Degrees Awarded to Hispanic Students in Illinois Increased 74% from 1998 to 2007


In 2007, 6,186 degrees were awarded to Hispanic students by four-year institutions in Illinois. This constituted a 74% increase in degrees awarded from 1998, and was almost three times greater than the 26% statewide increase in degrees awarded to all students by four-year institutions.

The greatest percentage increase was in master's degrees awarded to Hispanic students, up 124% from 1998 to 2007, and more than three times the 36% statewide increase in master's degrees awarded to all students.

The 66% increase in bachelor's degrees awarded to Hispanic students was nearly three times the 23% statewide increase.

In 2007, 43% of all master's degrees awarded to Hispanic students in Illinois were in Education programs. (Of all 2007 master's degrees in Illinois, 29% were in Education.)

Business programs awarded 22% of bachelor's degrees to Hispanic students in 2007, more than the statewide percentage of 20%.
