Visitors Are a Small Proportion of Undergraduate Summer Enrollment

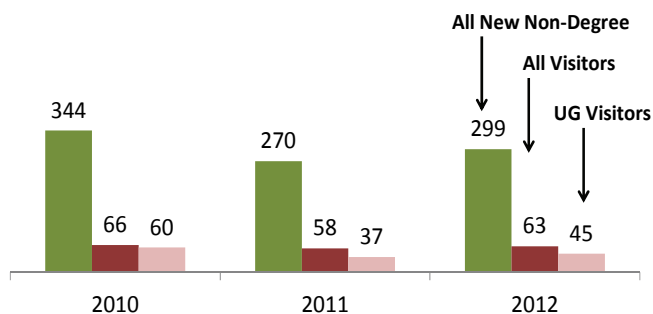
Last summer, DePaul enrolled 8,311 students and generated 48,829 credit hours from summer courses. Almost all of this enrollment (92 percent) was continuing DePaul students along with 671 new students, 299 of whom were new non-degree students. According to the National Student Clearinghouse, only 63 students were visitors taking classes at DePaul to transfer to their home institution.

Forty-five (71 percent) of these visiting students were undergraduates, almost all of whom came from a four-year institution (44 of the 45

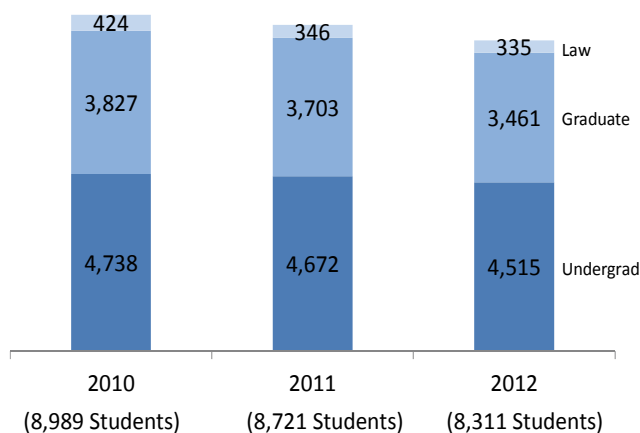
students). Thirty-three of these undergraduates from four-year institutions (75 percent) were from 28 different out-of-state institutions and 11 (25 percent) were from seven different Illinois institutions.

In total over the past three years, 142 undergraduate visitors have come from 74 institutions nationwide. Across the years, nine institutions account for 38 percent of enrollment.
