



- Enrollment in computer and information sciences (*CIS*) programs accounts for a small but growing percent of Illinois Master's level enrollment, up from 3% to 7% since 1993.
- Throughout the 1990's, DePaul has dominated this market, enrolling the largest share of these students since 1993 (up from 32% to 40% in 2000). This includes all DePaul CIS programs in CTI and KGSB.
- Although DePaul has a smaller proportion of the degrees

awarded in Illinois, DePaul is also the leader in the share of degrees (22% in 2000).

- There are few strong competitors in the CIS market. IIT, the second leading institution, has only 11% of the enrollment market and 15% of the degrees awarded.
- From 1998—2000, DePaul's largest growing CIS programs were E-Commerce, Management Information Systems, Human Computer Interaction.
