Profile of 2005-06 Graduating Transfer Students

In 2005/06, a total of 2,833 undergraduates received bachelor's degrees from DePaul University. Students arriving at DePaul as transfer students accounted for 44% of these graduating seniors. A third of these students entered in a term other than fall.

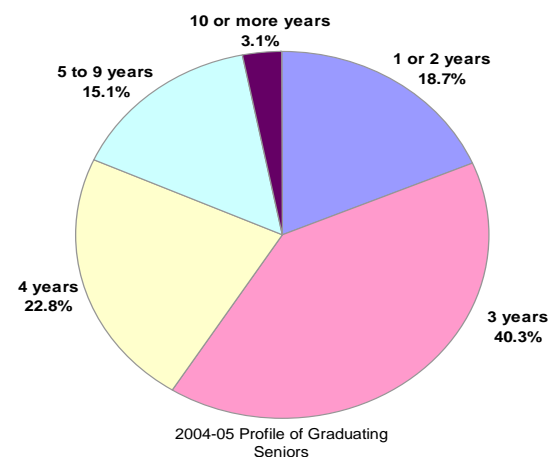
Transfer students who received degrees from DePaul were most likely to arrive from College of DuPage, Oakton Community College, or one of the City Colleges of Chicago. However, the top four community colleges and the City Colleges accounted for only 12% of all transfer graduates for these years.

Almost 60% of graduating transfers took three years or less to complete their degrees. Nearly one in five graduating transfers (18.7%) completed their degrees in two years or less and another 40.3% completed their degrees in three years. The remaining 41.0% took at least 4 years to complete their degrees.

Two in three of all graduate transfers attended both full-time and part-time at points in their enrollment at DePaul. Twenty-one percent of these graduating transfers were always enrolled full-time, and another 12% were always enrolled part-time.
