
International Enrollment Declined For the First Time in Eight Years

After seven consecutive years of growth, DePaul enrolled 1,467 international students on F1 and J1 student visas in fall 2017, an 8 percent decline from 2016.

Graduate and law international enrollment, which declined 6 percent in 2017, account for two-thirds of total international enrollment. This is down from 75 percent in 2007, the result of significant growth at the undergraduate level. Although undergraduate international enrollment

declined by 13 percent from 2016 to 2017, it has more than doubled since 2007.

Three percent of undergraduates and 12 percent of graduate and law students are international students. In total, international students account for 6 percent of enrollment, up from 3 percent in 2007. During the same period, total university enrollment declined by 3 percent.
