## Proportion of Minority Undergraduates at Large Catholic Four-Year Institutions

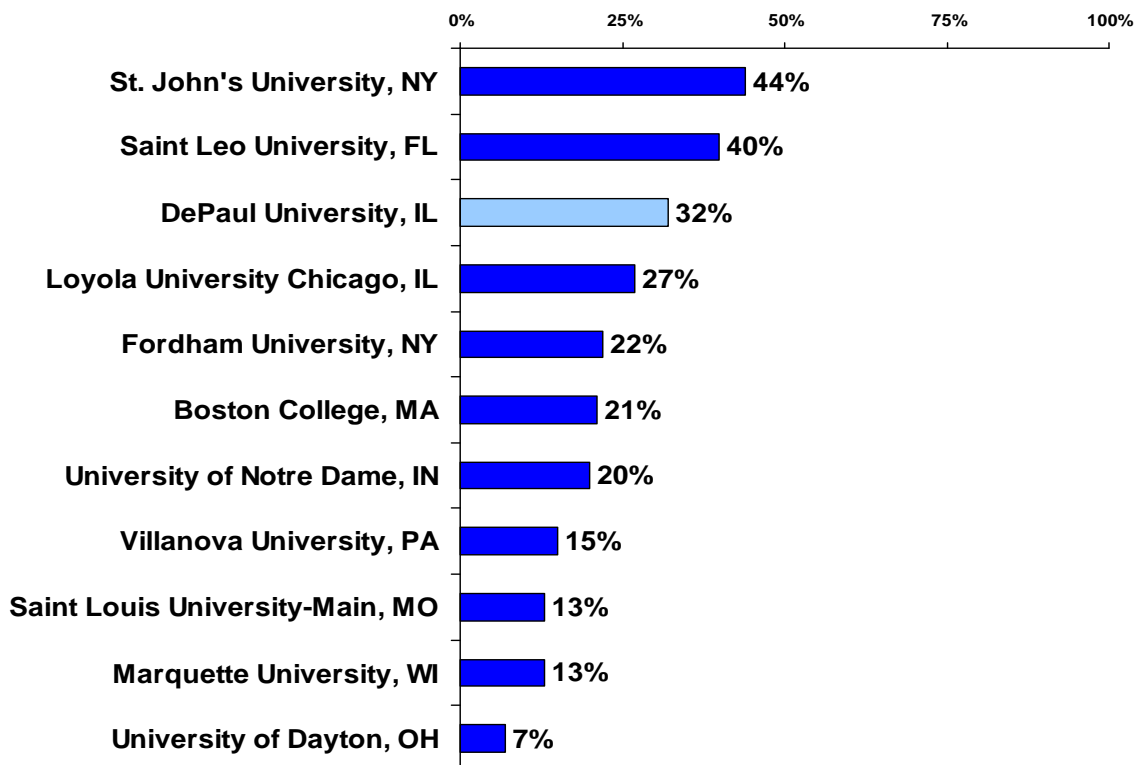
In 2005, 32% of the undergraduates at DePaul University were Asian, African-American, Hispanic or Native American students.

DePaul had the third largest percentage of minority undergraduates compared to eleven of the Catholic four-year institutions with undergraduate enrollments of at least 7,000 students.

The institution with the largest percentage of minority students was St. John's University in New York, where 44% or almost half of the 15,092 undergraduates were minority students.

At Saint Leo University in Florida, 40% of the 12,039 undergraduates were minority students, the second largest percentage in 2005.
