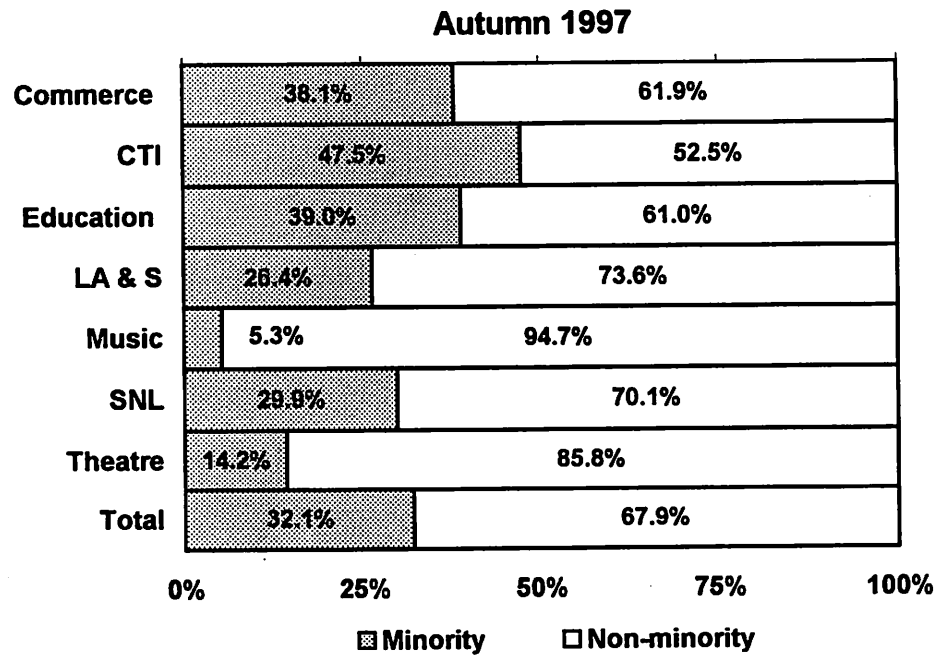
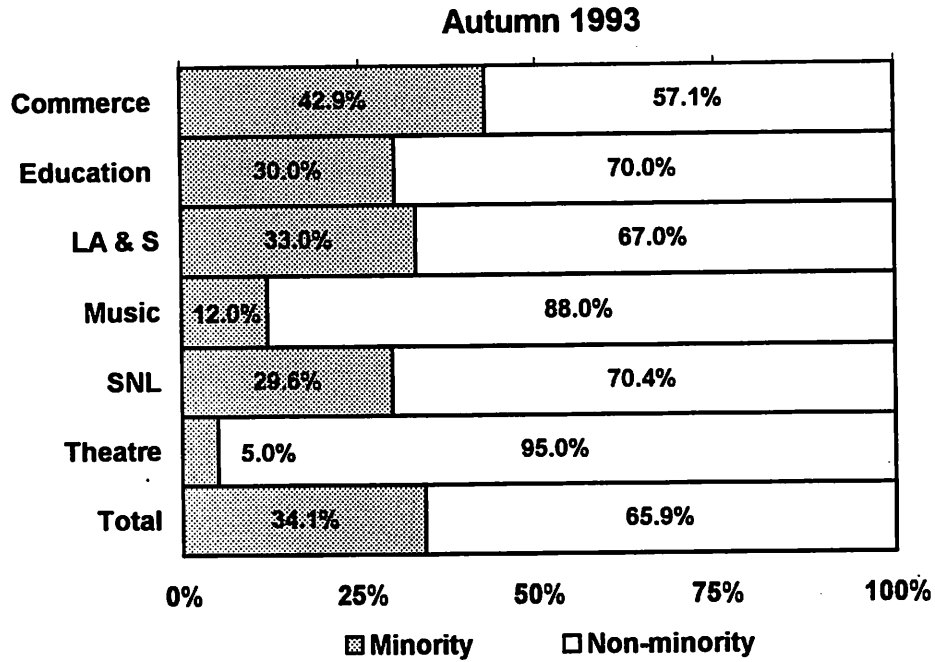

Preface to Section 6: The Adoption of New Accounting Standards

The university adopted the provisions of the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 116, *Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made*; No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*, and No. 124, *Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations*, during the year ended June 30, 1996. The university applied SFAS Nos. 116, 117 and 124 retroactively to July 1, 1995. SFAS No. 116 requires an organization to recognize as revenue contributions, including unconditional promises to give (i.e., pledges), when received. SFAS No. 117 establishes standards for general-purpose external financial statements issued by not-for-profit organizations. It requires that the net assets and changes therein be classified into three categories: unrestricted, temporarily unrestricted, and permanently restricted. This classification of categories is based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. SFAS No. 124 requires that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be reported at fair value with gains and losses included in a statement of activities. **Due to these changes, the financial statements for fiscal 1995/96 and 1996/97 may not be readily comparable to previous financial statements.** As a result, Tables 6-2, 6-3, and 6-4 were modified and the table containing annual endowment and giving growth information was removed to reflect the changes in the university's financial statements. To review historical financial data in these categories, please refer to previous versions of the *Fact File*.

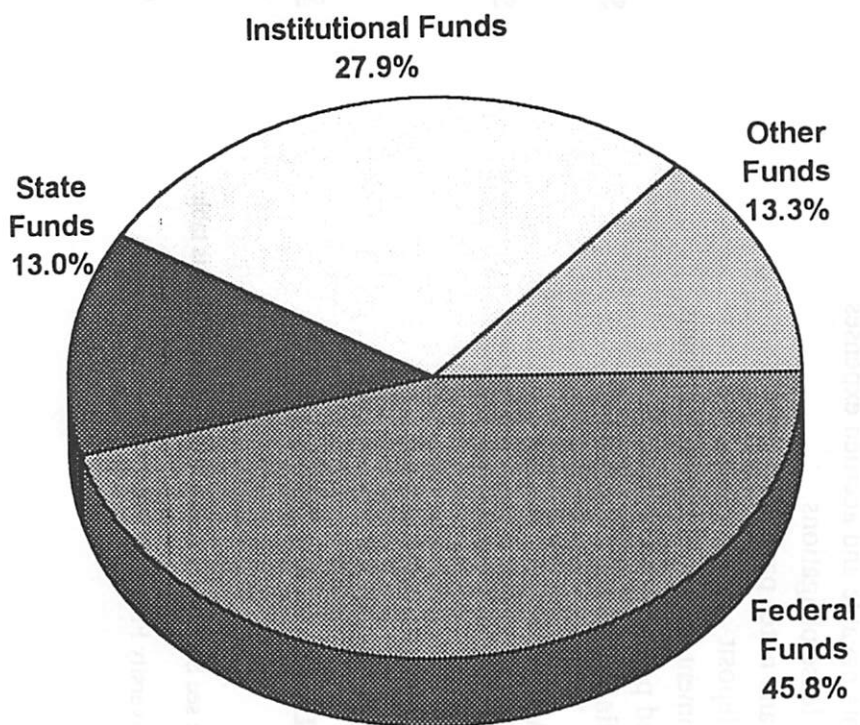

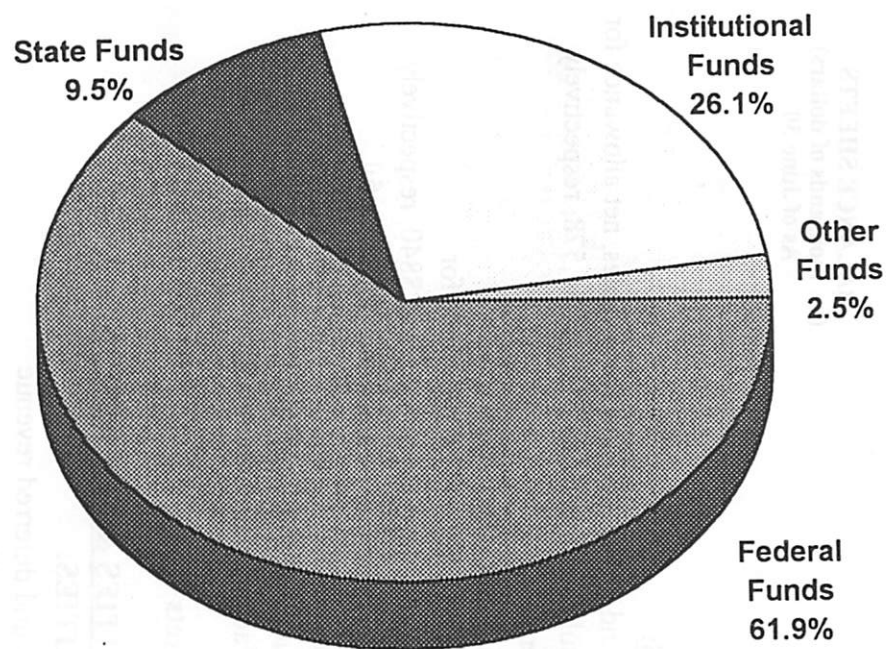

Autumn 1993 and Autumn 1997

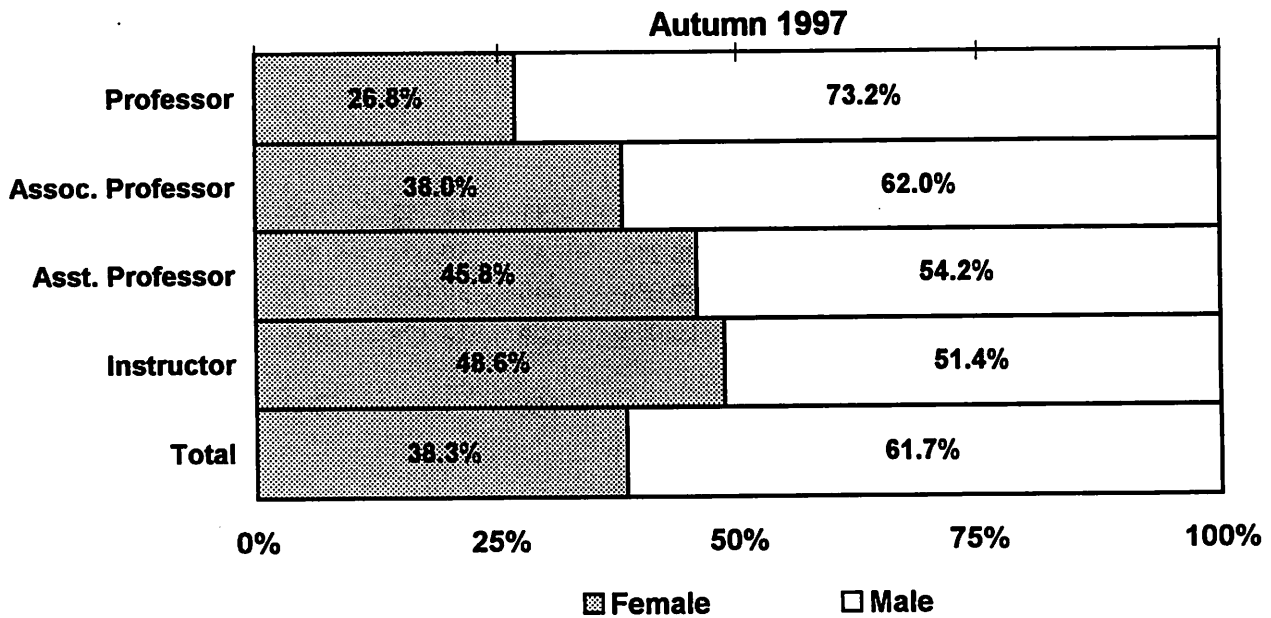
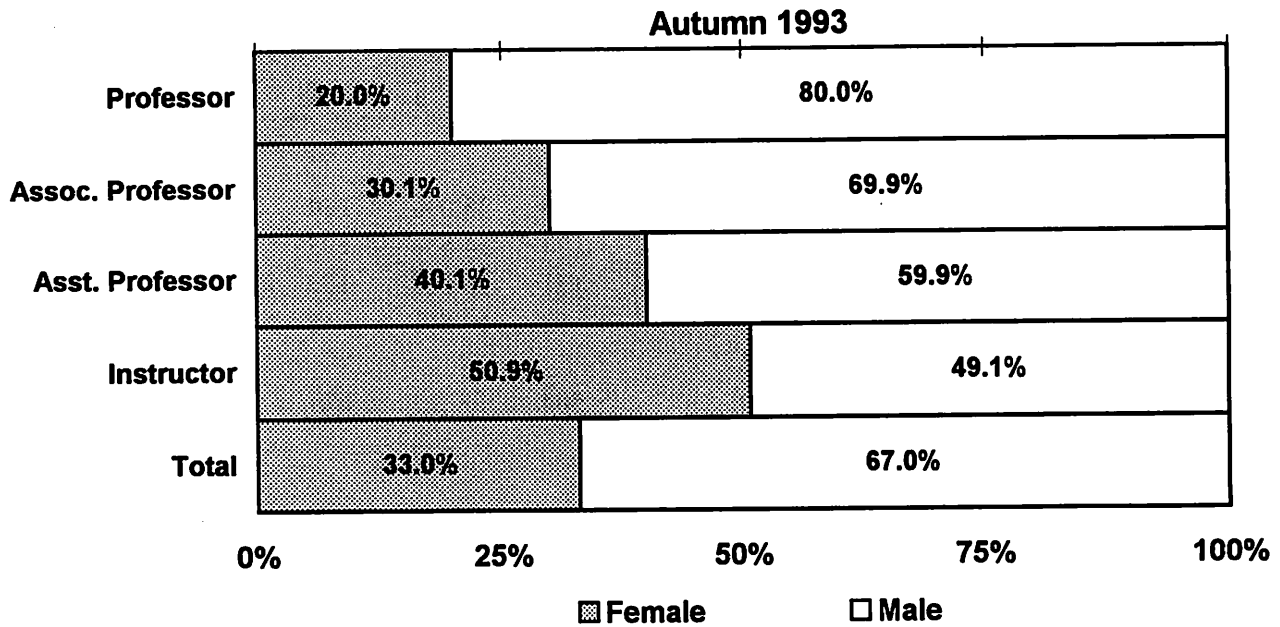

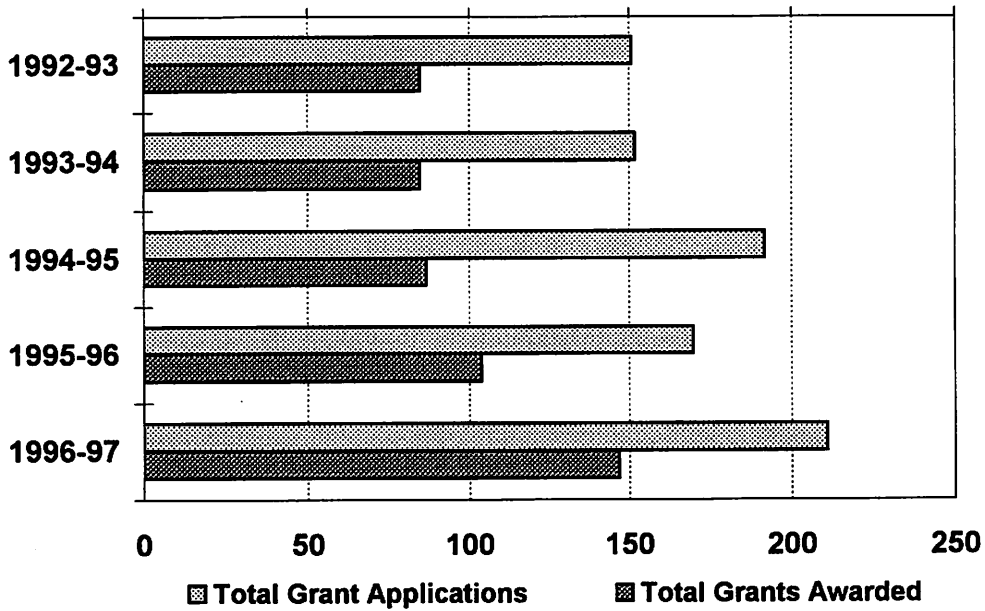

Agency Funding (In Millions)

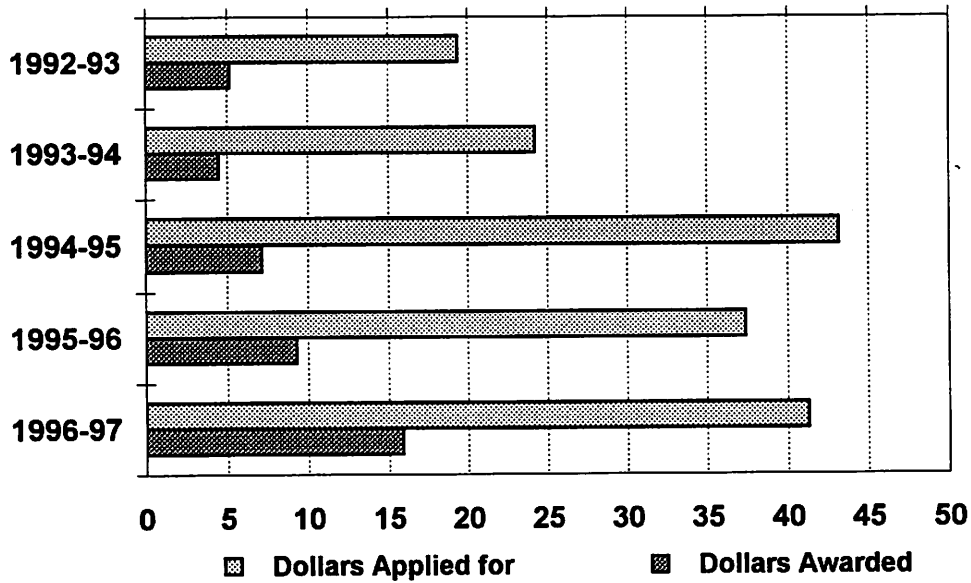

Section 9 Preface: Understanding Attrition and Graduation Rates

Attrition

- Includes only first-time full-time freshmen for each entering fall term.
- Attrition students are those who did not enroll, full-time or part-time, for any of the three non-Summer quarters during their cohort's second year.
- Rates were computed for first-year attrition *only*.

Graduation Rates

- New freshmen include only first-time freshmen entering during the Fall term.
- Transfer equivalents were assigned a cohort year according to the class level at which they entered.
- "Graduated" includes students who received a bachelor degree by the end of a given academic year.
- "Still Attending" includes students enrolled at DePaul for any of the three regular terms during the academic year following a given academic year.
- "Inactive Passing" includes students who were not enrolled full-time or part-time for any of the three regular terms during the academic year following a given academic year and having a GPA **above** 2.0.
- "Inactive Not Passing" includes students who were not enrolled full-time or part-time for any of the three regular terms during the academic year following a given academic year and having a GPA **below** 2.0.
