

Preface

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1. **Historical data concerning the School of Computer Science, Telecommunications and Information Systems (CTI) are reported in the appendices of Sections 1, 2, 3 and 5.** Prior to 1995, CTI programs were listed under the Computer Science Department of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. This year, the *Fact File* provides a five-year enrollment and demographic profile of CTI majors from Fall 1994 through Fall 1998.
 - ◆ Undergraduate CTI programs include degrees in Computing (SNL/CTI), Computer Science, Human Computer Interaction, and Information Systems. The following certificate programs are available through the Institute for Professional Development: C++ Programming, Computer Career Program, Java Development Program, Local Area Networks, Telecommunications Program, Web Developer and Windows Software Development.
 - ◆ Graduate CTI programs include degrees in Computer Science (Masters and Doctorate), Human Computer Interaction, Information Systems, Management Information Systems, Software Engineering and Telecommunications.
 2. **Mandated changes in accounting standards resulted in permanent changes in the format and content of the university audited financial statements and several tables in Section 6.** Please see the preface of Section 6 for more details.
 3. **Faculty headcounts reported in the *Fact File* may not match headcounts reported in the Integrated Academic Information System report.** Full-time faculty headcounts reported in the *Fact File* are obtained at the beginning of the academic year. The Academic Information System summarizes headcounts at the close of the academic year. This time differential in data collection accounts for any headcount discrepancies between sources.
 4. **New, Discontinued and Modified Degree Programs.** Listed below are changes (stratified by college) in degree and certificate programs offered at DePaul.
 - ◆ Commerce - Graduate. *Financial Management & Control (MBA) and Leadership & Change Management (MBA) were added.*
 - ◆ CTI. *Information Systems (BS), Distributed Systems (MS) and a combined SNL/CTI program in Computing (BA) were added.*
 - ◆ Education - Graduate. *Effective Winter 97/98 a Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) will be awarded in the following programs: Educational Leadership and Curriculum Studies. An MA or M.Ed. are now available in Teaching and Learning: Early Childhood.*
 - ◆ LA&S. *Applied Statistics (MS) and Certificate in Applied Statistics, Chemistry (BA), and Japanese Studies (BA) were added. Additionally, an accelerated BA or BS program in Psychology is available with graduate admission upon successful completion of the program.*

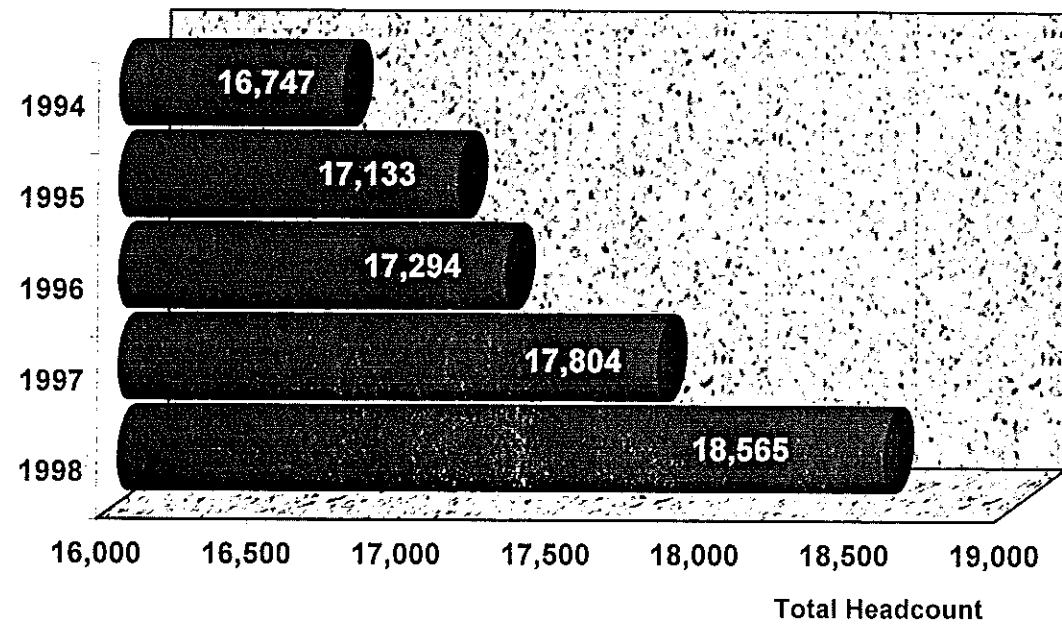

Percent Growth in Headcount

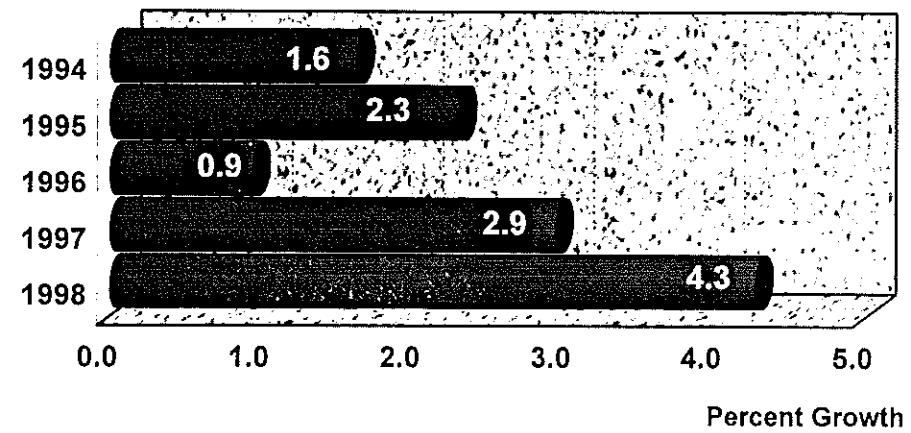

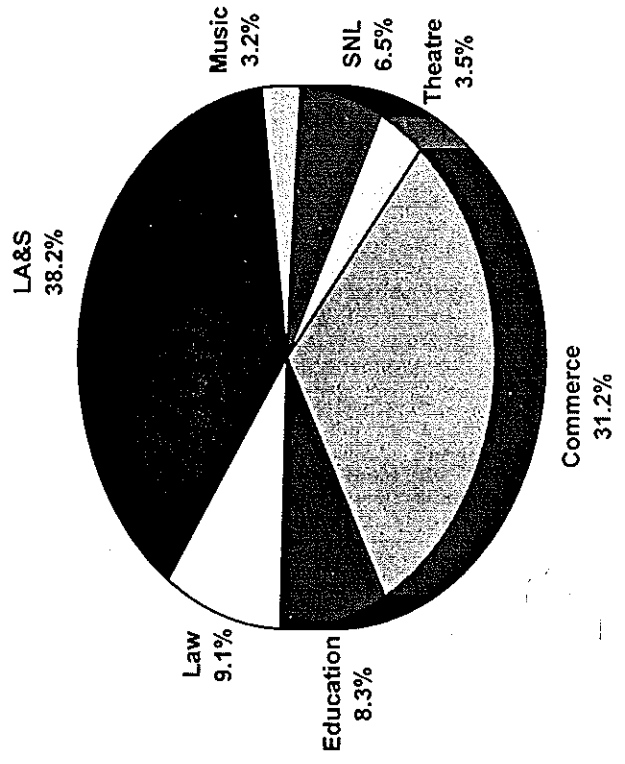

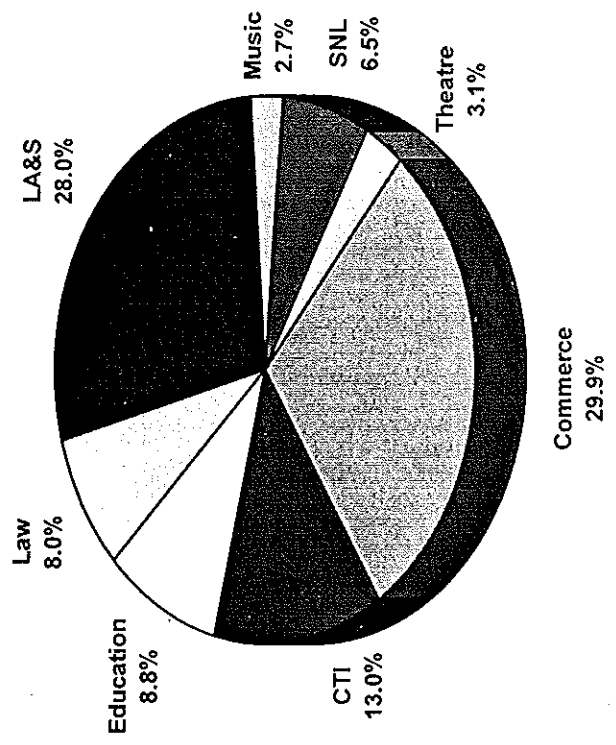

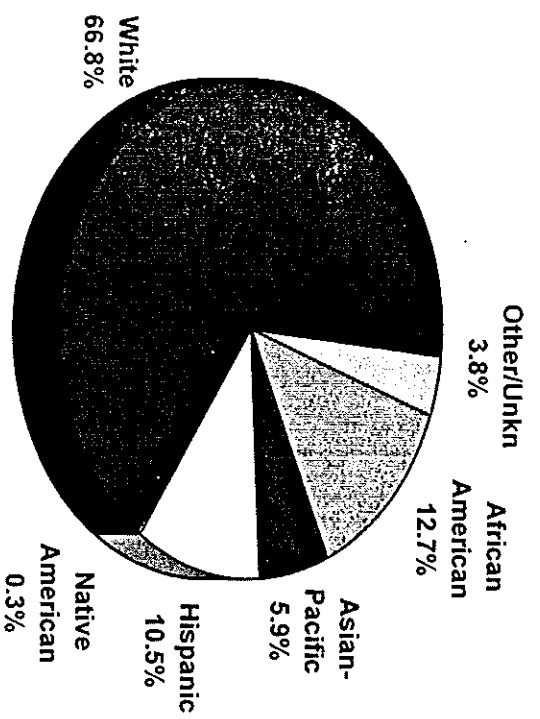

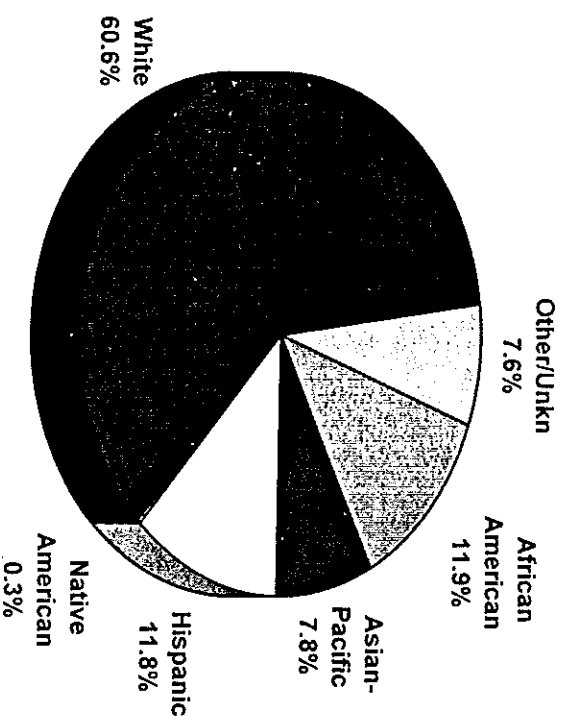

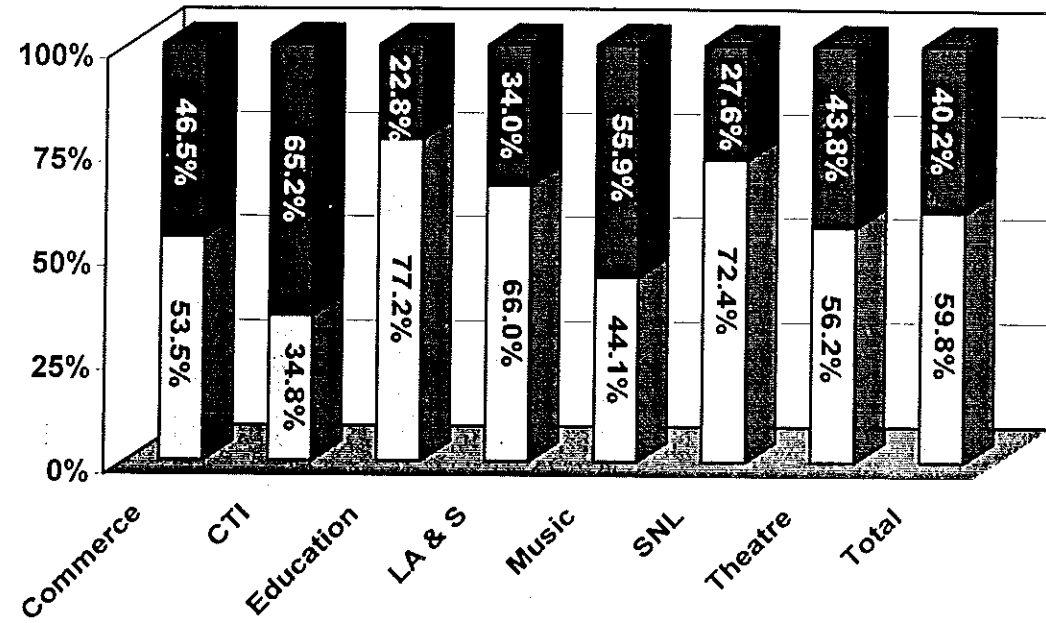

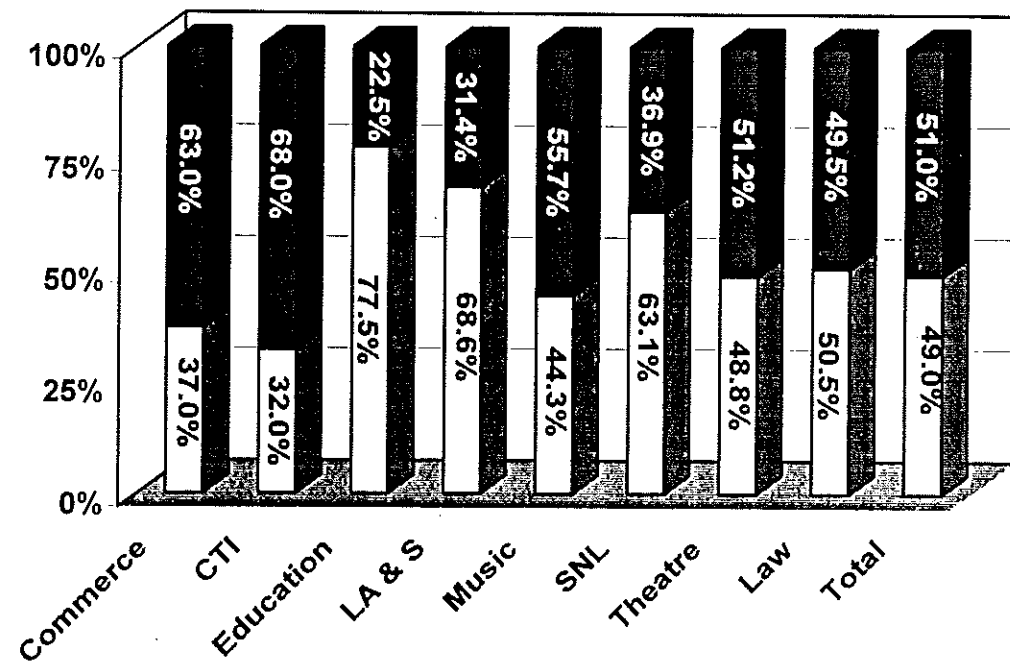

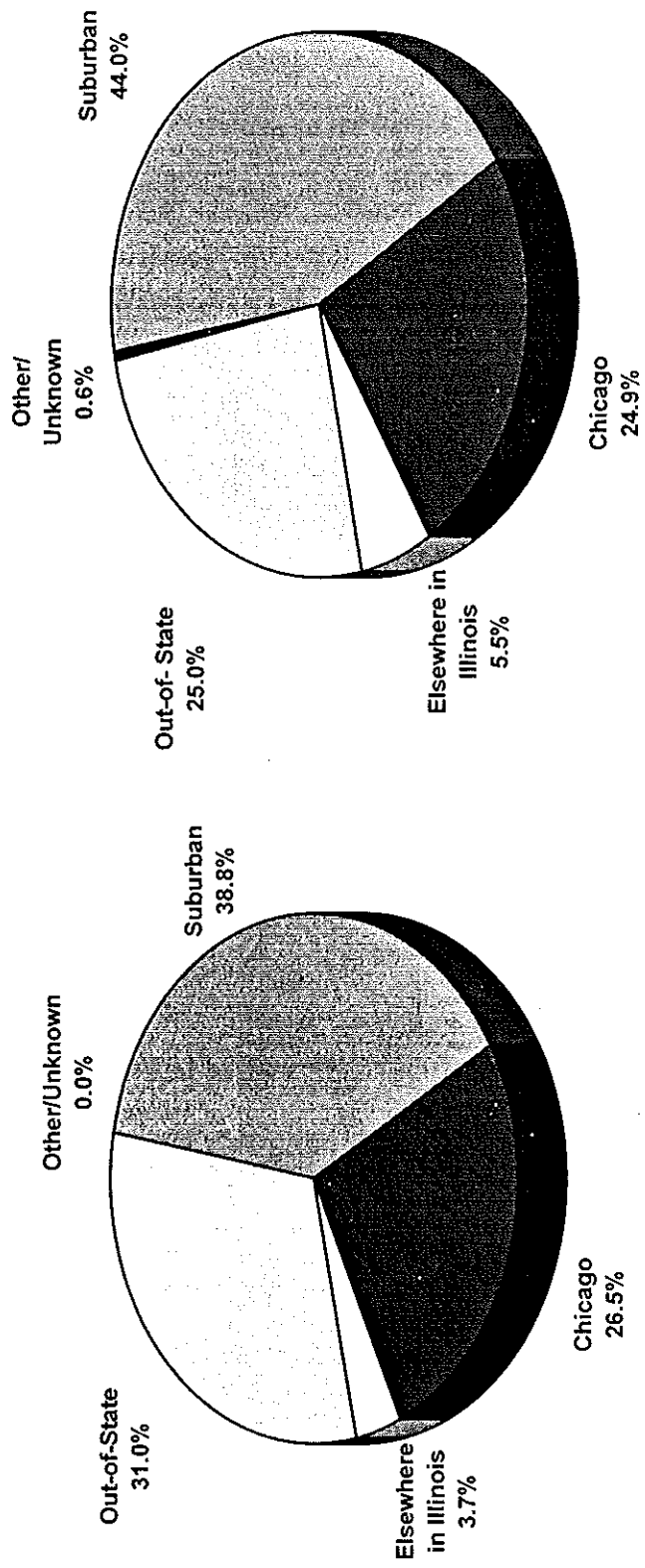

 Autumn 1994 and Autumn 1998

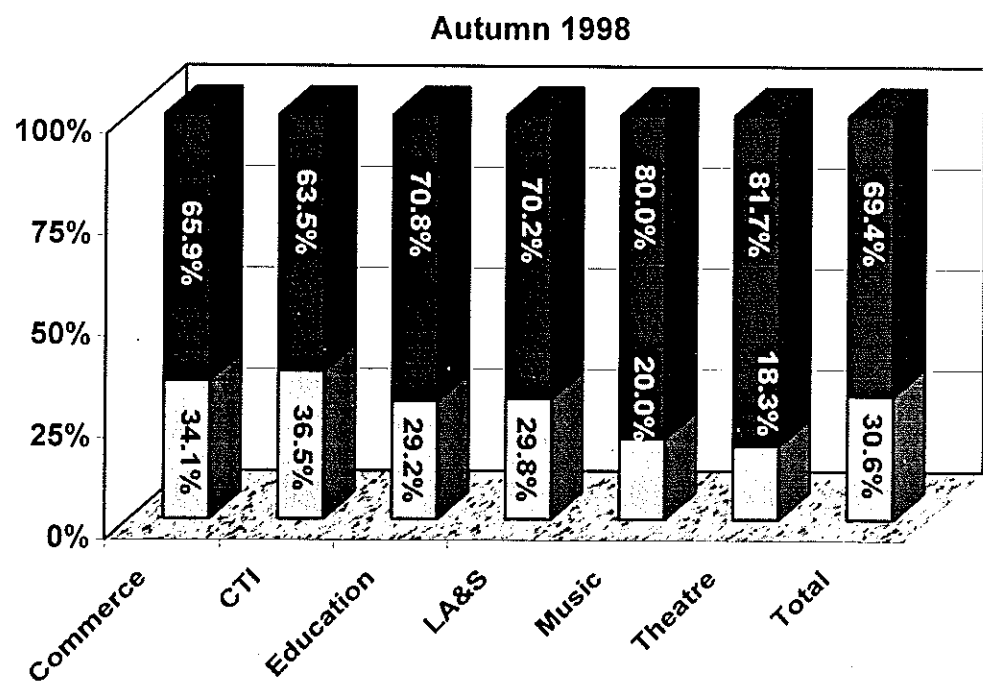
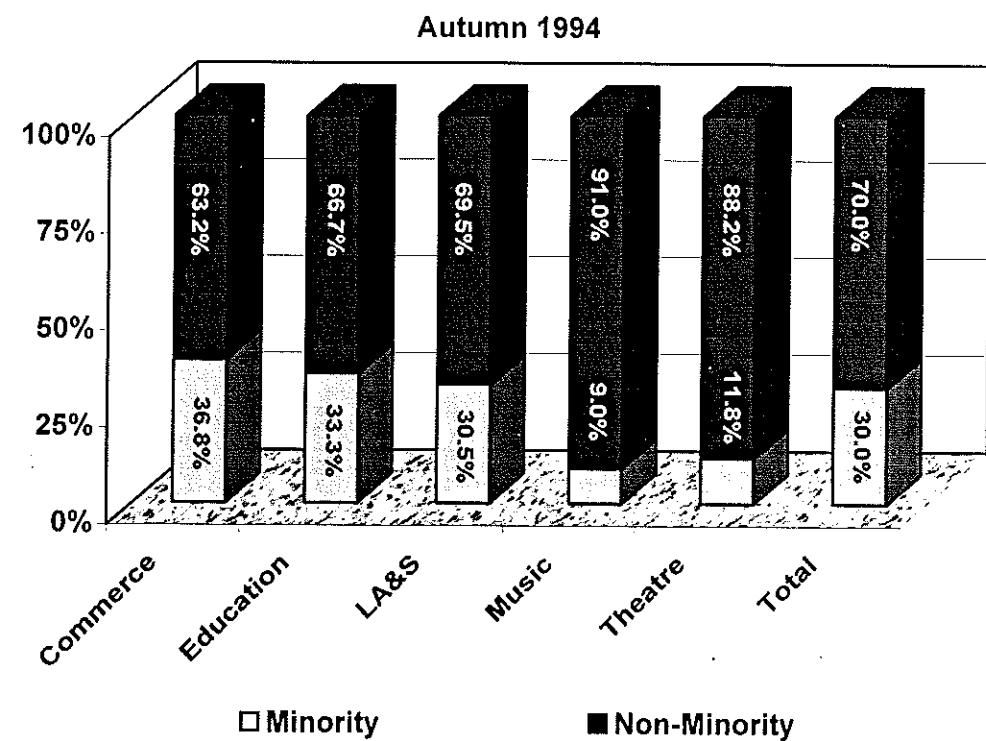

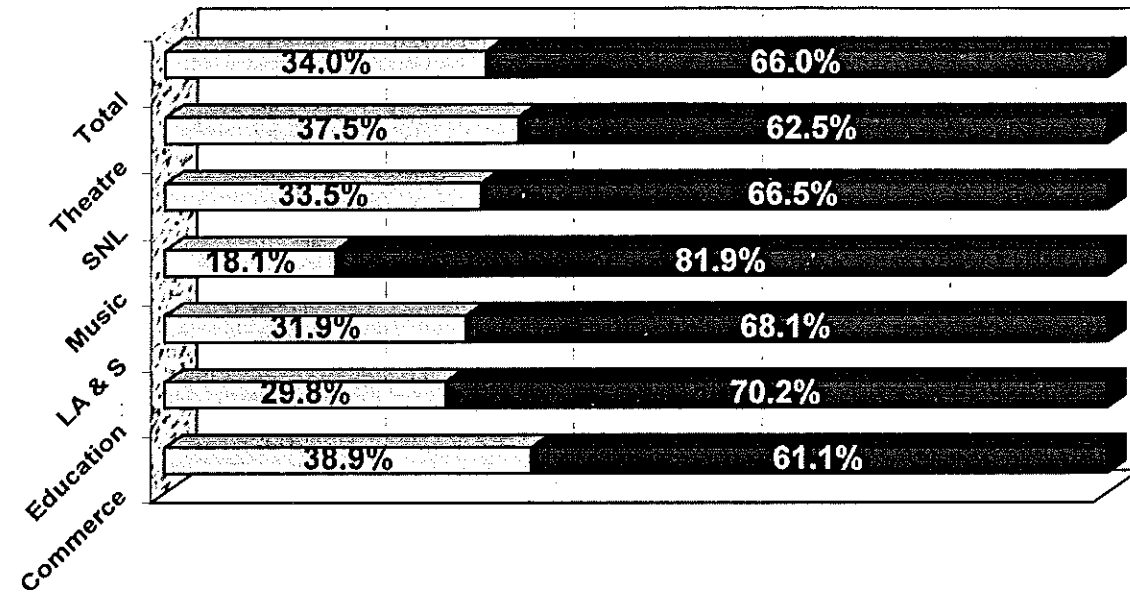

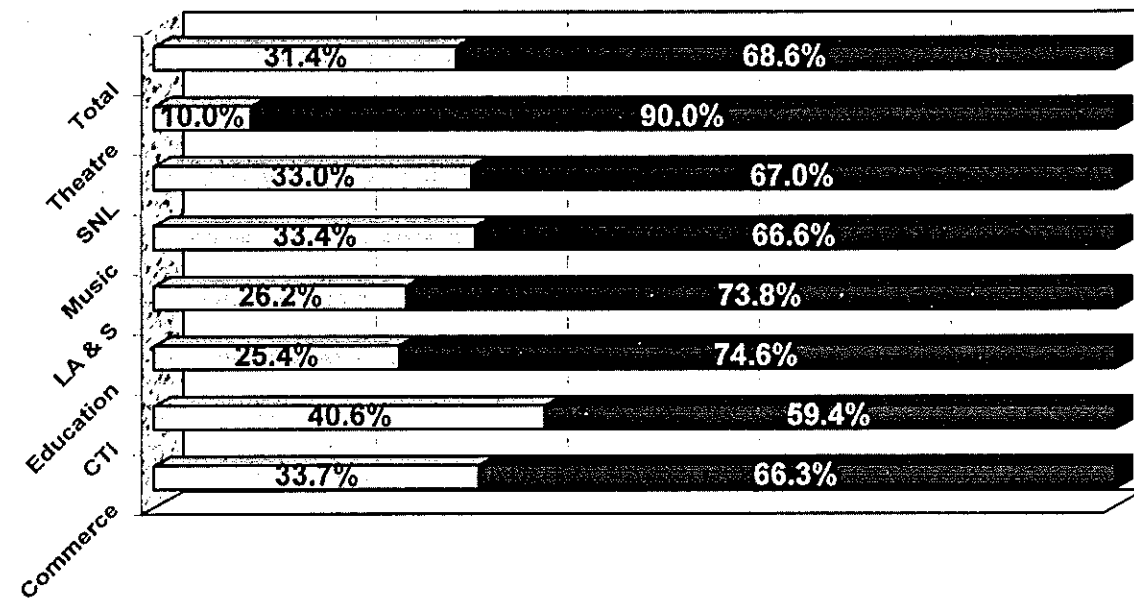

Preface to Section 6: The Adoption of New Accounting Standards

The university adopted the provisions of the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 116, *Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made*; No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*, and No. 124, *Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations*, during the year ended June 30, 1996. The university applied SFAS Nos. 116, 117 and 124 retroactively to July 1, 1995. SFAS No. 116 requires an organization to recognize as revenue contributions, including unconditional promises to give (i.e., pledges), when received. SFAS No. 117 establishes standards for general-purpose external financial statements issued by not-for-profit organizations. It requires that the net assets and changes therein be classified into three categories: unrestricted, temporarily unrestricted, and permanently restricted. This classification of categories is based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. SFAS No. 124 requires that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be reported at fair value with gains and losses included in a statement of activities. **Due to these changes, the financial statements starting from fiscal year 1995/96 may not be readily comparable to previous financial statements.** As a result, Tables 6-2, 6-3, and 6-4 were modified and the table containing annual endowment and giving growth information was removed to reflect the changes in the university's financial statements. To review historical financial data in these categories, please refer to previous versions of the *Fact File*.

Fiscal Year 1994 and Fiscal Year 1998

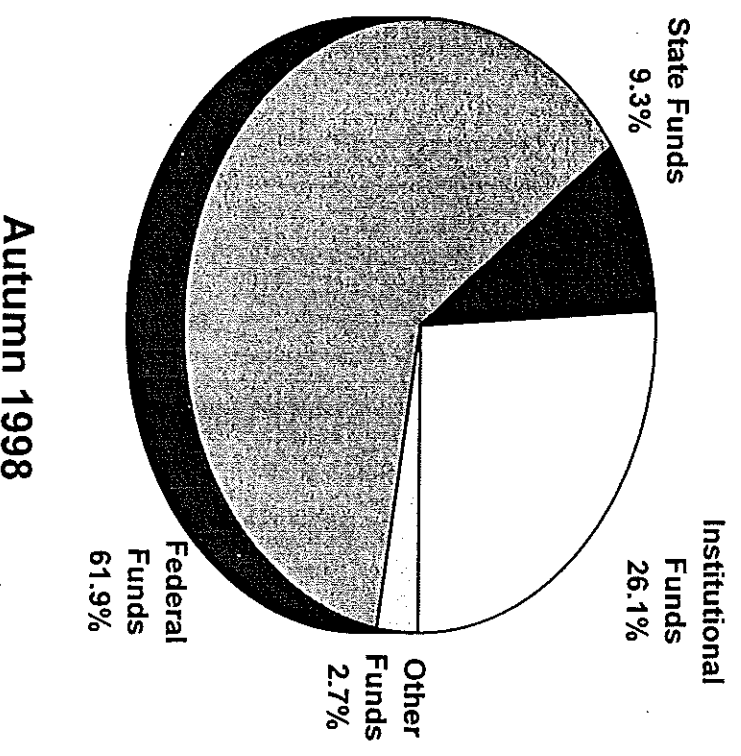
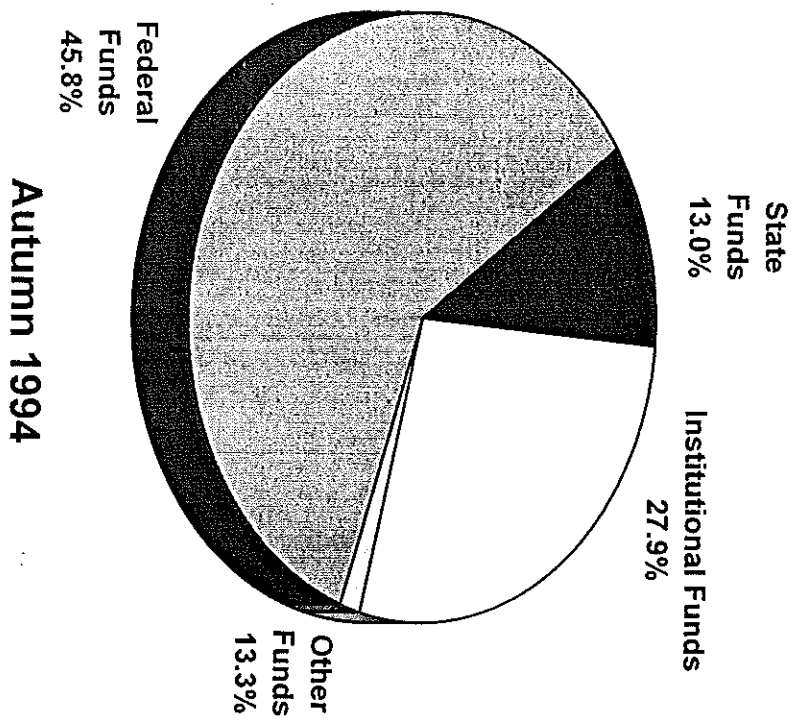

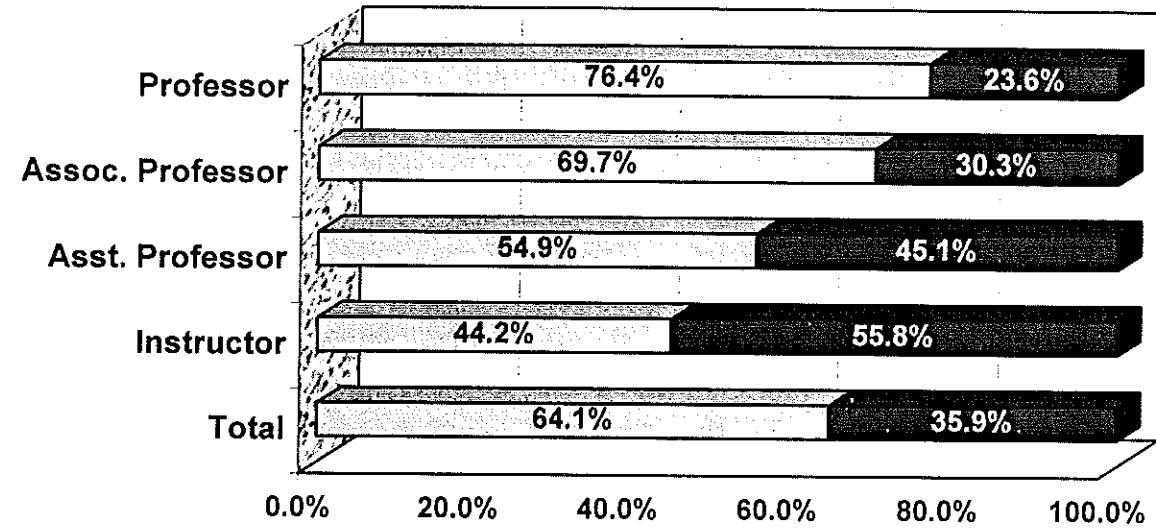

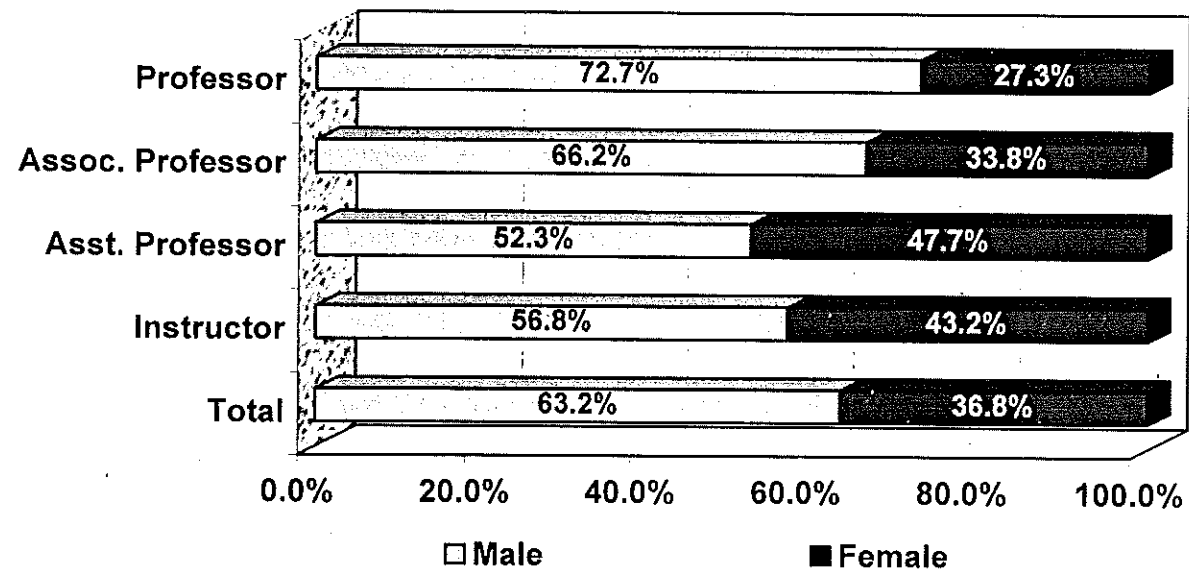

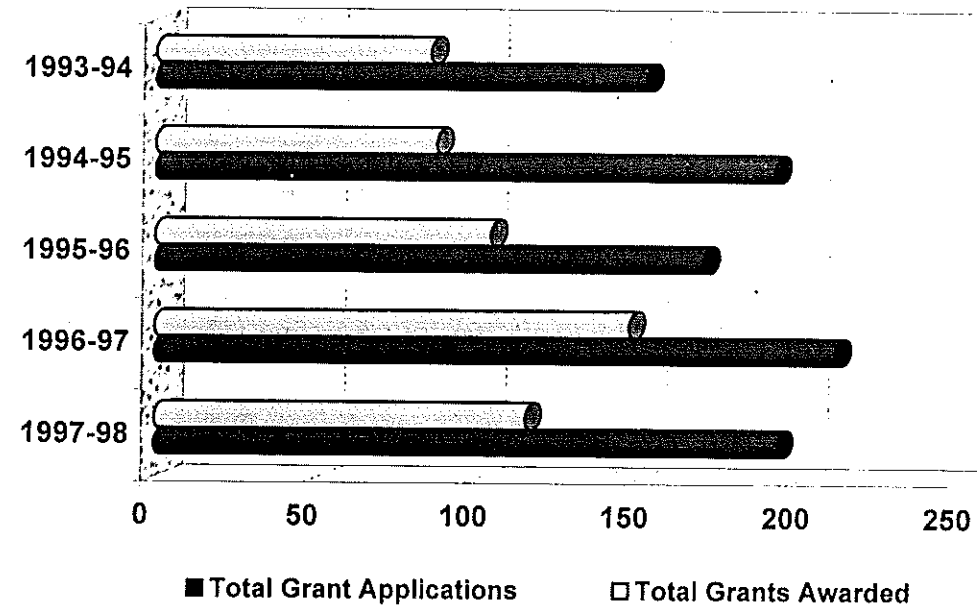

Agency Funding (In Millions)

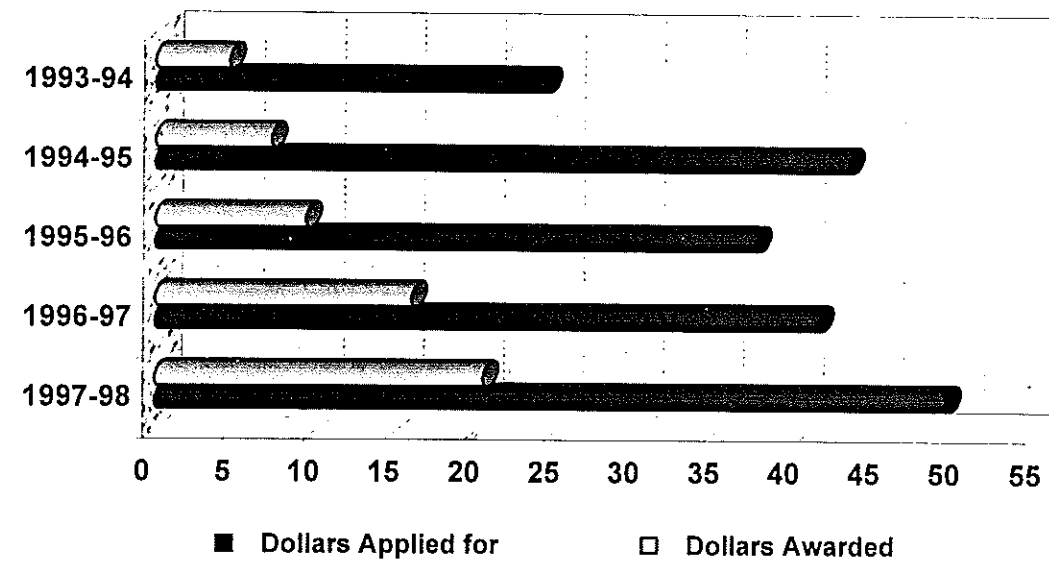

Section 9 Preface:
Understanding Retention and Graduation Rates

Retention and graduation rates reflected the progress of freshmen cohorts through DePaul. A freshmen cohort consisted of degree-seeking students who entered DePaul as full-time, first-time freshmen during the Fall quarter of a given academic year. For example, the full-time, first-time freshmen who entered DePaul during the Fall quarter of 1993 numbered 1,180 (Table 9-1), while those who entered during the Fall quarter of 1988 numbered 1,039 (Table 9-2).

Retention rates represented the proportion of the original cohort that enrolled – though not necessarily full-time – during a subsequent Fall quarter. Example (Table 9-1): of the 1,180 freshmen in the 1993 cohort, 81.6% were enrolled during the Fall quarter one year later, while 70.3% were enrolled during the Fall quarter two years later.

Graduation rates represented the proportion of a given freshmen cohort that graduated from DePaul by the end of a specific academic year. Example (Table 9-2): of the 1,039 new freshmen in the 1988 cohort, 51.1% graduated by the end of their fifth academic year, while 54.5% graduated by the end of their sixth academic year.

Computing rates with a Fall-to-Fall method conforms to more widely accepted reporting standards. Historical rates listed in this section were re-computed to reflect this method and consequently differed from those reported in previous years. In previous years, the reported rates included those students who enrolled during any of the non-Summer quarters. Enrollments during the Winter and Spring quarters were *not* included in the current rate calculations.
