

## Graduation and Enrollment Status of DePaul's 2012 Freshman Cohort

Eighty-two percent of DePaul's 2012 freshman class graduated from college within six years, according to the most recent data from the Student Achievement Measure (SAM). Seventytwo percent graduated from DePaul and another 10% graduated from another institution.

Using data from the National Clearinghouse, SAM provides a fuller picture of student success. While the majority of students' outcomes are achieved at DePaul, 14% of the DePaul 2012 cohort had transferred to another institution within six years. Ten percent had graduated and 4% were still enrolled.

The total graduation rate increased notably from four years (66%) to five years (79%), with a smaller gain from five to six years.
