DePaul's Growing Student Veteran Enrollment

The proportion of veterans nationally who have earned a bachelor's degree has increased, according to a 2011 study by the National Center for Veterans Analysis and Statistics. Consistent with this trend, DePaul's enrollment of student veterans has grown dramatically over the past 5 years.

Compared to the overall DePaul student population in 2012, student veterans on average were older and represented a more diverse racial/ethnic profile. Undergraduate veterans were about seven years older and 35 percent were African-American or Hispanic/Latino compared to 25 percent of all undergraduates. Graduate veterans were about five years older and a higher percentage were African-

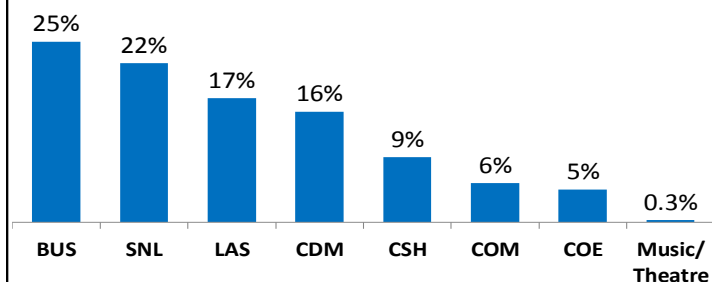
American or Hispanic/Latino than the graduate population (33 percent compared to 18 percent). BUS and SNL together enrolled 48 percent of the undergraduate veterans, while CDM enrolled 46 percent of the graduate veterans.

Nearly all (92 percent) of undergraduate veterans in 2012 entered DePaul as transfer students. Sixty-four percent transferred from two-year colleges, the largest number from Harold Washington College, College of DuPage, the American Council on Education's Registry and Transcript System (which evaluates military experience for equivalent college credit), Oakton Community College and Harper College.
