
In 2022-23, Undergraduates Took 62% of their Credit Hours in Their Home Colleges


In FY2022-23, undergraduates across DePaul's colleges generated 62% of their credit hours within their home college and the remainder in colleges across the institution. The home college proportion ranges from 93% in SCPS to 45% in COE.

Undergraduates in each college took courses in every other college, with two exceptions. LAS and CMN were the only colleges where undergraduates generated credit hours in the College of Law (180 hours total), and SCPS students generated no credit hours in TTS.

The chart on the right shows where students in each home college (on the left) take their courses (on the right). For example, DCOB students, the light blue top horizontal row, took courses in DCOB, and, following the blue lines from the top left side to the right, DCOB students also generated credit hours in CMN, CDM, COE, LAS, SOM, SCPS, CSH and TTS.

In FY2022-23, undergraduates generated 631,171 credit hours in total, a 1% increase from FY2021-22 (622,088) and the first increase in undergraduate credit hours since FY2012-13.
