 AUTUMN 1986 - AUTUMN 1990

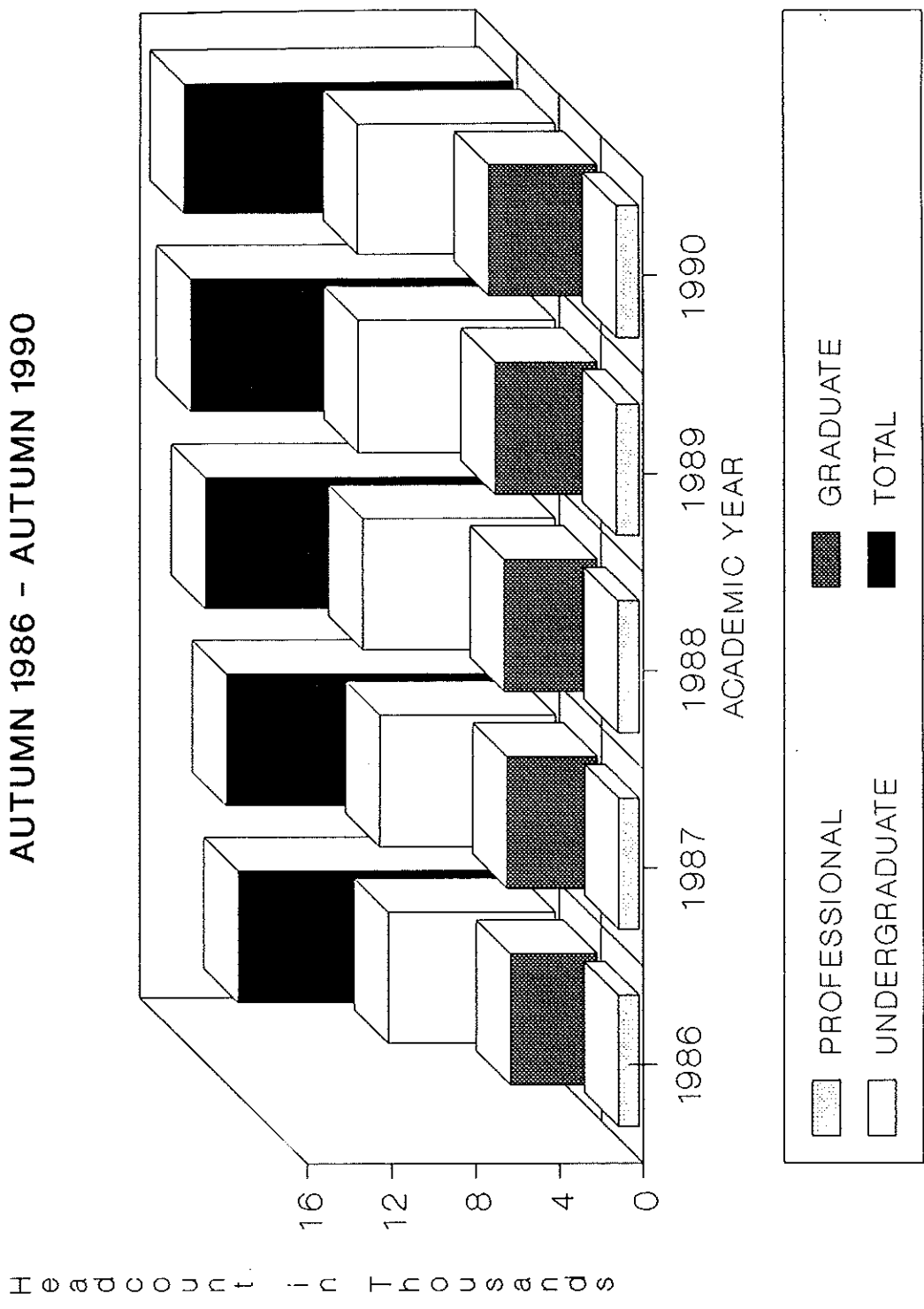

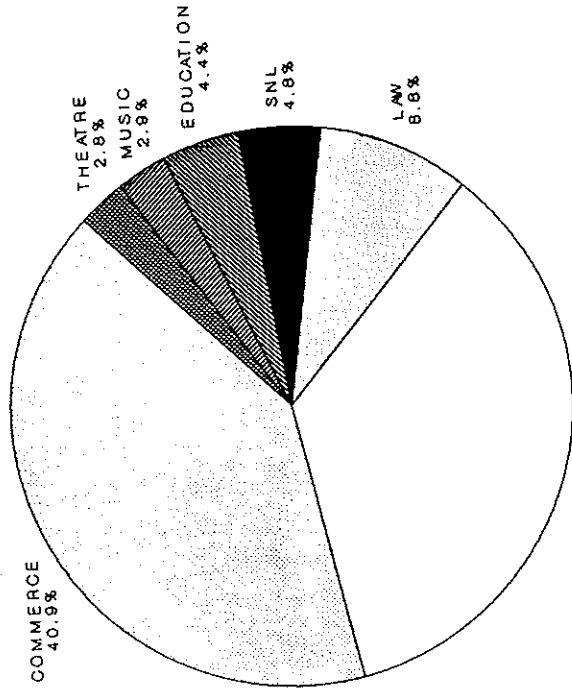

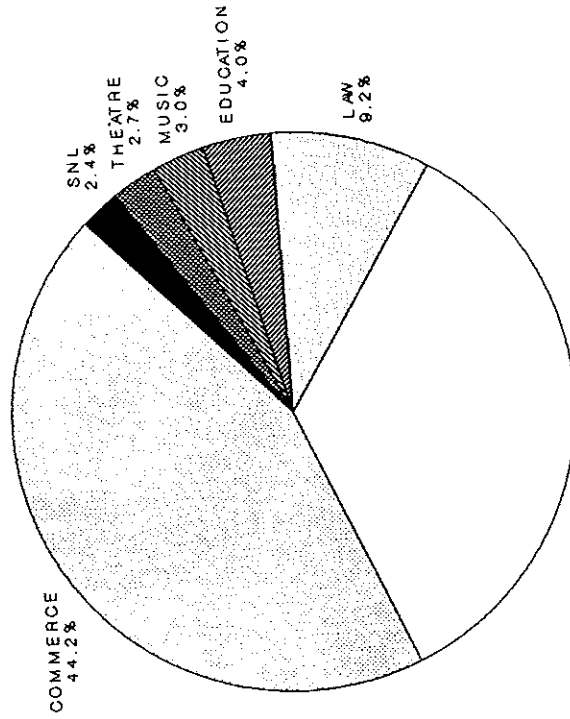

AUTUMN 1990

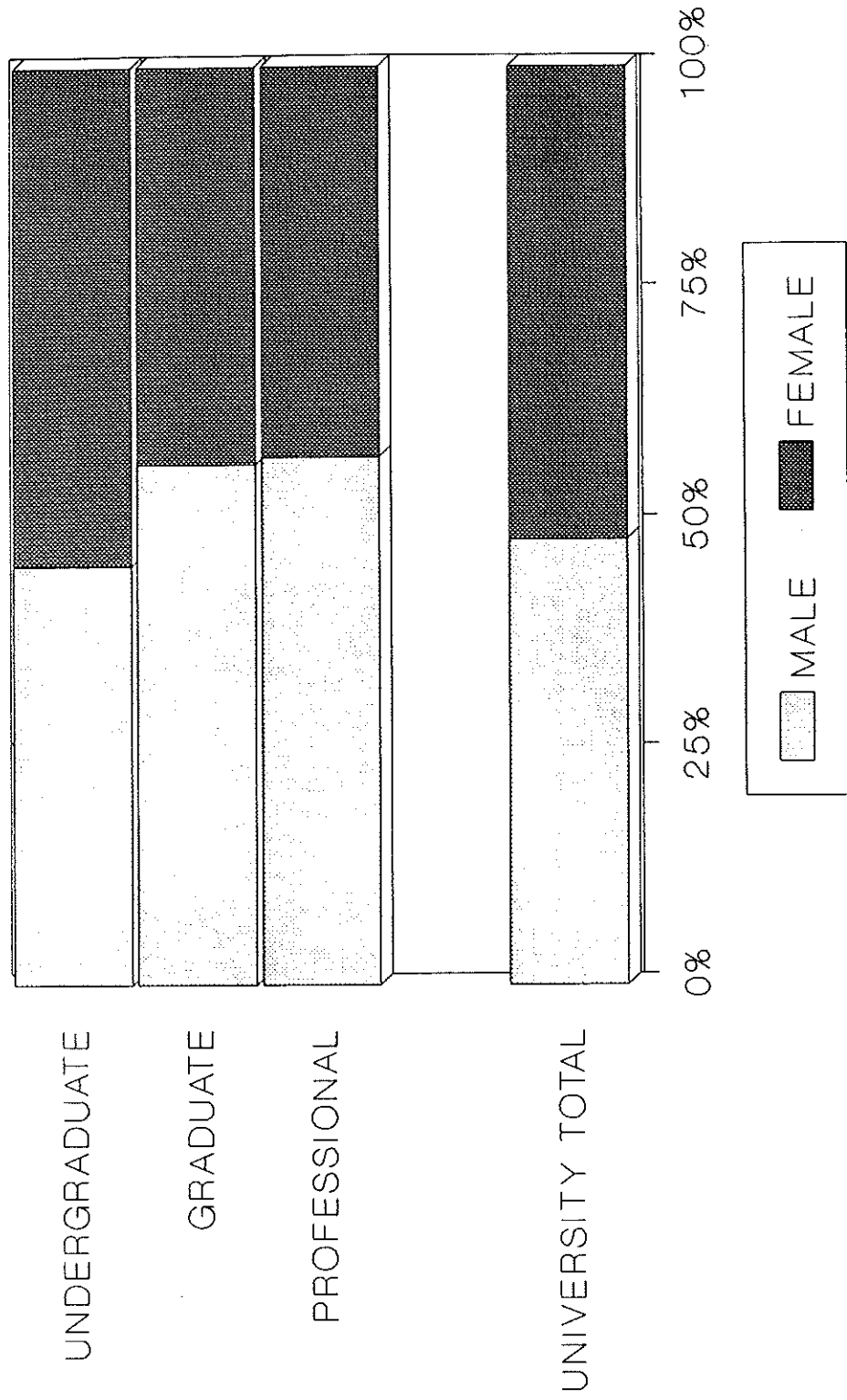

 AUTUMN 1990

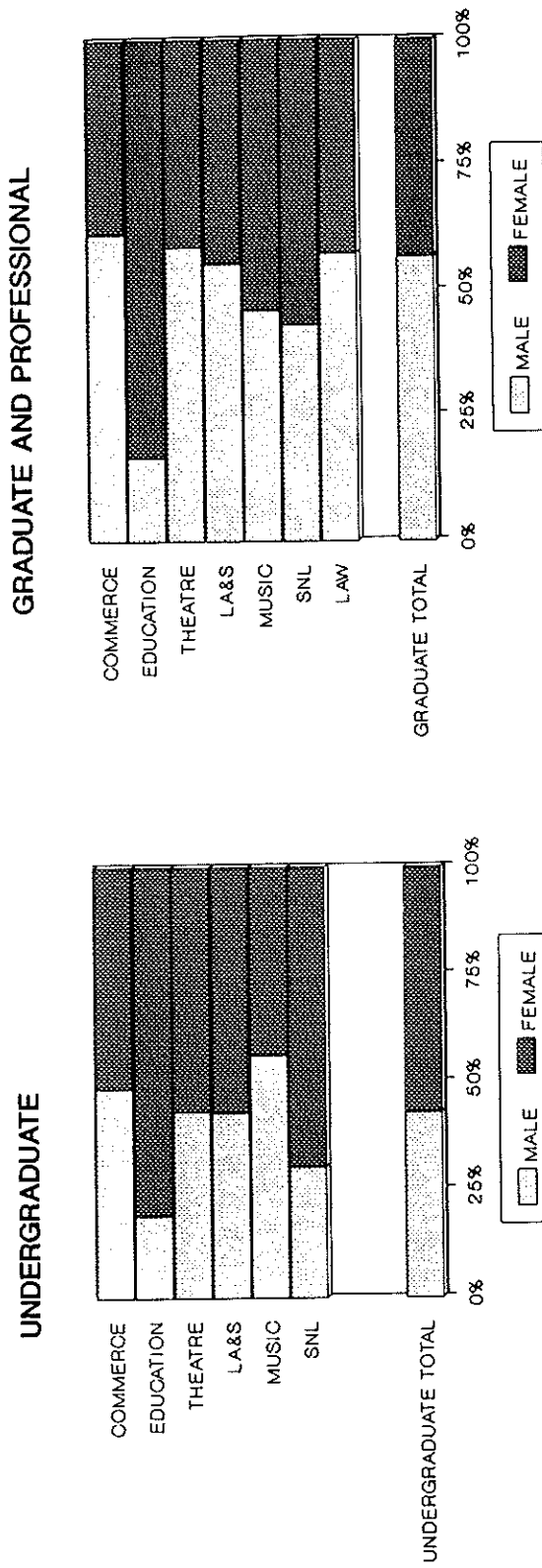

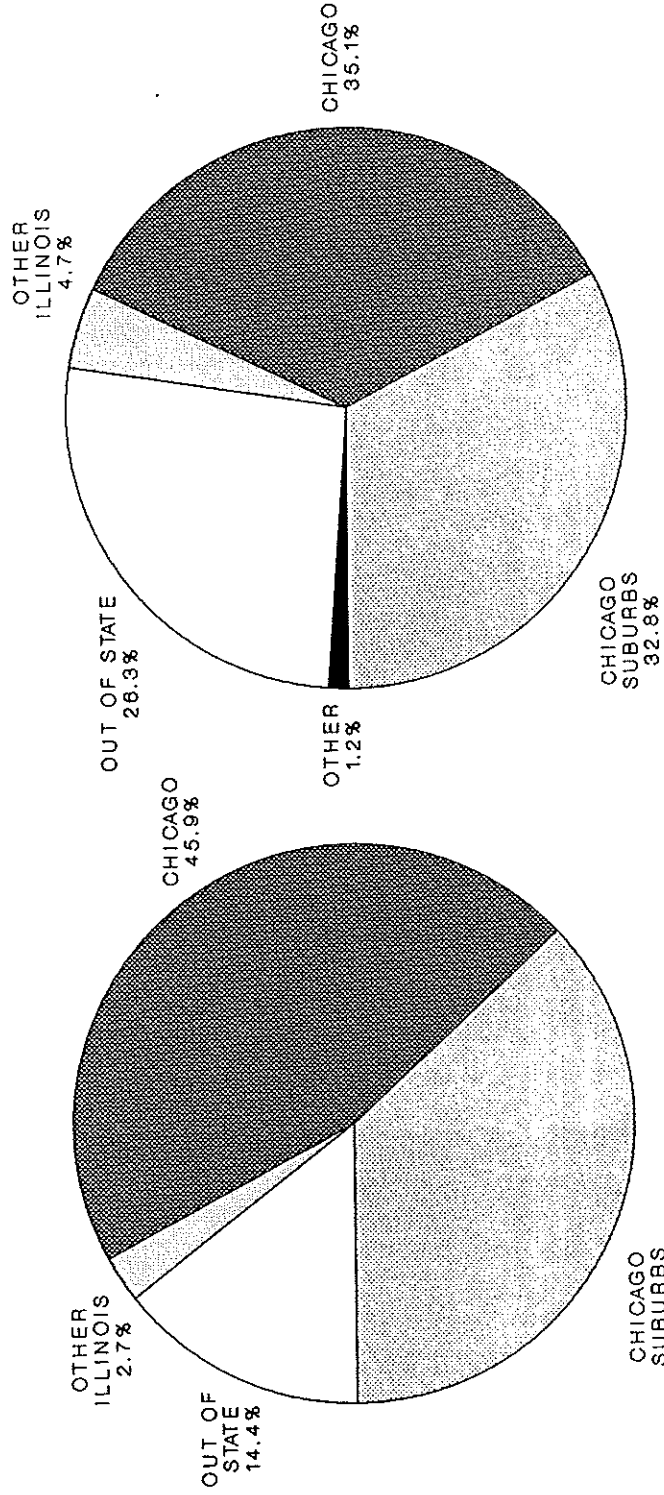

 AUTUMN 1990

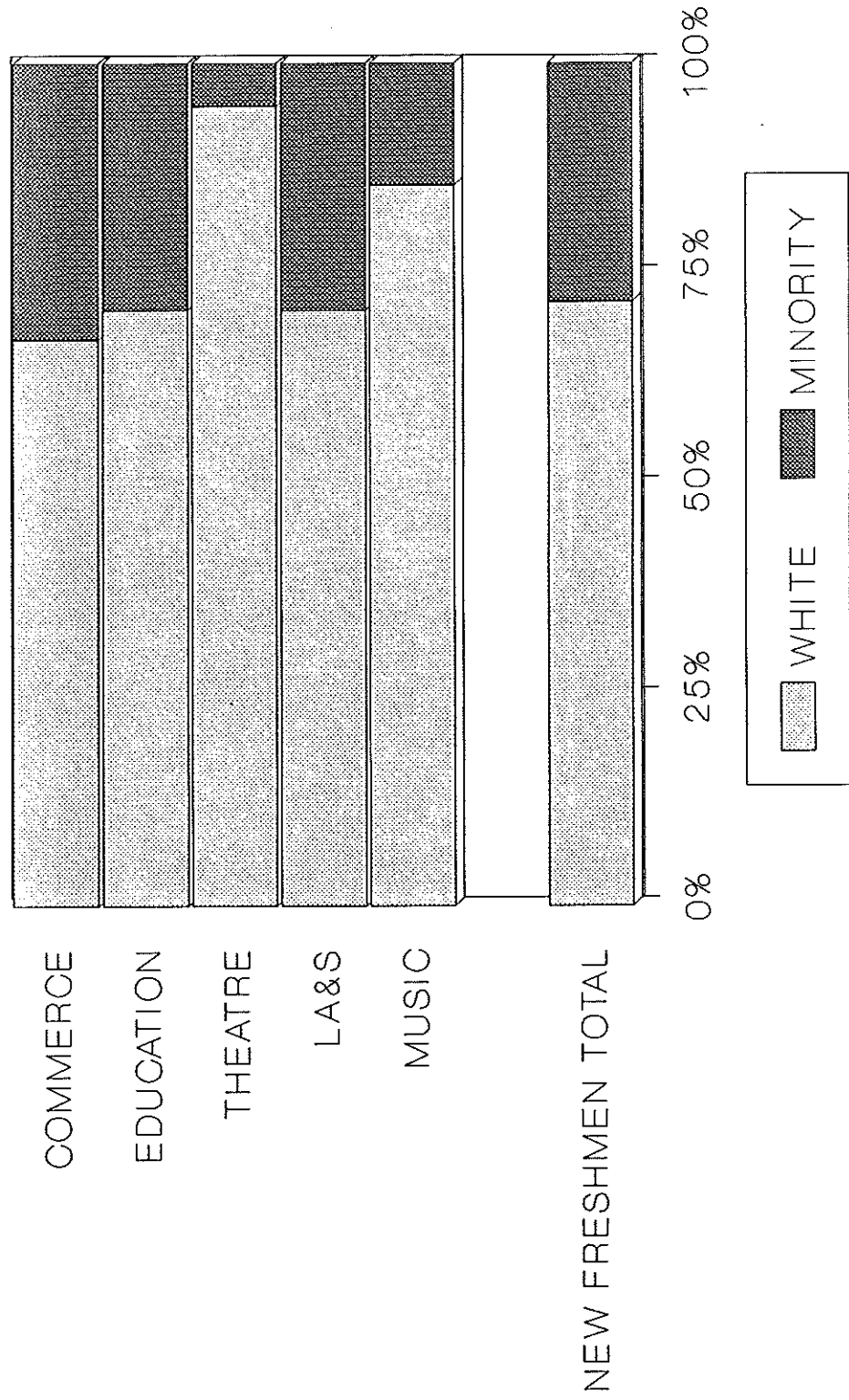

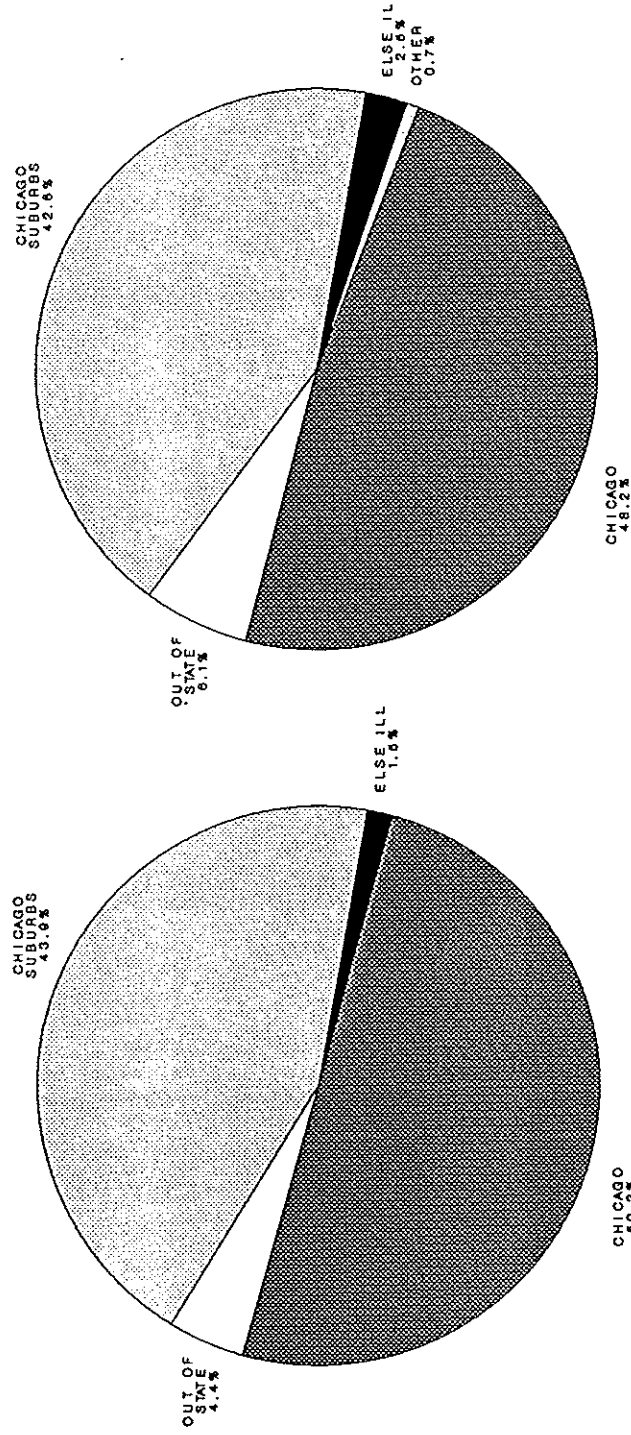

FULL-TIME FACULTY BY RANK AND SEX AUTUMN 1990

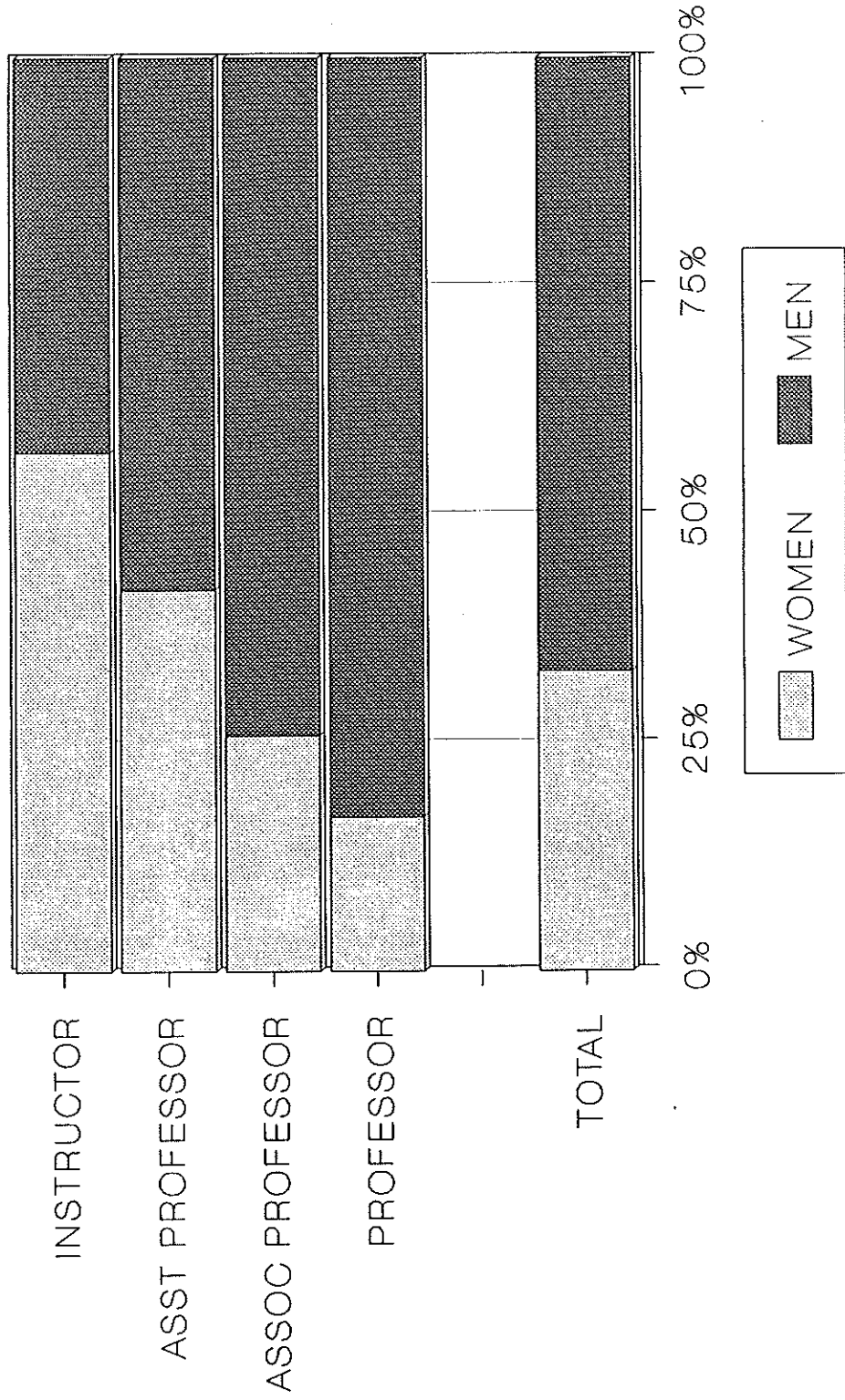

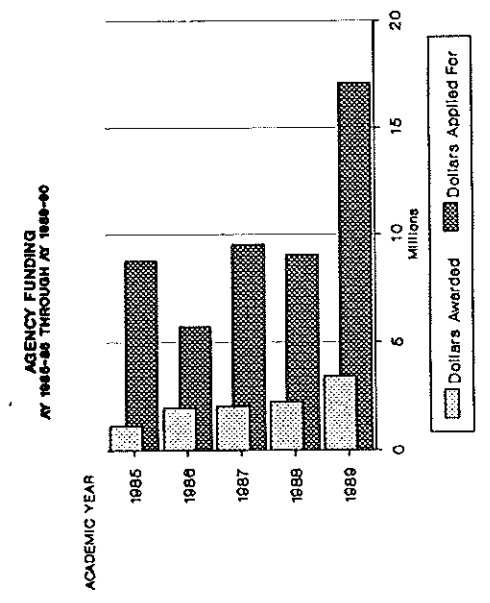
