This year, DePaul celebrates its 125th anniversary with 20,917 total students enrolling this fall. Undergraduate enrollment accounts for 68% of total enrollment, compared with 65% in 2018. Graduate enrollment accounts for 32% of university enrollment, and law enrollment accounts for 4% of university enrollment.



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Undergraduate Enrollment

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DePaul enrolled 14,134 undergraduates this fall, compared with 14,284 in 2021. Undergraduate enrollment decreased 160 students overall from last fall, but increased in BUS, CDM and MUS.

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Freshman Enrollment

DePaul has seen six consecutive years of growth in the freshman class, and welcomed 2,968 new freshmen this fall. As the largest freshman class in DePaul's history, enrollment increased in CDM, BUS, CSH, LAS, and CMN with an overall increase of 130 students over last fall. CDM enrolled the largest proportion of freshmen at 28%.



This fall our new freshman class has 35% first-generation students, 31% underrepresented students of color, 31% Pell-eligible, and 21% from the city of Chicago.

Transfer Enrollment

DePaul welcomed 1,044 new transfer students this fall compared with 1,155 in 2021, a decrease of 10% (or 111 students). BUS remains the largest transfer college, enrolling 30% of all new transfer students.

Transfer Enrollment by Term (for fiscal year 2021-22)





Fall 2022 Enrolled Transfers

One of goal of DePaul's mission is to serve the needs of students traditionally unrepresented in higher education. To that end, we pay close attention to students who meet certain criteria that support our mission. This year, our new transfer student cohort has 39% of students who are Pell-eligible, 37% first-generation, 37% underrepresented students of color, and 22% from the city of Chicago.















Transfer Applicants, Admission and Enrollment Yield







Transfer Admission and Yield Rates





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Freshman Retention and Graduation Rates

In fall 2022, 84% of the fall 2021 full-time freshman cohort returned for their sophomore year, compared with 84% of the prior year's freshman class. DePaul's first-year retention rate conintues to exceed the national average for private universities. This year, the four-year graduation rate for the 2018 freshman class declined slightly to 55% from prior years.


Freshman Retention and Graduation Rates by Freshman Cohort Year

Freshman Cohort Quarterly Attrition*





Transfer Retention and Graduation Rates


The first-year transfer retention rate captures the percentage of new transfer students from all terms of the prior year who return for the fall term. Because the methods for calculating freshman and transfer retention rates are different, the rates should not be directly compared. The transfer retention and graduation rates have been relatively stable over recent years.

Graduate Enrollment

In fall 2022, 6,180 graduate students enrolled (excluding Law), compared with 6,704 in 2021. Graduate enrollment in CSH and Theatre increased in 2022. The majority of graduate students are master's degree students—89%—followed by 9% doctoral students, and 2% of students who are in certificate programs or non-degree-seeking.




