Three Minnesota High Schools are DePaul's Top Out-of-State Feeders

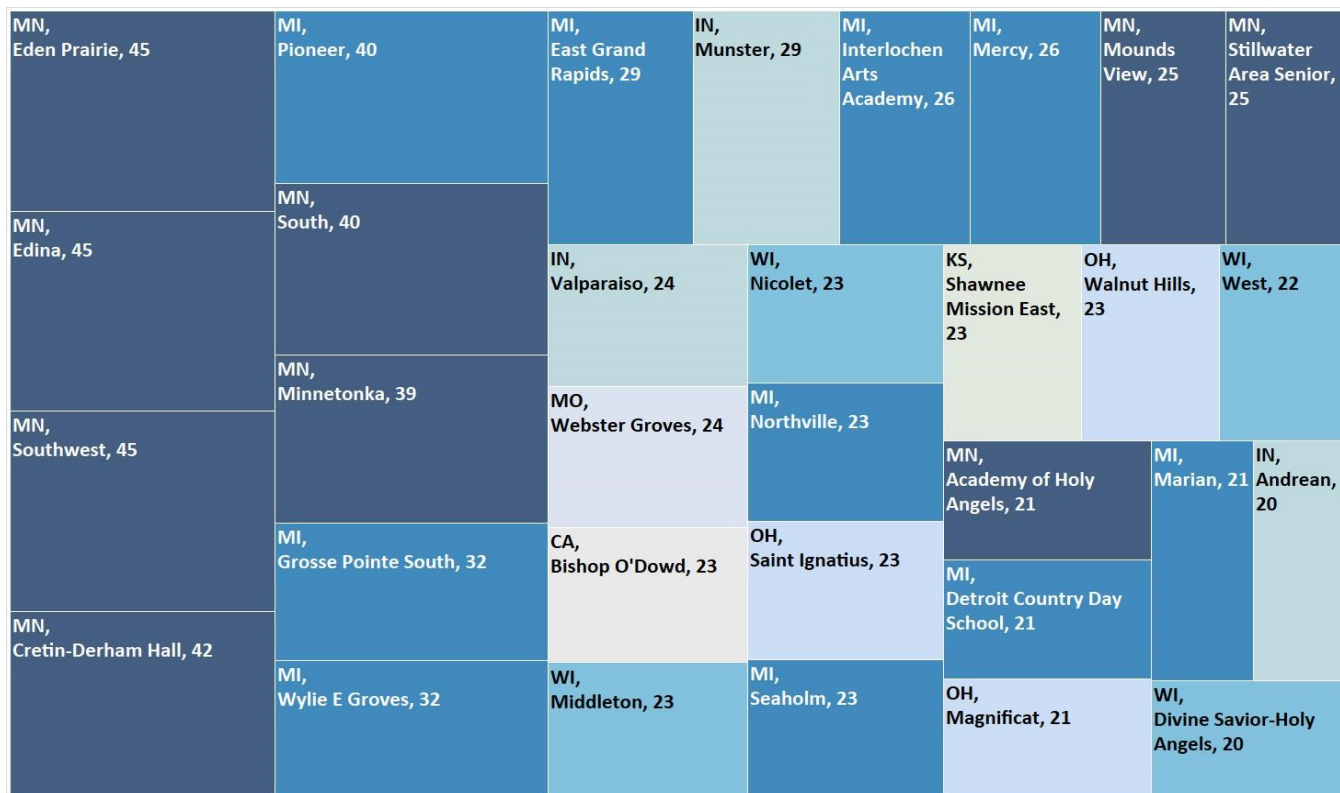
DePaul enrolled almost 25,000 freshmen from over 10,000 high schools nationally and internationally from 2005 to 2014. Over 90 percent of these schools are out of state, yet they only account for about one-third of the freshman enrollment. The top 32 out-of-state feeder high schools (from eight different states) each sent at least 20 freshmen. Together, these 32 schools accounted for 898 freshmen, or 10 percent of out-of-state enrollment.

Nine of the top out-of-state feeder schools are in Minnesota, including the top three: Eden Prairie, Edina and Southwest high schools. The nine Minnesota schools

have sent 327 freshmen since 2005. Ten of the top feeders were Michigan schools, together accounting for 273 freshmen. Wisconsin, Indiana, Ohio Missouri, California and Kansas are the other states of the 32 top out-of-state feeder high schools.

These schools are part of a larger cluster of 511 schools responsible for the majority of freshman enrollment. Together, these 511 schools generated 65.5 percent of all applications and 72.9 percent of all enrollments since 2005.

Understanding the Graph: Each of the 32 schools is represented by a box above. Boxes are labeled with the state, school name and number of freshmen since 2005 (which determines the size of the box). Boxes are arranged by number of freshmen, from the most (top left) to the fewest (bottom right). Colors represent states, from the darkest color (for Minnesota with the most freshmen) to the lightest color (Kansas and California, with the fewest freshmen). In total, the entire area represents 898 freshmen since 2005.
