DePaul's Rankings in U.S. News & World Report

U.S. News & World Report published the new "America's Best Colleges 2009" magazine in August 2008, kicking off the new school year and another round of more than a dozen college ratings and rankings publications.

Probably the most well-known college rankings publication is "America's Best Colleges," which has ranked institutions on several variables related to perception of reputation, entering freshman profile, faculty resources, financial indicators and degree attainment since the 1980s.

Seven subscores make up the total ranking, ranging in weight from *Peer Assessment*, which accounts for 25% of the overall score, to *Graduate Rate Performance* and *Alumni Giving*, each accounting for 5% of the overall score. Each subscore may include more than one individual variable. In total, about 250 schools are ranked annually.

DePaul's ranks on three of the individual subscores— Peer Assessment, Student Selectivity, and Graduation Rate Performance—are higher in the 2009 edition of the publication than they were in 2003. Together, these subscores account for 45% of the overall score, at 25%, 15% and 5% respectively. The largest gain was on Graduation Rate Performance, as the percentage of Pell grant recipients were added to the calculation in 2008.

The ranks on the remaining four subscores of *Faculty Resources*, *Retention*, *Financial Resource*, and *Alumni Giving*, which account for 50% of the score, were lower in in the 2009 edition than they were in 2003.

DePaul's highest rank for any individual subscore was on *Graduation Rate Performance*, at 42, followed by *Peer Assessment* at 110. DePaul's lowest rank was for *Alumni Giving*, at 214.
