## Proportion of Minority Undergraduates at National Catholic Four-Year Institutions

The following illustrates Catholic four-year institutions throughout the nation whose undergraduate enrollment in 2005 included at least 10% of Hispanic, African-American or Asian students. Only one institution, St. John's University, had 10% or more Hispanic, African-American and Asian undergraduates. DePaul had the third largest total number of minority students in 2005, with 4,717 students compared to 6,640 at St. John's University and 4,856 at Saint Leo University.

In 2005, 13% of DePaul's undergraduates were Hispanic, a percentage similar to the University of San Diego and Santa Clara University, both in California. Of the 12 institutions with at least 10% Hispanic undergraduates, DePaul was the second only to St. John's University in New York in the number of undergraduates enrolled; only four institutions in total had undergraduate enrollment of 7,000 or more.

A total of 10% of DePaul's undergraduates were African American. Two other Illinois institutions were listed among the schools with 10% or more African-American undergraduates: Saint Xavier with 18% and Lewis University with 12%. Only three of these institutions, DePaul, St. John's and St. Leo, had undergraduate enrollments of 7,000 or more.

In addition, 9% of DePaul's undergraduates were Asian students. DePaul was tied with Georgetown as the institution with the seventh highest percentage of Asian undergraduates at 9%. Loyola Chicago, at 11%, was the only Illinois institution with 10% or more Asian undergraduates, and the only other large institution on the list was St. John's University in New York.
