
DePaul Remains the Largest Catholic University in 2018

DePaul remains the largest Catholic institution in the nation, with 22,437 enrolled students in fall 2018. St. John's University is the second largest, with 21,643 students. Together the ten largest Catholic institutions enrolled 158,816 students in 2018, up 2 percent from 2014. DePaul enrollment accounted for 14 percent of the total enrollment.

Enrollment at the ten largest Catholic universities is predominantly undergraduate. The proportion of undergraduate enrollment ranged from 78

percent of enrollment at St. John's to 58 percent at Fordham.

Georgetown is the exception. Only 39 percent of all students are undergraduates based on the most recent 2017 figures.* The percentage of undergraduates has declined from 43 percent in 2014, reflecting growth in graduate enrollment and relatively steady undergraduate enrollment.
