2014 Undergraduate Summer Enrollment Snapshot at Select Regional Institutions

Comparing the relative size of summer enrollment is one of the ways to evaluate summer enrollment expectations at DePaul and other regional institutions. Relative size is a ratio calculated by dividing summer 2014 enrollment by fall 2013 enrollment (the most recent academic year for which both fall and summer enrollment figures are available).

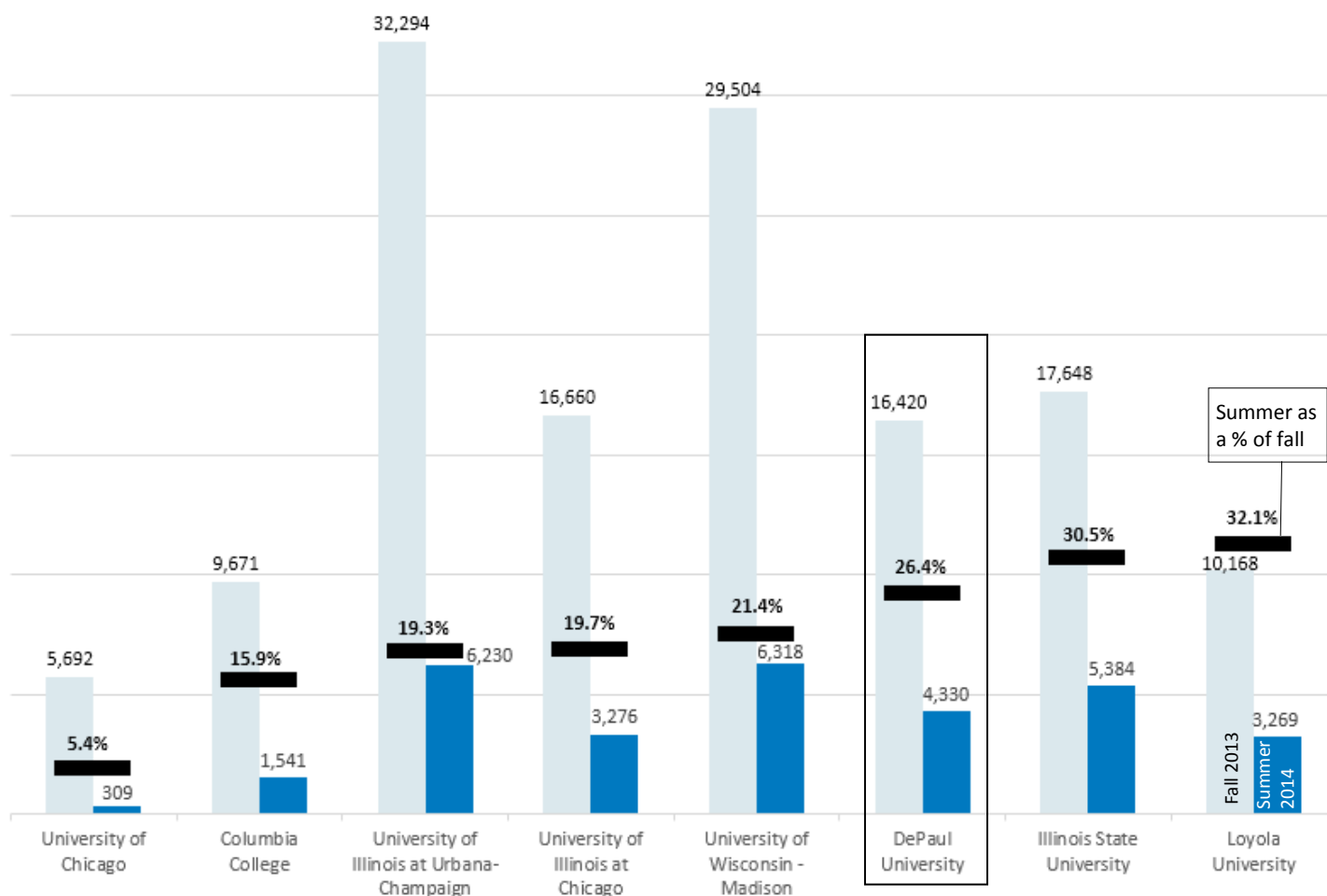
At DePaul University, 16,420 undergraduate students enrolled in the fall 2013 term while 4,330 students enrolled in summer 2014. The relative

size of DePaul's undergraduate summer enrollment is 26.4 percent compared with fall.

Analyzing undergraduate summer enrollment at other regional institutions, summer enrollment, on average, is 22.1 percent of the preceding fall term.

Loyola University has the highest ratio of undergraduate summer enrollment at 32.2 percent and the University of Chicago has the smallest ratio at 5.4 percent.
