

Undergraduate Enrollment is up 2 Percent in Summer 2013 Despite Overall Decline

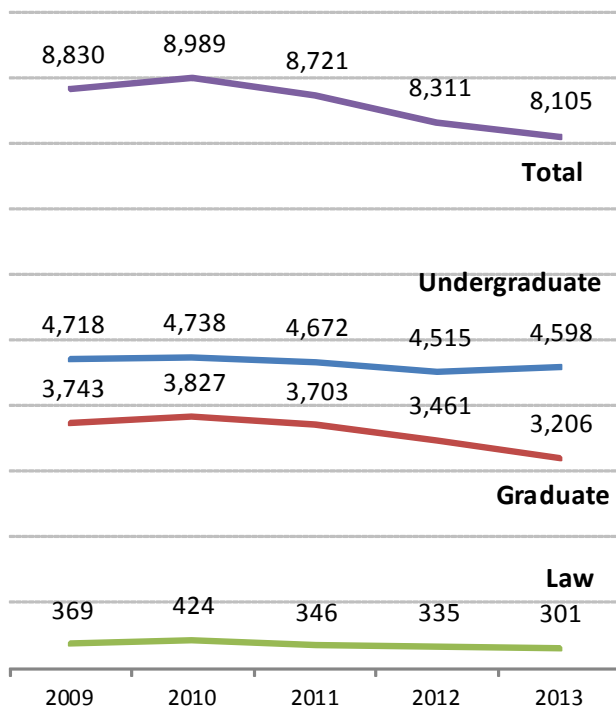
A total of 8,105 students enrolled this summer and generated 48,271 credit hours. Enrollment of BUS, CSH, CMN, Music and Theatre students were up this summer, although total enrollment was down 2 percent from last year.

While graduate and law enrollment declined by 8 percent from 2012 to 2013, undergraduate enrollment increased 2 percent and the proportion of undergraduates enrolled also increased from 54 percent to 57 percent of all enrollment. Compared to 2010, when summer enrollment peaked at 8,989 students, the 2013 mix of undergraduates by

college has changed. In 2010, 73 percent of undergraduates enrolled in BUS, SNL, and LAS. In 2013, students in these three colleges accounted for 63 percent of undergraduate enrollment.

From 2010 to 2013, the number of CSH undergraduate students grew 79 percent, making CSH the third largest college for undergraduate enrollment. Enrollment of CMN and CDM students also grew (by 25 and 17 percent, respectively). Together, these three colleges accounted for 33 percent of all undergraduate summer enrollment, compared to 23 percent in 2010.
