2010-14 Undergraduate Summer Enrollment Trends at Select Regional Peers

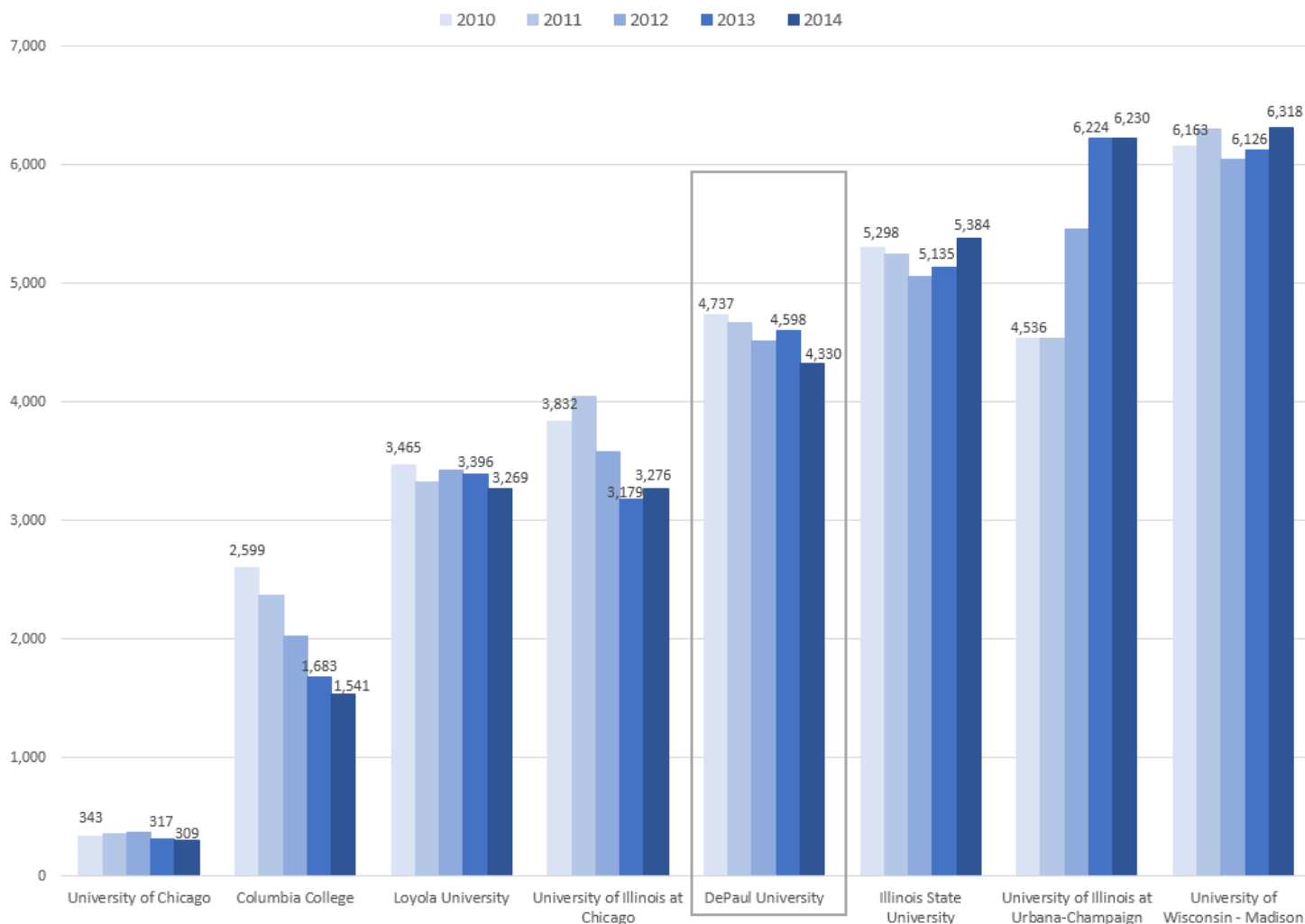
Undergraduate summer enrollment at DePaul University decreased by 8.6 percent from 2010 to 2014. Enrollment has fluctuated over the past five years with the greatest decline occurring between 2013 and 2014 at 5.8 percent.

Analyzing undergraduate summer enrollment trends at other regional peer institutions, summer enrollment has, on average, decreased by 1 percent from 2010 to 2014. Of the eight institutions studied, five declined between 2010 to 2014, all with decreases greater than 5 percent.

The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) had the largest growth from 2010 to 2014 at 37.4 percent. This is mainly attributed to a 14 percent increase from 2012 to 2013.

Summer enrollment at Columbia College had the largest decline from 2010 to 2014 at 40.7 percent, with the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) following at 14.5 percent and the University of Chicago at 9.9 percent. Loyola University's 2010 to 2014 decrease is comparable to DePaul at 5.7 percent.
