2010-14 Graduate Summer Enrollment Trends at Select Regional Peers

Graduate summer enrollment at DePaul decreased 20.5 percent from 2010 to 2014 (excluding Law). This decline has been steady, with an average annual decrease of 5.6 percent over that time.

On average, graduate summer enrollment at other institutions has declined by 5 percent from 2010 to 2014. Of the seven institutions studied, five decreased in enrollment, three with a decline greater than 15 percent. (This is a list of regional peer institutions with readily available data and


does not represent DePaul's competitive set, which varies by program at the graduate level.)

DePaul had the largest decrease in enrollment from 2010 to 2014 at 20.5 percent, followed by Dominican University at 20.2 percent and Illinois State University at 18.7 percent.

The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) had the largest enrollment growth from 2010 to 2014 at 5.3 percent, followed by the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) at 5.1 percent.
