University Colleagues,

On behalf of the Division of Enrollment Management, I am pleased to present DePaul's 2019 enrollment summary. This annual report describes the current enrollment profile and how it has changed over recent years.

Overall, the university enrolled 22,064 students this fall who registered for 277,173 credit hours. While these outcomes produced the highest gross tuition revenue in university history, they are slightly lower than our budgeted projections.

The mixed results reflect the effect of intensifying competition and increasingly unfavorable demographics throughout Illinois and the Midwest, particularly in the transfer student market. But strategic decisions and operational investments in a broad array of programs and populations over the years have helped to mitigate the impact of underperformance in some segments.

Freshman enrollment is the highlight of our 2019 enrollment portfolio. We enrolled a university record 2,627 freshmen, topping our previous record by 34 students. The cohort is one of the most diverse in DePaul's history with students of color comprising 44% of the class, first-generation students 33%, and out-of-state students 38%.

New graduate enrollment is strong as well. The 1,898 new graduate students are 5% over the budgeted goal and represent an increase of 78 students over last year. The College of Computing and Digital Media was the largest contributor, surpassing its enrollment target by over 30%.

However, strong new student outcomes were not enough to offset an overall decrease in continuing undergraduates. Successive years of declining transfer students contribute to the deficit, as well as the cumulative impact of the discontinuation of the individualized degree program in SCPS (formerly the School for New Learning, or SNL).

While DePaul is not alone in facing the demographic and competitive headwinds of today's higher education landscape, we have a uniquely talented and dedicated faculty and staff to navigate these challenges. This gives me great confidence that we can and will achieve the outcomes that ensure our future success.



Undergraduate Enrollment

DePaul enrolled 14,214 undergraduates this fall, compared with 14,507 in 2018. Since peaking in 2012, undergraduate enrollment has declined 14% from 16,498 students, driven disproportionally by a decline in part-time enrollment. While full-time enrollment has declined 6% since 2012, part-time enrollment has declined 50%.

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Freshman Enrollment

DePaul welcomed a class of 2,627 new freshmen in fall 2019, the largest freshman class in DePaul's history, an increase of 52 students compared with 2018. Enrollment increased in CMN, CDM, CSH and Theatre, with CDM and Theatre growing by more than 15% over 2018. CDM enrolled the largest proportion of freshmen at 26%.












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Retention and Graduation Rates

Returning in fall 2019 for their sophomore year are 85% of the fall 2018 full-time freshmen, compared with 86% of the prior year's freshman class.

The four-year graduation rate continues to exceed the national average for private four-year universities. This year, the four-year graduation rate for the 2015 freshman class was 58%, consistent with the last five years and six percentage points above the national average.

Graduate Enrollment

In fall 2019, a total of 7,103 graduate students enrolled (excluding Law), compared with 7,136 students in 2018. Graduate enrollment in CDM and Music increased in 2019. A total of 88% of all graduate students are master's degree students, 8% are doctoral students, and 3% are in certificate programs or non-degree seeking.

Law Enrollment

A total of 747 students enrolled in Law this fall, a 6% decline from 2018. Most law students are enrolled in the JD day program—73%—and 15% in the evening program, 10% in the Master of Jurisprudence (MJ) program and 1% in the LLM program.
